

WEDNESDAY, July 3rd, 1872.

In pursuance to notice published in the *Royal Gazette*, in accordance with the 13th Article of the Constitution, the Synod of the Diocese of Fredericton met on this day in the School Room Trinity Church, in the City of St. John, at half-past nine o'clock A. M.

That this Synod, being the Synod of the Church of England in the Diocese of Fredericton and Province of New Brunswick, constituted in conformity with the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the late Province of Canada, passed in session thereof held in the nineteenth and twentieth years of present Majesty's reign, chaptered one hundred and forty-one, intitled 'An Act to enable the members of the United Church of England and Ireland, in Canada, to meet in Synod;' and by the authority of an Act of the Legislature of the Province of New Brunswick, passed in the thirty-fourth year of the reign of her Majesty, intitled 'An Act relating to the Synod of the Church of England in the Diocese of Fredericton and Province of New Brunswick;' and consisting of the Bishop, clergy and members of the Church of England in the Diocese of Fredericton and Province of New Brunswick, DOETH HEREBY ADOPT the said Act of the late Province of Canada, nineteenth and twentieth Victoria, chapter one hundred and forty-one, and DOETH with the members of the said Church in other Provinces of Canada in the General Assembly or Synod, known as the Provincial Synod of Canada, subject to the provisions of an Act of the Legislature of the Dominion of Canada, passed in the fourth year of her said Majesty's reign, intitled 'An Act to extend to the Province of New Brunswick the operation of the Act of the Legislature of the late Province of Canada, concerning the Synod of the Church of England in Canada.' the said Constitution or Regulations, or any of them, shall be contrary to any law or statute now or hereafter in force in this Province."

The other section of the Act, and the Act in amendment of it (22 Vict., c. 39), relate to the constitution and powers of the Diocesan Synods; the representation of the Laity in the several Synods; and the time and mode of election of lay delegates.

The Acts 19 and 20 Vict., c. 141, and the 34 Vict., c. 58, will be found in the Appendix to the Journal of the proceedings of this Synod of last year, pages 18 and 19, and we beg to refer thereto, and that those Acts may be taken as a part of this report.

The Act 22 Vict., c. 139, is hereunto annexed in the Schedule marked 'A'.

The Provincial Synod met under the power and authority given by the Acts 19 and 20 Vict., c. 141, and adopted a Declaration of Principles, and a Constitution, Order of Proceedings, and Rules of Order, which are to be found in the Journal of the proceedings of the fifth session of that Synod, from pages 83 to 93, inclusive, which journal accompanies this report, and which we request may be taken as a part thereof.

The Provincial Synod has also adopted the following Canons:

I. "For the nomination and election of a Bishop of Montreal and Metropolitan."

"On submission of Clergy to the Canons of the Provincial and Diocesan Synods."

"On the powers of the Metropolitan."

"On the trial of a Bishop."

"Court of Appeal of the Metropolitan."

"Of Ministering in Parishes."

"Of Letters Testimonial."

"Of Episcopal Resignations."

"Of the subdivision of Dioceses."

"Of the Officiating of strange Clergymen in a Diocese."

Several Canons are published in the Journal of the Provincial Synod, referred to, from pages 93 to 101, inclusive, and we request that they may be taken as a part of this report.

The powers of the Metropolitan are defined in the third Canon (page 94).

The jurisdiction and power of the Court established under the authority

of the Act are set forth in the fourth Canon, relating to the trial of Bishops

(page 95), and in the fifth Canon, providing for a Court of Appeal from

the judgment of a Diocesan Court (page 98). We refer the Synod to the

provisions of these Canons, without undertaking to draw any conclu-

sion; provided that the Synod be desired to express any opinion upon the extent of the powers thereby

conferred.

A resolution relating to the Temporalities of the Church was adopted in the

session of the Provincial Synod, but was disallowed on the report of

the Minister of Justice, as being a matter relating to "property and civil

rights or proceedings" and therefore belonging to the jurisdiction of the Local Legisla-

ture, also, that notwithstanding the provisions of "The British North America Act, 1867."

The only Resolutions of the Provincial Synod (so far as we have been able to ascertain), affecting any question of principle or doctrine, are the following:

1st. A resolution passed during the fourth session of the Synod, relating to Ritual, viz:—"That the elevation of the elements in the celebration of the Holy Communion; the use of incense during Divine Service; the mixing of water with the sacramental wine, be hereby forbidden in this Ecclesiastical Province; and whereas the Rubric at the end of the Communion office enacts, that it shall suffice that the bread shall be eaten, as is usual to be eaten, the use of wafer bread is hereby forbidden in this Synod would express their disapprobation of the use of lights on the Lord's Table, and vestments, except the surplice, stole or scarf, and of saying the public prayers or ministering the sacraments, or other rites of the Church, and their determination to prevent, by every lawful means, their introduction into the Church of this Province." And

2d. A Resolution respecting the use of the new Lectionary, as follows:—"That the Lectionary recently adopted by the Convocation of Canterbury, enacted by the Imperial Parliament, and which has received the assent, be accepted as the Lectionary of this Province, and come into use on January 1st, 1872, after which date the old Lectionary shall not be used in any Church or Chapel in this Province."

We further recommend that the Act of the Parliament of Canada, 1871, c. 58, authorizing the union of this Synod with the Provincial Synod of Canada, be accepted.
