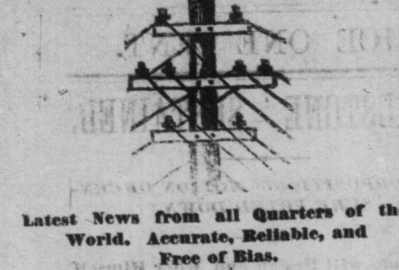

The cost of civil government is expected to rise from \$174,921 to \$178,897; of legislation from \$102,360 to \$110,850; of the administration of justice from \$293,001 to \$299,000; of education from \$512,833 to \$518,496; of public institutions from \$573,711 to \$594,754; of agriculture and arts from \$147,103 to \$150,290; of hospitals and charities from \$31,500 to \$32,869; of maintenance and repairs of government buildings from \$34,940 to \$38,000.
