Clark Wallace's amendments bill referred to the committee on Commerce and Banking. The C. P. R. Bill Passed. Wallace Explains the Manufacture.

Ottawa, April 8.—There is to be a long Canadian Pacific Railway debate in the House this session it will not be over the company's bill for the construction of the line, which has been hanging fire so long, as the measure went through very quietly to-night without objection. Sir John Macdonald replied that a petition from Grand Trunk shareholders had been received, and that he would bring it under consideration tomorrow.

Mr. Macdonald answered that the Government's attention had not been called to the article in the "Engineer" pointing out structural defects in St. George Street, whereby the disintegrator might be accounted for, and whether any steps are being taken as to other railway bridges to which the same defect is structurally defective.
