## KILLED IN COMMITTEE.

MR. MCCARTHY'S COMMITTEE BILL  
ARRANGED AT ITS BIRTH.

OTTAWA, April 3.—The budget debate was resumed this afternoon by Mr. G. W. Ross, who made a clear speech of about an hour and a half on the subject of the government's financial policy. He pointed out that the government had spent more than it had received for the last three years, and that the deficit was now \$2,000,000. He argued that the government should reduce its expenditures and increase its revenues. He proposed a committee to investigate the government's financial affairs. His motion was carried by a majority of 100 to 50.

OTTAWA, April 3.—Mr. Dalton McCarthy's bill to establish a committee to investigate the government's financial affairs was passed by a majority of 100 to 50. The bill provides that the committee shall have the right to call upon any person for information and to examine any document in the possession of any person. The committee shall report to the House of Commons within three months of its appointment.

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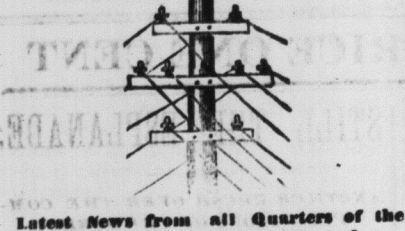

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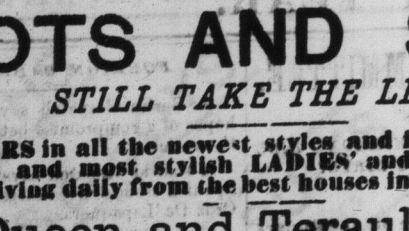
