OF THE
HOME MISSION COMMITTEE
OF THE
PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN CANADA,
(WESTERN SECTION.)

HELD IN THE DEACON'S COURT ROOM OF KNOX CHURCH,
TORONTO, ON 4TH, 5TH, & 6TH OCTOBER, 1875.

The Home Mission Committee of the Presbyterian Church in Canada, for the Provinces of Quebec, Ontario and the West, met in the Deacon's Court Room of Knox Church, Toronto, on Monday, 4th October, 1875, and two following days. Rev. W. Cochrane, D. D., Convener.

The following members were present: Dr. Cochrane, Dr. Proudfoot, Rev. Messrs J. M. King, F. McCuaig, D. J. Macdonnell, Joseph Whyte, R. Rodgers, J. Burton, R. Torrance, D. Paterson, W. Donald, W. D. Ballantyne, R. Hamilton, M. W. McLean, J. Carmichael, J. L. Murray, D. B. Whimster, H. Crozier, A. Tolmie, J. Rannie, J. Laing, D. Fraser, R. N. Grant, and R. H. Warden, Ministers; and Messrs. T. Gordon and H. Young, Elders.

Rev. A. Brown was invited to sit with the Committee as a corresponding member.

PRESBYTERY OF TORONTO.—The above amount includes a special grant to Newmarket of \$100, and to Aurora of \$75.

" " OWEN SOUND.—Included in the above sum is an advance grant for ensuing six months of \$100 to Parry Sound.

" " SAUGEEN.—The Committee disallowed a claim of \$40—board of missionary in Amaranth—till Presbytery endeavour to obtain the amount from the people.

" " LONDON.—Included in the above amount are (1) arrears to probationers, \$38; and (2) retrospective grant, of \$50 to New Glasgow.

" " BRUCE.—The above sum includes the expenses of Mr. Cameron's visit to the Manitoulin Island, \$22.

" " BARRIE.—The Committee reduced the amount asked for Gravenhurst, from \$113.50 to \$85; and also the amount claimed for travelling expenses of missionary from New York to Raymond, from \$27 to \$10, the Committee being only liable for expenses of American students from the boundary line to the field.

CONGREGATION OF BAY OF CHALEUR.—This congregation having been transferred by the General Assembly to the Synod of the Lower Provinces, the Committee agreed to pay the grant for the past six months—\$100,—their liability ceasing from this date.

MANITOBA.

The Committee considered at length the claims of Manitoba as brought before them in a Report from that Presbytery's Home Mission Committee and other documents.

(1.) MR. H. CURRIE.—The Convener reported that Mr. H. Currie had declined the appointment to Manitoba.

(2.) EMERSON APPOINTMENT.—The Presbytery urgently asked the Committee to appoint Mr. John Scott, formerly of Napanee, to Emerson, Pembina, &c., promising that at least one half of his salary would be paid from other sources than the funds of the Committee, the American Synod of Min-

The Committee agreed to appoint Mr. Scott to this field for a term of three years, at the same salary as paid the other missionaries in Manitoba, together with travelling expenses to the field. At a subsequent stage Mr. Scott personally appeared before the Committee and offered to go to Emerson, &c., for six months, and pay all his own travelling expenses. Mr. Scott's offer was accepted.

(3.) PROFESSOR HART'S SALARY.—It was agreed that the salary of Professor Hart be \$1,600 for the current year, and that the action of the Committee in this matter be reported to next General Assembly.

(4.) TUTOR IN MANITOBA COLLEGE.—It was reported to the Committee that a recent draft on Rev. W. Reid, from the Presbytery of Manitoba, included a certain sum for the payment of a tutor in Manitoba College. The Committee having no information that the General Assembly had sanctioned the appointment and payment of said tutor, instructed the convener to correspond with the Manitoba College Board enant the matter.

(5.) FORT FRANCIS.—The application of the Presbytery for a Missionary to Fort Francis was remitted to a sub-committee consisting of the Convener and Messrs. Macdonnell, King and Warden.

LAKE SUPERIOR.

Interesting reports were received from the missionaries labouring at Sault St. Marie, Silver Islet and Thunder Bay. It was agreed to pay the house rent of the missionary at Thunder Bay from this date.

BRITISH COLUMBIA.

The Committee received intelligence of the formation of a Presbytery in this Province in connection with the Church of Scotland.

The sub-committee already appointed were instructed to take such action as they may deem necessary in any matters emerging in connection with the interests of the Church in that Province before next regular meeting of the Committee.

FUNDS.

The Committee took into consideration the present state of the funds. It was found that after payment of the grants to presbyteries for the past six months, and meeting all liabilities to date, the fund is in debt about \$16,000. The Convener was instructed to ask the Treasurer to borrow money as early as he conveniently can to meet all claims against the Committee. The Convener was also instructed to prepare and have distributed in all congregations a circular setting forth the urgent and pressing claims of the fund on the liberality of the members and adherents of the Church.

APPOINTMENTS OF MISSIONARIES.

The list of Missionaries available for service during the winter months was made up, and appointments given them.

PROBATIONER'S SCHEME.

The Sub-Committee on the Distribution of Probationers brought several cases before the Committee for advice.

(1.) Case of Mr. D. C. Johnson.—Mr. Johnson asked payment for several Sabbaths he had been assigned to the Presbyteries of Quebec, Montreal and Glengarry, on which days no appointments had been given him by said Presbyteries.

The Sub-Committee were instructed to correspond with the Presbyteries named as to Mr. Johnson's claim.

(2.) Case of Mr. W. Wright.—Owing to the Kingston Presbytery having no appointments for Mr. Wright on certain Sabbaths he was assigned to their bounds, he claimed compensation for the same. The Committee learning that the disappointments referred to arose from certain changes consequent on the recent union, instructed the Sub-Committee to give Mr. Wright an order on the Treasurer of the Home Mission Fund for the amount due.

(3.) Case of Mr. Vincent.—The Sub-Committee reported that certain Presbyteries had complained of Mr. Vincent not filling several appointments given him on Sabbaths he was duly assigned to them. Mr. Vincent having withdrawn his name from the Probationer's List it was agreed to take no further action in the matter.

The Committee agreed to take up as the first item of business at next regular meeting the consideration of the Probationer's Distribution Scheme.
