Sir Henry Bulwer and the St. George's Dinner in New York.

The speech of Her Majesty's Minister to the United States, at the late Anniversary of the St. George's Society of New York, will be found in our columns. We publish it, believing it will be ac-We publish it, believing it will be acceptable to most of our readers; and if, as Dean Swift observes, "proper words in proper places make the true definition of style," the language and arrangement of the speaker's thoughts constitute a style very happily adapted to the auspi-

cious occasion.

Apart from its excellence as a literary effort, sparkling with occasional sallies of wit and appropriate illustrations, the speech contains sentiments, and expresse feelings, highly honorable to the exalted position of Sir Henry and the nation which he so ably represents. Were we disposed to be fastidious, or inclined to indulge in the severity of hypereriticism, we might find fault with this production, and attribute to it too much of that "ad captandum" manner which might by some be regarded as incompatible with the dignity of a Minister Plenipotentiary. Our Saxon relations, however, are particularly fond of that ready and familiar style of public speaking which at once awakens interest by natural comparisons and common-place illustrations. Aware of this, the distinguished guest exhibited his good judgment in both the matter and manner of his address, and certainly rendered it both attractive and acceptable to the Society of his Patron Saint.

We were more than gratified in read ing this speech. First, because there is in it an honesty of purpose, and a sin-cerity inseparable from the true principles of patriotism and national sympathy Sir Henry Bulwer is an Englishman, and, as such, he revealed himself in every sentiment and feeling that became him as a Briton. He spoke with a becoming pride of his country, its honored institu-tions, its noble achievements, its elevated position in the scale of nations, and the glory with which centuries had invested it. He however remembered that

The Court was of opinion that the evidence sustained the second count. The words made use of were of serious twinters and the imputation tended to dishatrous count. The slander tended to burt the Plaintiff while interpretation and propriets very gravely. were uttered, a period of great excitement in Montreal. The slander tended to hurt the Plaintiff in his reputation and prospects very gravely. The Court declared, though the evidence was conflicting, that the words proved to have been uttered motained the action; the only question was, whether there was any justification or palliation for their utterance. It was clearly of opinion that there was no malice on the patt of the Defendant; that the Defendant had merely repeated a ramor which was generally currient; he did not originate it, but was guilty of hediscretion in repeating a rumor which was unfounded; he was not justifiable in so doing; he had not propagated it, but repeated it only on one occasion. But the Plaintiff was still entitled to damages. The words uttered were to the effect that Plaintiff had been arrested for the arson in question. This was untrue; but he had been arrested, it appeared, for firing a pistol in the crowd congregated around the burning building; he had, therefore, been arrested for some cause, though not for that alleged by the Defendant. His conduct too justified his apprehension; and that in fact the rumor in question, though not true, was brought on then by the Plaintiff a own conduct. Taking this view of the case, the Court would give darnages only sufficient to carry costs; viz., fifty shillings, with costs of the Superior Court.
