letters, we are happy to learn, that throughout the
Kingdom a general Commercial improvement has
commenced; the spirit of public confidence has
again revived, the prospects of the Manufacturer

Memoranda.

Portsmouth, March 16.—His Majesty's ship Blonde,
which arrived yesterday, fell in with on the 7th inst. in
lat. 44 deg. 43 min. north, long. 21 deg. 57 min. west,
the Frances Mary, of 398 tons, Kendall, Master, of and from
New Brunswick, bound to Liverpool, timber laden, (being
her first voyage.) water-logged and a perfect wreck.
Took off the master, his wife, three seamen, and one fe-
male passenger, out of a crew of seventeen. On the 1st
Feb. the Frances Mary experienced a most tremendous
gale of wind from the W. S. W. during which she carried
away her foremast; the sea made a complete breach over
her, washed four seamen off the deck, the boats, &c.; for
twenty two days, in this horrible condition, the unfortu-
nate survivors supported their miserable existence by ac-
tually feeding on the dead bodies of those who died on
the wreck, when they were providentially fallen in with and
rescued from their horrid state by His Majesty's ship
Blonde. From her commander, Lord Byron, and his offi-
cers, they received the utmost possible sympathy, and every
thing was afforded for their comfort and accommodation
by his Lordship, whose conduct towards them the captain
says no language on his part is sufficient to express; for
had they remained a few hours longer, they must inevi-
tably have perished, having been brought on board in a
complete state of exhaustion.
