BUCKSKIN SHOOTING

Report of the coroner's jury on the shooting of George Harvey.

Immediately on the arrival of the train from the east on last Monday a coroner's jury was summoned to hold an inquest on the body of the late George Harvey.

Witnesses were called in the order of the coroner's jury. The following named citizens were sworn in as jurors: T. S. Burns, Jas. Reilly, J. C. Vanwart, Jas Walker and G. C. King.

Mr. Reilly, coroner for the Crown and Mr. Fitzgerald, coroner for the North-West Territories, immediately proceeded to a corner of the barracks yard where the body was disinterred, viewed by the jury and identified by the witness Harvey.
