



used for that purpose. We regret more particularly that such a course as this was pursued, especially, as we have heard that warrants were also issued for the purchase of Lot Fifty-four—a purchase which the House of Assembly did not authorize. The House of Assembly cannot help remarking that such a course as this, a course in law, and an abridgment of the rights and privileges of Parliament, is extremely dangerous, and calculated to destroy confidence in the Government who adopt it."

When the House divided the motion of amendment was negatived, and the motion that the paragraph be agreed to, carried, as above.

On the sixth paragraph being read, Hon. Mr. Whelan moved the following in amendment:—

"We rejoice to learn that the purchase of the Selkirk estate has been attended with satisfactory results. From this we may confidently hope that the great utility and necessity of the Land Purchase Bill will be further acknowledged, by the purchase of any other Estates that may be offered to the Government, on terms as advantageous as those on which the Selkirk property was secured."

Amendment lost, and paragraph agreed to—division as above.

When the seventh paragraph was read, Hon. Mr. Whelan moved in amendment the following:—

"We highly appreciate the spirit that has prompted members of young men to enrol themselves in the Volunteer Rifle and Artillery Companies lately formed in this Colony; and we shall carefully consider the propriety of legislating in reference to these Corps."

Amendment lost, and paragraph agreed to, as the others.

The other paragraphs were agreed to without a division.

The Committee who prepared the Address were then appointed a Committee to wait on His Excellency, to have his pleasure when he should be attended by the House with the same.

House adjourned.
