SIR JOHN A. MACDONALD AND JOHN BRIGHT.

The Montreal Witness publishes the following report of a portion of a speech said to have been made by the Rev. Dr. Douglas at the Methodist conference recently held at Sherbrooke:

"I look at the man who has been deemed in the politics of this country more than a generation. I lay beside him public records of the great statesman in England who has lately gone to his rest, John Bright, that I may compare the prestige of his great personality, the royalty of that influence."

Dr. Douglas really said what is here attributed to him, he was guilty of an attempt to carry politics into the Methodist conference, and the silence of the other members of the conference was simply a refusal on their part, to be dragged into an unseemly discussion, in no way connected with the business before that body.

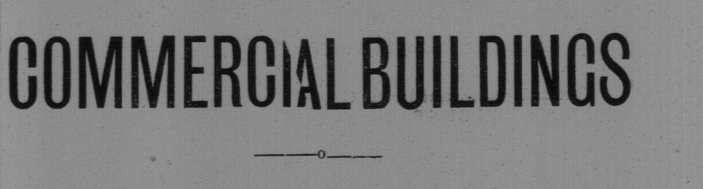
