And that point is often reached. If it were not so, the earth would have been scrowded with people centuries since that none of them could sit down for want or soom. We know how many square feet of land there is on the earth, we know by rule how often the births would double the population and fill the earth but for the contending forces which destroy life so rapidly. Those destructive agencies all grow out of the struggle for food. Call it want, exposure, disease or violence, that destroys life, if you choose; they all grow out of the struggle for food. A creature's chance for life depends on his power to push down his fellows and snatch away their fool. Men at birth are launched on a sea in which there is only a small island that can support life It is already full; and the chance of every new comer depends on his ability to push some one off and stay on himself. This is a picture of 'the social problem.'"

Notwithstanding the many failures of Communities and Associations, attempts still continue to be made, for advantages of social intercourse, of a combination of labor, capital, and skill present inducements hard to resist, particularly in those of a mental organization. 
