

The case for Mrs. Pankhurst and her friends was not improved by their attitude during the trial. They were allowed every latitude, but made no attempt to controver the Crown's evidence, and interjected politics into the proceedings. The jury was sympathetic. The verdict of guilty was accompanied with a recommendation that teniency should be shown on account of the "undoubtedly pure motives underlying the agitation."






