How Will the English Get to Khartoum?

While the British government, says the New York Sun, is pledged by the premier's explicit declaration not only to rescue Gordon, but to permanently occupy the eastern part of the Sudan, there seems to be a good deal of vacillation at the war office regarding the route to be adopted by the expedition.

Soon after the complete abandonment of the mistaken evacuation policy was avowed in the house of commons—an announcement which was made just before parliament was prorogued—it was decided at the war office to reject Suakin as a base of operations, and orders were sent to ship to India the railway material which had already been collected at that point.

This delay has naturally caused dismay at Cairo, where the gravity of the Sudan situation is thoroughly understood. The khedive's ministers are certain to urge upon Lord Northbrook the expediency of reverting to the original plan, which contemplated an advance from Suakin, and there have of late been rumors that the British cabinet was leaning toward the same program.
