

This firm has not been active as a trader in stocks, but its failure is none the less significant, for the cause of it is that they are overloaded with stocks and bonds for which there is no market. The banks are still discriminating rigidly against every sort of collateral which is not giltedged, and this is not exactly a cheering factor in the stock market. 


