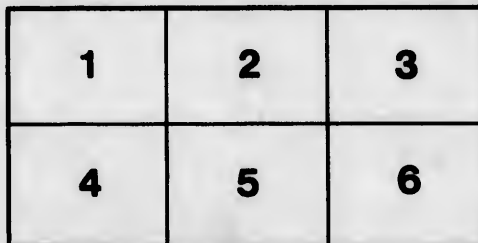
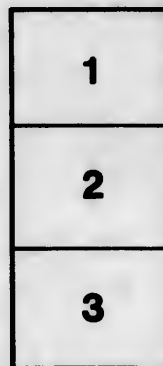
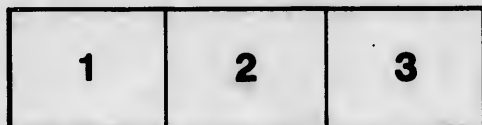

## Explanation of the Calender Pages.

**T**HE first column contains the Days of the Month; the second, the Days of the Week; the third, remarkable Days, &c. The fourth, the Sun's rising and setting. The fifth, the Moon's Place. The sixth, the Moon's Age. The seventh, Aspects, Weather, &c. The eighth, the Moon's rising and setting. The ninth, the Time of Full Sea, or High Water; for instance, suppose you look at the fifth Day of January, it will read thus; it is Sunday the fifth Day of the Month, and the 24 Sunday after Christmas, sun-rises 37 minutes after seven o'Clock, and Sets 37 minutes before five, the Moon is in Fifteen, or the Sign so called, is in the Fish; the Moon is 4 Days Old, sets 24 minutes after nine o'clock in the Evening, and is High Water Fifty Minutes past Eleven in the Evening.

THE Lines immediately preceding every Sunday throughout the Year, contains the Week of the Year, the Epistle and Gospel used in the Church Service, and the Days length: For instance read the line next before the 6th Day of January, thus, it's the 18 Week in the Year, the second Sunday after Christmas, the Epistle is Titus, Chapter 3d Verse, 4, 7. the Gospel St Matthew 21st Chapter, 13, 15. Verse; and the Days length 8 hours 48 minutes, and so of the rest. This Line refers always to the Day next following.

**T**HE Parsborough packet, sails regularly between Windsor and Parsborough twice in every week, and occasionally three times a week, always at Windsor every Tuesday, in the summer season (wind and weather permitting) so as to sail from thence for Parsborough, the first high water that happens at, or after, twelve o'clock on that day. The passage money for each person is five shillings: And the freight for horses or neat cattle is seven shillings and six pence per head. The vessel is forty two tons burthen, and hath good accommodation for passengers: And likewise for taking over horses, neat cattle and sheep, &c.

There must be paid at Halifax, with all letters for any of the following places, the different Rates of postage as under mentioned for single letters and so in proportion, and if put in at any post office in the County, there must be added the postage between that office and Halifax, without which they cannot be forwarded. Therefore all persons are to take particular notice thereof, to prevent the necessity of their letters being opened and returned for the postage.

The postage of letters from any of the British Colonies in North-America, or any part of his Majesty's dominions in Europe (except to Gibraltar and Port Mahon) may, or may not be paid at the time of putting them into any post-office, at the option of the writer; except the American inland postage to Halifax, which must be paid where the letters are put in, otherwise they must be opened and returned to the writer for that postage.

All merchants accounts, not exceeding one sheet of paper for all Bills of Exchange, Invoices, and Bills of Lading, to or from any parts or places, not within his Majesty's dominions; and the covers of letters to or from Turkey, and not exceeding one quarter of a sheet of paper are allowed to pass without payment of the Foreign postage, but are to pay the full inland post to and from London.

Letters from all parts of Europe, are dispatched from London every Tuesday and Friday, except those to Portugal which are forwarded by the Lisbon mails on Tuesdays only.

Letters to all parts of America, are dispatched from London the first Wednesday in every Month.

Letters for the East-Indies dispatched from London, as occasion offers.
