DAMAGED BY FIRE.

Three vessels were damaged by fire at the Lehigh Valley docks, Perth Amboy, N. J., Thursday. Schooner John R Penrose was badly damaged, while the schooner Laura S Hatch and the lighter H W Harris was only pilghtly damaged.
