London, May 7.

General John Hall of the British army is dead.

Isaac Butt, member for Limerick, in a letter on "Home Rule," asks for an Irish Assembly in which Home-rulers shall be fully represented.

There is considerable excitement in Copenhagen over the arrest of the President and Treasurer of the International Society in Copenhagen.
