

DOCKYARD EMIGRANTS TO CANADA.

EXTRACT from a LETTER from the Canadian Government Immigration Agent at Quebec to the Emigration Commissioners, dated 17th June 1870.

"The 'Tamar' arrived yesterday; a few children and one soldier had scarlatina, and were sent to hospital. To-day I had them all ticketed and sent on by boat. The Paymaster paid them on board. They were a very fine lot."

EXTRACT from a LETTER from the Canadian Government Immigration Agent at Quebec to the Emigration Commissioners, dated 8th July 1870.

"I now beg leave to inform you that the 'Crocodile,' having on board 147 married men and their wives, 163 single men, 101 single women, 162 boys between 12 and 1 years, 144 girls from 1 to 12 years, 25 male and 17 female infants, and a few families of pensioners, arrived in port on Friday the 24th ultimo at 6 p.m., all well. The Grand Trunk Railway not having sufficient cars to accommodate them, they remained on board the vessel until Monday the 27th, when they were landed and dispatched to the various inland agencies.

"The Dominion Government granted them all free transport, at a total cost of 2,087 dollars 47 cents., equal to 428 l. 18 s. 8 d. sterling.

"I am pleased to be able to add that the inland agents report that they have all found employment."

EXTRACT from a Letter from Her Majesty's Ship "Tamar," at Quebec, dated 17th June 1870.

"In answer to your letter 5075—14, I have the honour to report the late cruise of this ship, with emigrants, quite successful, and have to enclose a copy of the resolutions passed by the emigrants themselves, and given to me on the quarter-deck."

COPY of RESOLUTIONS referred to in the foregoing Letter.

Her Majesty's Ship "Tamar," 17 June 1870.

At a meeting of emigrants this day, the following resolutions were duly proposed, seconded, and unanimously carried:—

1st. That we, the emigrants on board Her Majesty's Ship "Tamar," wish respectfully to tender to Captain Hickley, officers, petty officers, and crew of Her Majesty's Ship "Tamar," our sincere thanks for the uniform, kind, and considerate treatment we have received during the time we have been on board, and we wish especially to express our deep gratitude also to the surgeon and his staff for the unremitting care and attention bestowed on those requiring medical aid.

2nd. That a copy of the above resolution be presented to Captain Hickley in the name of this meeting, and trust he may kindly communicate these our sentiments to those under his command.

Extract from a Letter from Her Majesty's Ship "Crocodile," at Quebec, dated 24th June 1870.

"I have the honour to report the arrival of Her Majesty's Ship 'Crocodile,' under my command, at this anchorage.

"I am well satisfied with the general good conduct of the emigrants since their embarkation; there has been no drunkenness nor riotous conduct amongst hem, and at least 99 per cent. have behaved themselves in an exemplary manner."
