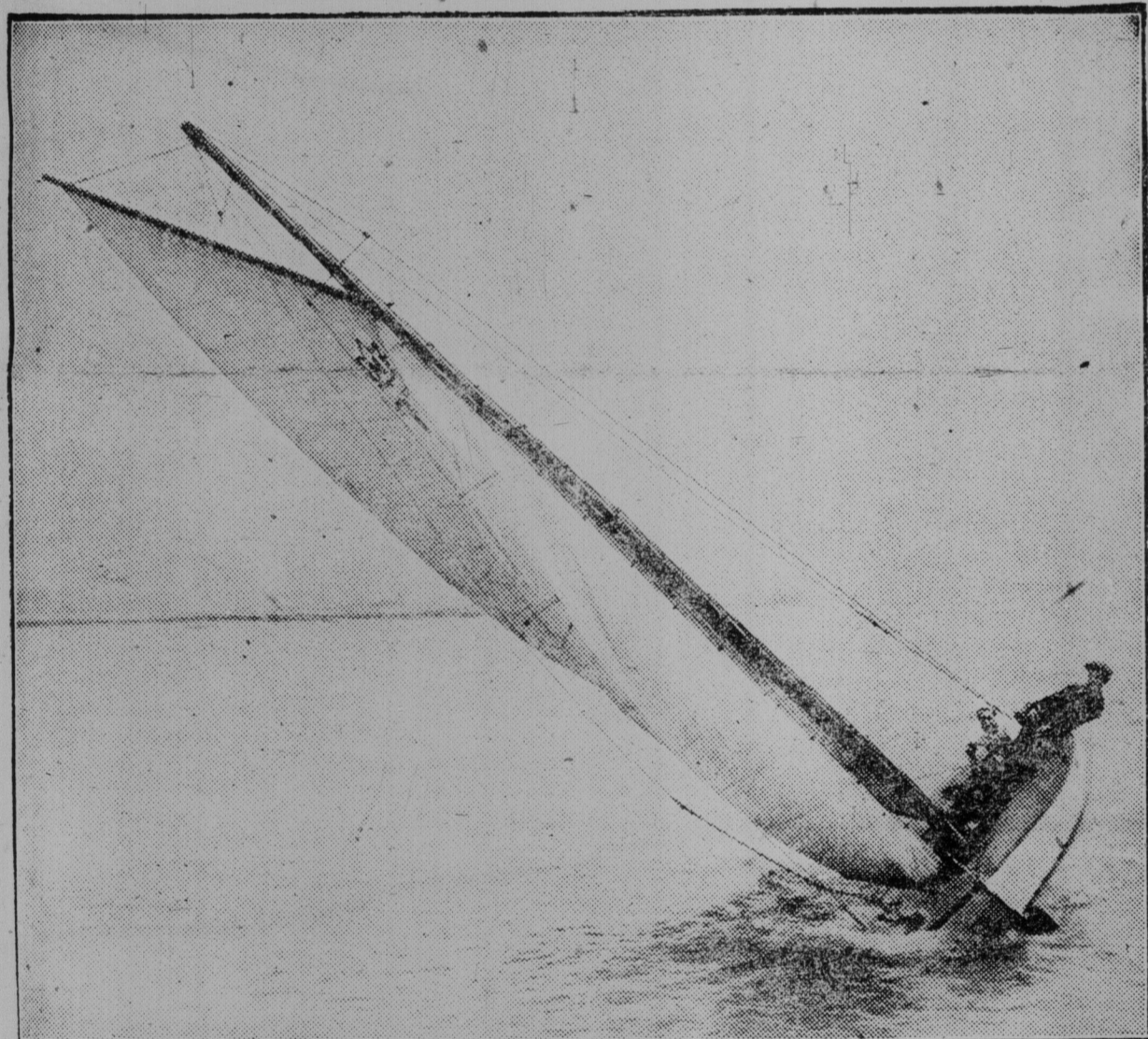

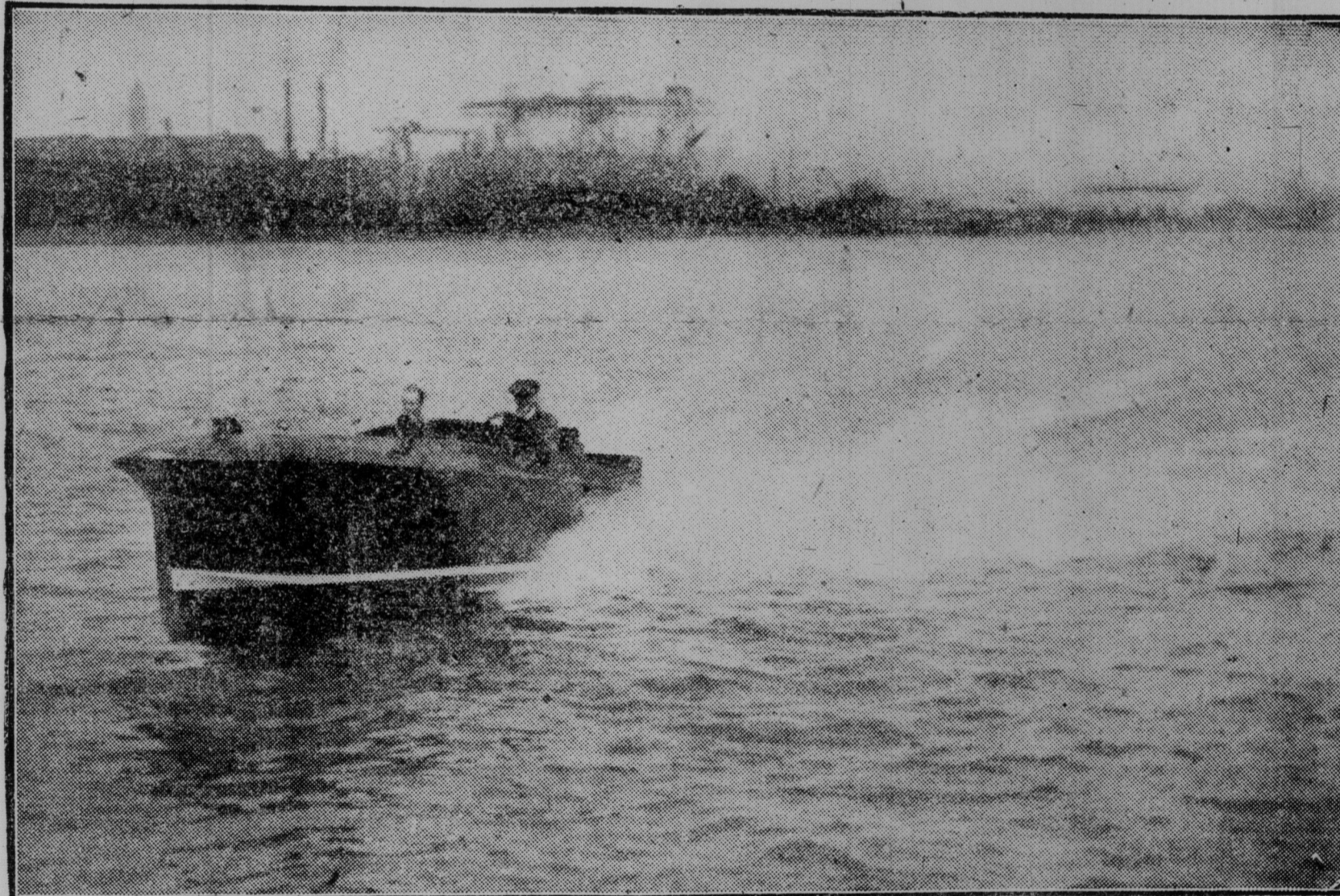

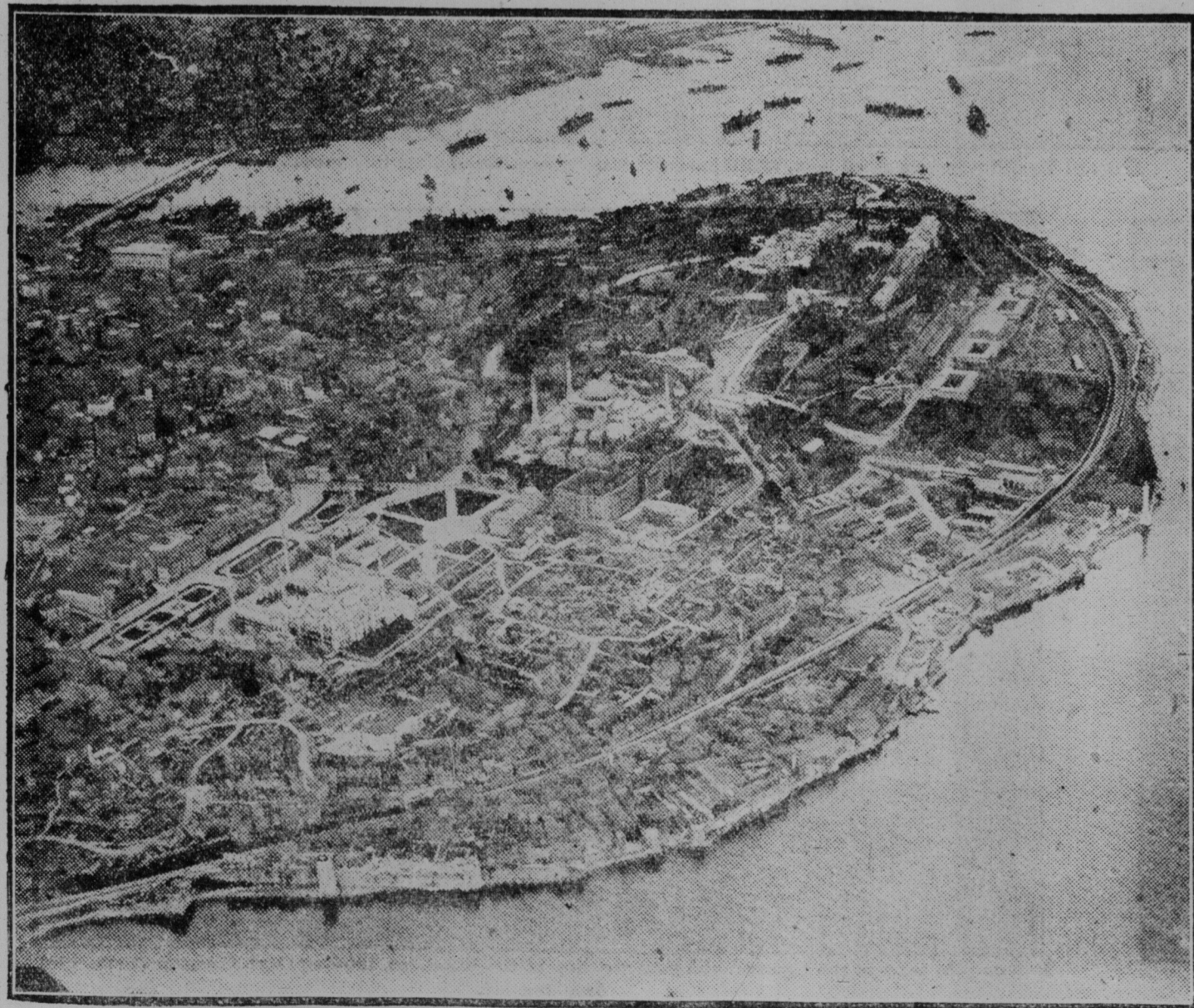

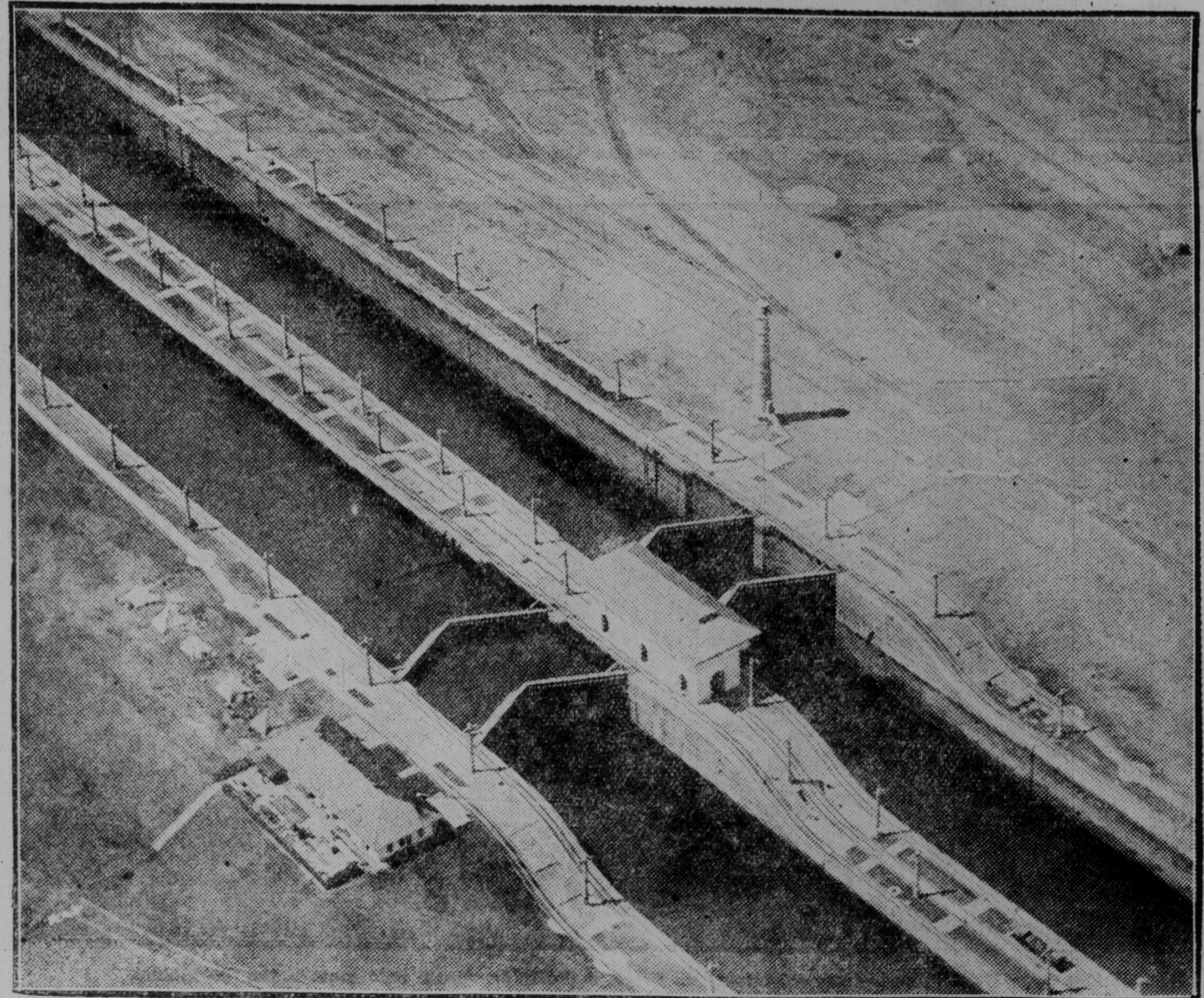

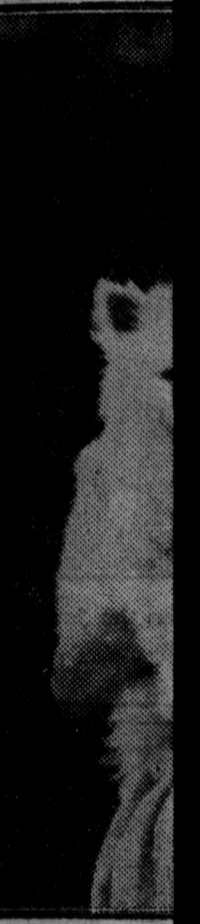
Aerial view of the industrial complex at Beaverton, Ontario, showing the layout of buildings and the presence of a railway line.

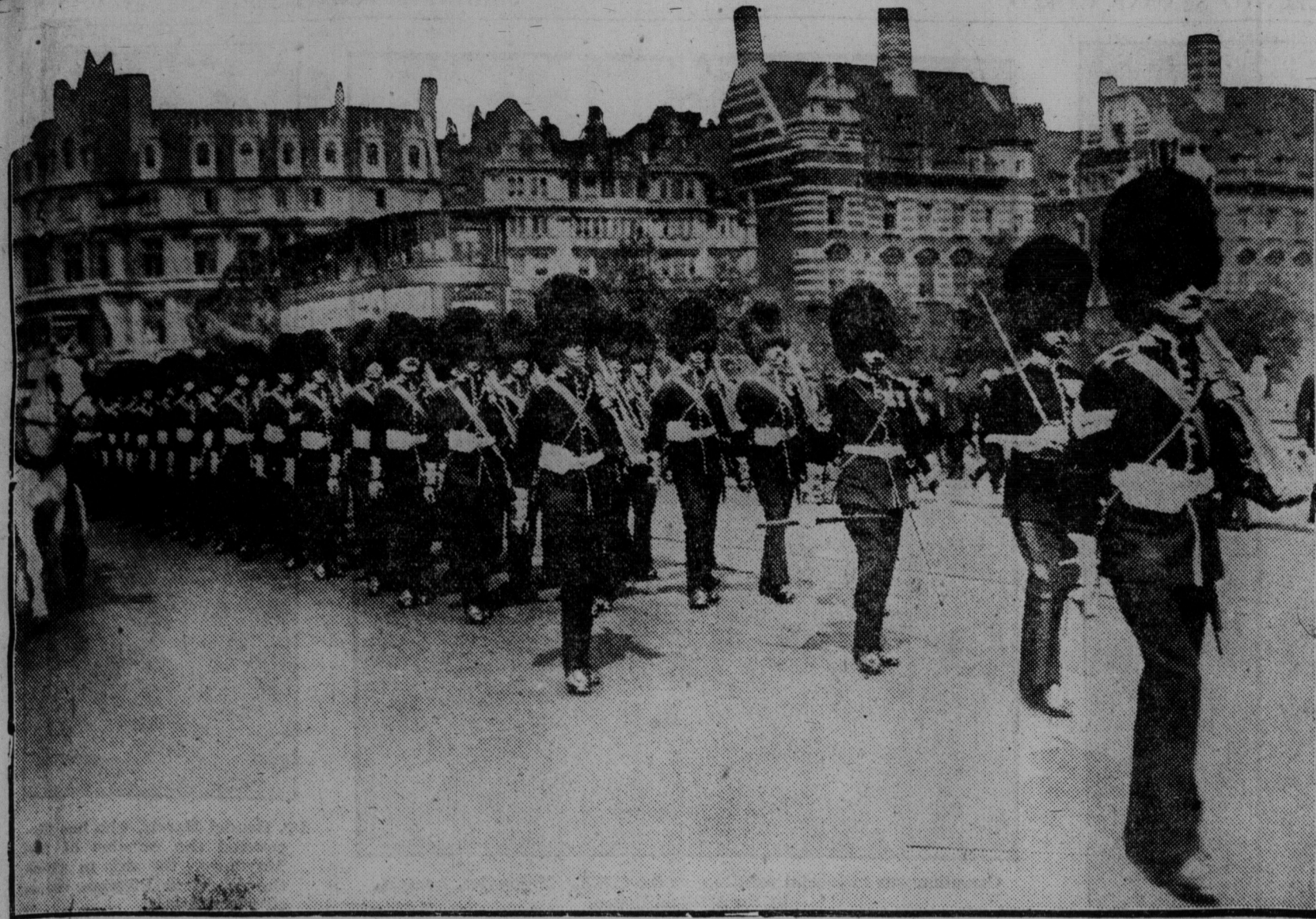

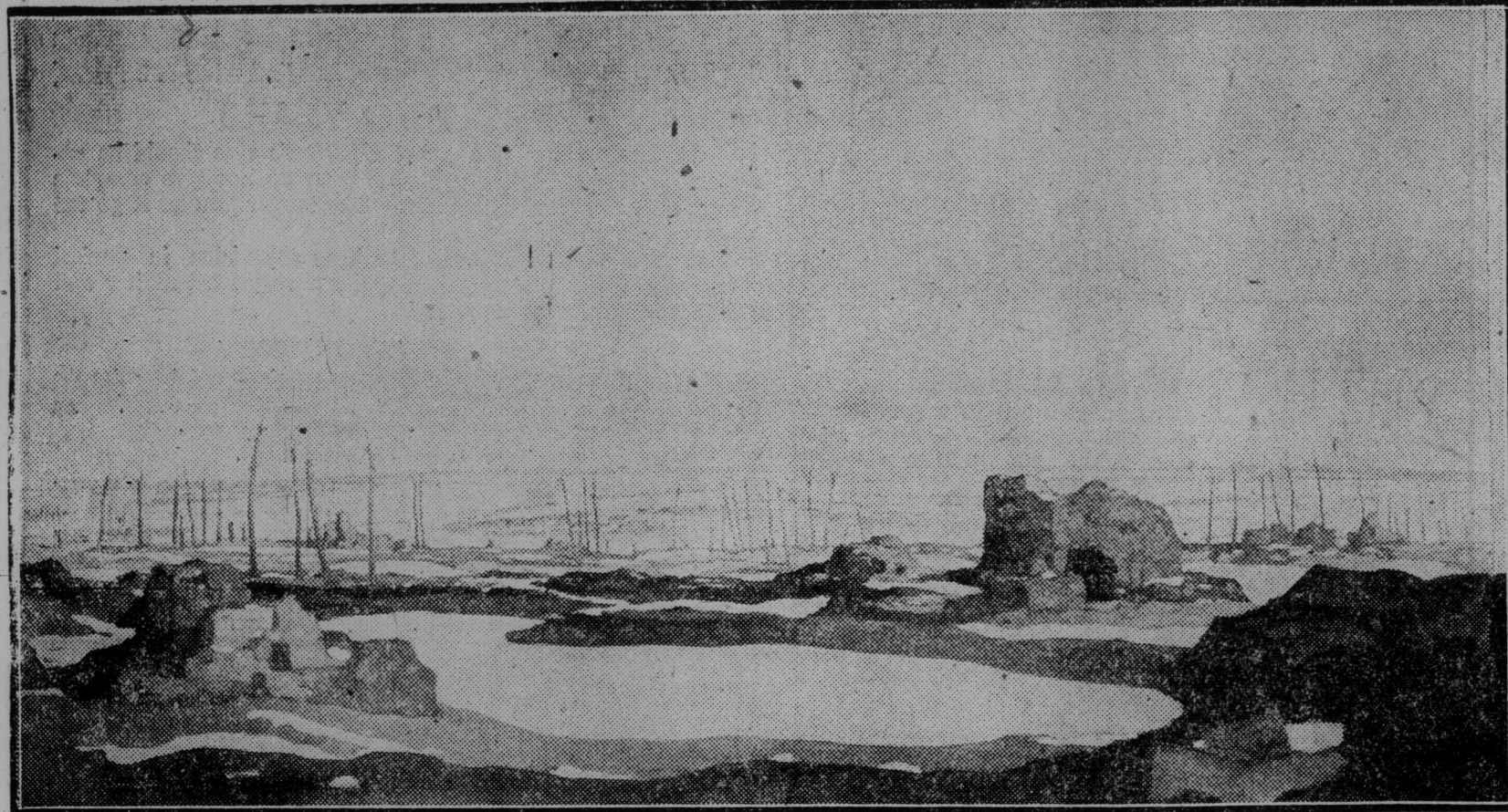

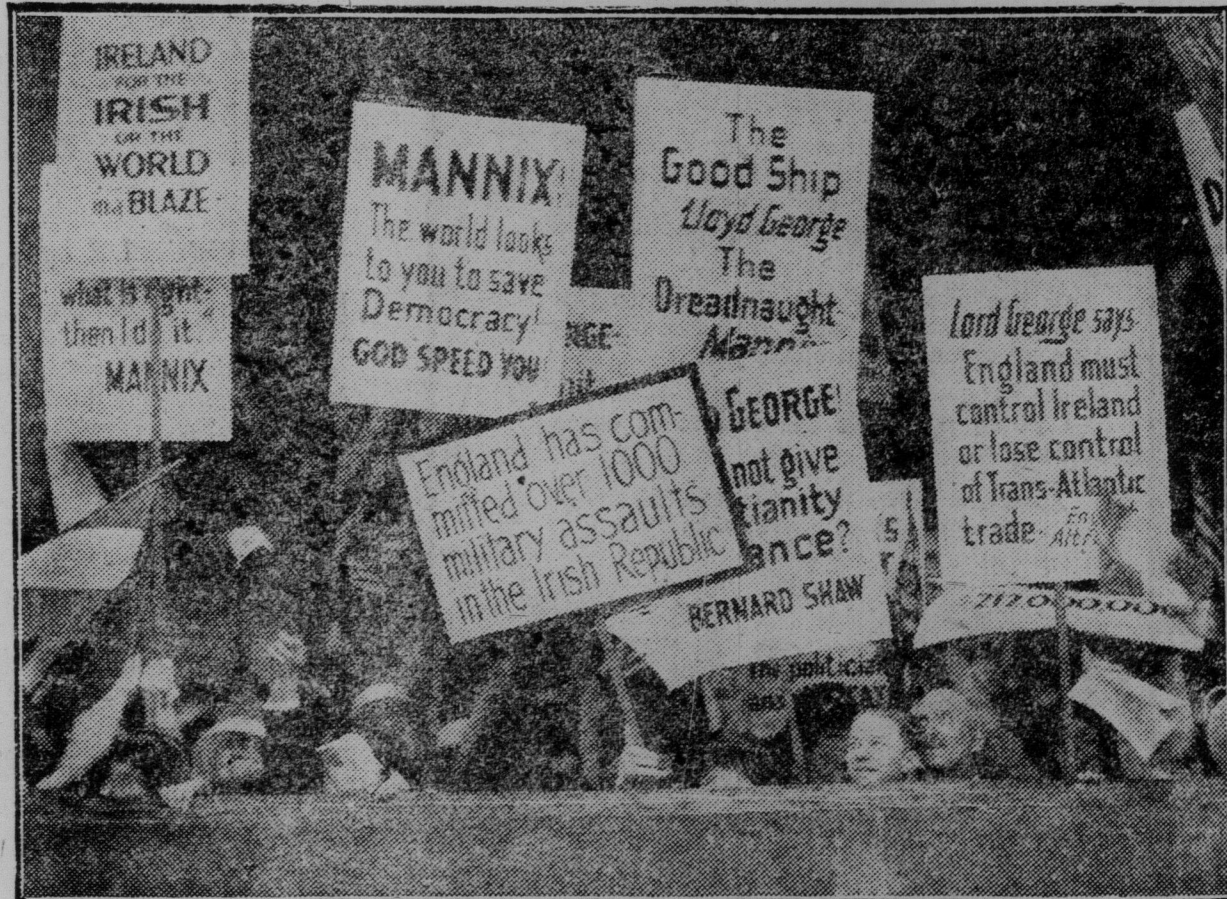
