

KIDNAPPED AND TORTURED

WEALTRY BUFFALO LAWYER CAR-RIED OFF BY CONVICTS.

Fugitive From Justice in Canada, Who Had Paid Lawyer Cottle Large Sums for a Pardon Without Results, Lures Him From His Office, Binds and Gags Him and Seeks Ransom.

Buffalo, N.Y., June 27 .- Octavius O. Cottle, the well-known lawyer of this city, was kidnapped on Monday morning. He was lured to a vacant house at 36 Baynes-street, where he was overpowered by 2 men, who bound and gagged him, and, at the points of revolvers and daggers, compelled him to write a let-ter to his wife directing her to deliver ter to his wife directing her to deliver over \$2500 to a messenger to secure his liberation. As Mrs. Cottle was arrang-ing to carry out instructions, she was advised not to do so. Meanwhile the cap-tive was kept chained in the cellar, with one of the daring crooks on guard over him. The fellow went away on Tuesday afternoon, and after several hours of per-sistent, desperate labor, the lawyer man-aged to break his chain. Early yesterday morning he succeeded in attracting the attention of a police-man. Then, after 40 hours' imprison-ment in a dingy, underground room, without food or sleep, he regained his liberty.
