

Humphrey v. Archabold.
The old case of Thomas Humphrey gainst Inspector Archabold, Detective Slemin and Constable Duncan was on the list at Osgoode Hall yesterday, but was not

reached. The plaintiff, it will be remembered, was arrested on the charge of having committed rape on a 12-year-old girl, Agnes Barnes, but was acquitted by the Police Magistrate. He then commenced an action against the defendants, claiming \$5000 for false arrest and malicious prosecution. On examination ing \$5000 for false arrest and malicious prosecution. On examination of Inspector Archabold and Detective Slemin for discovery in the action, they refused to disclose the rame of the informant who gave the information which led to the plaintiff's arrest. 


