TWENTIETH ANNUAL

REPORT

OF THE

Deacons' Court & Managing Committee

OF

ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH, LONDON, CNT.,

FOR THE YEAR 1870.

In presenting this our twentieth Annual Report, we would desire, with grateful hearts, to acknowledge the goodness of God vouchsafed to us during the past year, and to thank Him for permitting us to meet once more under such favorable circumstances.

Our last Annual meeting was held on the 27th January, 1870. At that time the porch on the east side of the church, and several other items remained unfinished. We have now to report that the building is completed, and we have reason to feel grateful to our heavenly Father that he has put it into the hearts of so many of our people to contribute so liberally towards the erection of the Edifice, and that it is in every respect so well adapted for the use of the Congregation. Your committee found it necessary, in order to prevent drafts about the pulpit, and to increase the comfort of the congregation in the winter season, to erect a brick porch at the north end of the church which was not included in the original contract. They have also, for the benefit of those attending the prayer meetings and Sabbath school, covered the passages in the basement with matting.

The church grounds have been levelled and fenced and plank walks laid to the porches. Substantial sheds, comprising 21 stalls, have also been crected for the use of parties coming from the country, the cost of which was \$516, \$354 of which has been raised by subscription, the balance having in the meantime been paid out of the congregational funds.

After the erection of the fences it was found that the season was too far advanced for the planting of shade trees. Your committee would recommend that in the spring the grounds within the fence, and also adjoining the sidewalks, be planted with nice trees which would in a few years be a great ornament to the grounds, and a comfort to the congregation.

At last Annual meeting a resolution was passed recommending the building of a new manse, but your committee could not see their way clear to proceed with the work at present. But inasmuch as the congregation still suffers the inconvenience arising from want of the use of the west porch, which is not available while the present manse remains; and as the appearance of the church and grounds would be much enhanced by its removal, your committee hope that their successors will lose no time in carrying out the resolution.

Your committee have to report that, in compliance with a resolution passed at last Annual meeting, the lots on Duke and Waterloo streets were advertised and seven of them sold, realizing the sum of \$3340. \$2047.50 of this amount has been paid in cash, and the balance secured by mortgage on the property, payable in three annual instalments, with interest.

Your committee have great pleasure in acknowledging the receipt of three handsome chairs for the pulpit platform, presented by Mr. Charles Bennett, Cabinetmaker of this city.

FINANCE.

The books of Mr. Wm. Begg, Treasurer of the ordinary church funds, and of Mr. Alex. Davidson, Treasurer of the building fund, have been audited and found correct. Statements of the different funds will be found annexed.

For the purpose of consolidating the church debt, your committee, in August last, effected a loan of \$9000, for five years, at 8 per cent. interest, on the security of the church property, and it is hoped that before the expiration of that time the congregation will make a strenuous effort to pay off a large portion of this debt. They would also respectfully recommend that in order to meet the interest on this borrowed money, the congregation, at its Annual meeting, authorize the taking up of quarterly collections.

The number of sittings let is 950, and the amount of pew rent paid the Treasurer during the year, was \$2398.76, and there remains of arrears, considered good, \$346.75.

Your committee would desire to impress upon the congregation that payment of pew rent should always be made in advance, this would enable the committee to meet the current expenses with greater ease.

Your committee has much pleasure in stating that during the past year the health of our esteemed Pastor has continued good.

By the united action of the Session and managing committees, Mr. Wright, student of Divinity, who had completed his College course, was engaged for a term of six months as assistant, but his having been called to Erskine church, Ingersoll, and the congregation there being desirous that his settlement should take place at as early a date as possible, Mr. Wright was released from two months of his engagement, his time of service here being four months, since which time Mr. Scott has been discharging the entire duties himself, with such casual pulpit aid as he could procure. Your committee lament the difficulty that has been found to exist in securing a suitable permanent assistant, and hope that the congregation may be directed by Divine wisdom in any future arrangement that may be made for pulpit assistance.

At last annual meeting Mr. Alexander McIntosh, who, for four years, faithfully and generously discharged the onerous duties connected with the office of Secretary and treasurer, resigned, and your committee have to report that in accordance with a resolution passed at said meeting, Mr. Alexander Davidson has been appointed to the office at a salary of \$200 per annum.

In accordance with the rules of the congregation six managers retire annually. Those whose term of office now expires, are-

REPORT OF SABBATH SCHOOLS In Connection with St. Andrew's Church, FOR 1870.

In submitting our Report for the year, we feel that we have much cause for thankfulness to God for the many opportunities we have enjoyed of imparting instruction to the young in the Sabbath School.

We regret that the Report does not show any increase of attendance over previous years. This may have arisen partly, from the opening of another Sabbath School in the vicinity, but we feel convinced that if greater interest was taken in the schools by the congregation, and the benefits to be derived from regular attendance on the part of the children fully appreciated, we would not only have a large increase of scholars, but the schools generally would not suffer for want of efficient teachers, as is now the case. The harvest truly is great, and the laborers few. Pray ye the Lord of the harvest that He may send laborers into His harvest.

The Sabbath School organization consists of the Central and four Branch Schools; two of which are in Westminster, one in the Gore of London, and one in Petersville.

This school has for many years been in a very flourishing condition, and we hope some suitable person may soon be found to take the office of superintendent, and re-open it at an early day.

also in Westminster, is under the superintendence of Mr. Diprose, assisted by Mrs. Jones. Number of scholars, boys, 10; girls, 12. Average attendance, 18. Library vols. 30. The children are also supplied with S. S. Visitor.
