REPORT:

That the only Acts of the Parliament of Canada relative to the Pro Synod (so far as they can ascertain), are,

1st. An Act passed in the session held in the nineteenth and two years of Her Majesty's reign, chapter 141, intituled "An Act to ena "members of the United Church of England and Ireland, in Can "meet in Synod."

2nd. An Act passed in the twenty-second year of Her Majesty's chapter 139, in amendment of the preceding Act, and entitled "An "explain and amend the Act intituled An Act to enable the members "United Church of England and Ireland, in Canada, to meet in Sy

3rd. An Act of the Dominion Legislature, passed in the thirty-four of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to extend to the Prop "New Brunswick the operation of the Act of the Legislature of "Province of Canada, concerning the Synod of the Church of Engli "Canada."

The authority of the Provincial Synod is derived from the second of the first mentioned Act (19 and 20 Vict., c. 141), which enacts, "Bishops, Clergy and Laity, members of the United Church of I "and Ireland, in this Province (Canada), may meet in General A "within this Province, by such representatives as shall be determined), and in the f "declared by them in their several Dioceses; and in such General A "frame a Constitution and Regulations for the general management "good government of the said Church in this Province; provided "that nothing in this Act contained shall authorise the imposition "rate or tax upon any person or persons whomsoever, whether below "the said Church or not, or the infliction of any punishment, "penalty upon any person, other than his suspension or removal fr "office in the said Church, or exclusion from the meetings or pro "of the Diocesan or General Synods; and provided also, that not aller the provision

The only Resolutions of the Provincial Synod (so far as we have attorn of the Laity able to ascertain), affecting any question of principle or doctrine, following:

1st. A resolution passed during the fourth session of the Synod, re to Ritual, viz:-"That the elevation of the elements in the celes "of the Holy Communion; the use of incense during Divine Service "the mixing of water with the sacramental wine, be hereby forbid "this Ecclesiastical Province; and whereas the Rubric at the end "Communion office enacts, that it shall suffice that the bread shall "as is usual to be eaten, the use of wafer bread is hereby forbidden, "this Synod would express their disapprobation of the use of lights "Lord's Table, and vestments, except the surplice, stole or scarf, an "in saying the public prayers or ministering the sacraments, or other "of the Church, and their determination to prevent, by every lawful "their introduction into the Church of this Province."

2d. A Resolution respecting the use of the new Lectionary, as follows: "That the Lectionary recently adopted by the Convocation of Canta "enacted by the Imperial Parliament, and which has received the "assent, be accepted as the Lectionary of this Province, and come if "January 1st, 1872, after which date the old Lectionary shall not "in any Church or Chapel in this Province."

We further recommend that the Act of the Parliament of Can Vict., c. 58, authorizing the union of this Synod with the Provincial of Canada, be accepted.
