MISSING SAILOR

Business Complications Worried Him, The Coroner John Thinks Death Was Accidental.

Yesterday morning, at 11 o'clock, Charles Allen, 634 East Gerrard-street, and David Stewart, 720 St. George-street, saw the body floating in the Don, near the Winchester-street bridge. It was removed to the morgue by the police, and subsequently identified as that of John Joseph Long of Collingwood.

When the body was searched by the police in the morgue there was little found. A bunch of keys, a string of Roman Catholic beads, four car tickets and this telegram:

To John J. Long, care of Long Bros. Collingwood.

This is the only paper found on the deceased that led to his identification.

Police Visited Monday.

On Monday the detective department was informed that a prominent man was missing. His friends, who volunteered the information, refused to give the name of the missing man.

Mr. Long arrived in the city on Saturday and went to the residence of his brother Thomas, 513 Jarvis-street.

Had Been in Poor Health.

The deceased had been in poor health for the past two years. As his brother said, "he was a physical and mental wreck," supposed to have been caused by overwork and mind worry.

He took a trip to Europe for his health, accompanied by his niece, who returned about a month ago.

It is supposed that he left the house of his brother early Monday morning, and not knowing where he was going, he wandered down to the Don and fell into the river accidentally.

Funeral arrangements were made by the funeral home of Mr. Thomas Long, 1025 St. George-street.
