THE RAILWAYS AND THE EXPLANADE.

The harbor of Toronto is the chief natural outlet of Ontario, and furnishes the principal means whereby the traffic of that province can avail itself of the great system of lake, river and canal navigation which connects it with the sea.

At a very considerable expense, the citizens of Toronto converted the water lots along their front into a public wharf, and formed their present Explanade.

It appears now that certain railway companies claim to possess a very large portion of this Explanade, although it cannot be found that they have ever paid for the city anything approaching its value.

Certain railway companies, on being asked to vacate the ground they do own, and to make provision for the unobstructed use by the citizens, of the streets to the water, which those citizens constructed and paid for, speak of their vested rights, and insist that by virtue of certain alleged agreements with city officials and others, they possess the right of obstructing the traffic between the city and the harbor.

It should, I think, be remembered that these roads can have bought this right, for no person possessed the power to sell it. Certainly, no parliament, either of the province or of the dominion, had any right, power or privilege of closing the water front of Ontario. Nor could they give that right of closure to any corporation.

Western Canada has but two routes to the sea, by rail and by water. If those controlling either of these routes be allowed to shut off or to greatly obstruct the other, they are permitted to force a monopoly upon their own benefit at the expense of the country.

In considering the causes which have brought about this remarkable state of affairs, it might be well to think whether the city would not have been better off without any railway representing her at the railway board. Judging by the extent of representation, the city on the railway board, some of them had not represented the railways in the city council.

The late deepening of the Welland canal renders completely necessary the corresponding deepening of the canal between Lake Ontario and Montreal, a work which will shortly, in all probability, be completed.
