Police Magistrate of Gerich Declared That He Was Justified in Shooting Beattie.

Goderich, Nov. 5.—Police Magistrate Seeger and Horace Horton, J.P., gave their decision in the Cox murder case this afternoon. The unanimous decision of the bench was that Cox was justly charged to shoot Beattie, and on Cox being discharged there was considerable applause in court, which was instantly stopped by the authorities.

DRIFTED FOR MANY DAYS

Terrible Sufferings of the Crew of the Schooner Wilkey.

New York, Nov. 6.—The steamer Saratoga, which arrived at quarantine last night from Ansonia, had on board Capt. F. C. Buener and six of the crew of the Jennie P. Wilkey, which was dismissed in a hurricane on Oct. 6, 600 miles east of Ansonia, and subsequently drifted ashore on Walker's Key, Ansonia, where she became a total wreck. The men ate a bulk of the most extreme suffering for 25 days they drifted about on the deserted beach of the schooner, and had nothing to eat except a few fish which they caught, and some seaweed or unripe fruit. The men were all dead when the vessel was discovered by the U. S. cutter Fish Hawk.

Vancouver, B. C., Nov. 5.—(C. P. R. Press dispatch.)—British Columbia has made a new departure in dealing with public lands which calls for more than a passing notice.
