Word was received by Mrs. W. C. Tremblay, of Grand Pre, on Monday, March 9th, of the death of her sister, Mrs. Jennie Lyle Gillmore, at Durban, South Africa, on January 27th.

This news was a great shock to the family and friends as Mrs. Gillmore had been enjoying good health when she wrote her last letter home in the New Year. Mrs. Gillmore was in her 67th year and was the eldest daughter of the late Robert Leard and Elizabeth Patterson Stewart, of Grand Pre. John R. Stewart, of Hortonville, and Bruce Stewart, of California, Mrs. W. C. Tremblay, Mrs. R. R. Dunson and Mrs. J. E. Palmer are the brothers and sisters surviving. She leaves a husband and three daughters in South Africa, one daughter in Australia and one son in Winnipeg, to mourn the loss of a devoted wife and faithful mother. Mrs. Gillmore was a very successful school teacher before her marriage. Her first experience in teaching was as an assistant to the late Bernard Farrell, who taught for many years in the school at Horton. After her marriage she accompanied Capt. Gillmore on many sea voyages and was always pleased to tell about her visits to Ireland, the home of her forefathers.

### A Valuable Industry.

The lobster industry of Nova Scotia is the most valuable in the world. The total market value of all the lobsters taken from its waters for the year ending March 31, 1912, reached the three million mark, as compared with a corresponding value of five million for the whole Dominion.  
New Brunswick's lobster fisheries were valued at \$743,859. Prince Edward Island at \$331,519 and Quebec at \$363,832 during the same year. The lobster is also the most valuable of all the provincial fisheries, totalling one third of the entire fishery value thereof, while in the Dominion its position is surpassed only by salmon. It is the main sustenance of some 2,000 fishermen, and as many as 14,000 persons, male and female, find employment in the canneries.  
The amount of capital invested is very large. Besides the value of boats and outfits which are used for general fishing purposes, as well as the lobster, there are in 1911 12 some 150,067 traps, valued at \$644,110, 227 canneries valued at \$236,945. In addition to the capital invested in cold storage plants, fish houses, and other smaller allied industries closely connected with the carrying on of the lobster industry.

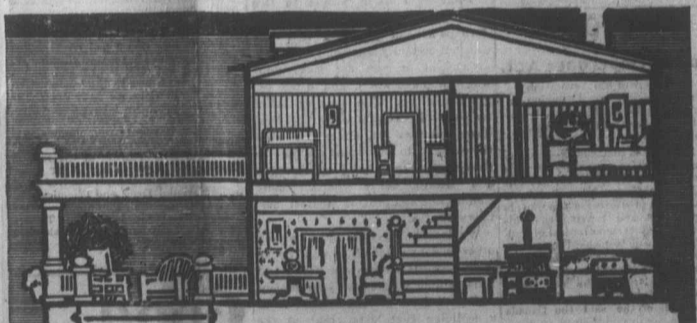
