

Report of Session.

ANNUAL REPORTS.

THE fifth year in the history of the congregation of Cowan Avenue Presbyterian Church having been concluded, it is the privilege of the Session, as the chief governing body, to briefly review its affairs, supplemented by the detailed reports that shall follow from the various organizations in connection with the congregation.

While the congregation's growth has not been rapid, yet it has been very satisfactory to the Session, those coming in among us being welcome and useful additions to our membership. The following is a statement of membership.

On the whole our people are faithful in their church attendance. Those who fail in this respect are lovingly admonished by the Session to consider their duty and to seek to be more faithful in the future.

Attendance at Communion fas follows :--- February, 167 : May, 176 ; August, 140 ; November, 174.

The congregation sustained a serious loss during the year in the death of Mr. John Inglis, an honored and faithful member of the Session. Mr. Inglis had been identified with the congregation since its organization, and always took the deepest interest in the church and its work. In four homes families have been bereaved of loved ones. The Session expresses its heartfelt sympathy with these families in their sorrow.

Since September last the Session has been deprived of the valued services of Mr. J. G. Robinson, who has been confined to his home with illness. He is much missed, and it is our earnest prayer that he may soon be restored to health.

It had been felt for sometime that an addition to the eldership would be of benefit to the congregation. In the autumn the people were asked to choose three men for this office. The Session was much gratified by the interest manifested in this important step. The result was that on Sabbath morning, December 17th, Messrs. Peter McGregor, S. H. Bradford and Alex. Gordon were ordained and inducted as elders of the congregation.

Good work is being done by all the organizations of the church. The Session observes with approval and gratitude the work of the Sabbath School teachers, choir, the ladies in the W. F. M. S., Woman's Association and Mission Band.

When we review the year now gone we cannot fail to see that our Heavenly Father has been most gracious to us. All blessing has been from Him. "It has been in ourselves that we have been straitened. Let us consecrate ourselves more fully, and wait more earnestly upon our Lord in prayer and work.

THE Board, in presenting the annual report for 1899, notes that a comparison of this financial statement with that submitted at the last annual meeting shows that there has been a substantial increase in the amount of money raised for congregational purposes.

The report gives a very full account of what has been done, and contains much that ought to be of interest to every member and adherent of the congregation.

The Board is pleased to record that the work of renovating and improving the church building has been done in a satisfactory manner, and begs to congratulate the congregation in providing themselves with a commodious, well-appointed and comfortable church home.

The hopeful spirit of the congregation in all its work, as well as its generous liberality in providing funds, are very encouraging to all interested in its welfare.

The total receipts from envelopes, open collections and special subscriptions amounted to \$3,120.31, as compared with \$2,666.14 from the same sources for the year 1898, showing an increase of \$454.17, being an average contribution per Sabbath of \$58.87 for this year as compared with \$50.12 for last year.

The following members of the Board of Managers retire, namely: J. M. Campbell, Robert Laidlaw, Walter Scott, Jesse Tulloch and John Douglas, and vacancies to be filled caused by Geo. Harrington leaving the bounds and Peter McGregor and S. H. Bradford having been elected to the eldership.

THE officers and teachers of the Sabbath School beg to present the Annual Report for 1899.

The teachers are generally faithful to their duties, and

this must have due effect on the spiritual growth of the school.

Throughout the year 1900, studies from the Life of Christ will be carried on, and parents are urged to co-operate with the teachers unceasingly, in seeing that their children attend regularly, and also that they prepare their lessons at home.

The Bible Class in April last became a separate organization, managing its own work and controlling its own offerings.

The old plan of a quarterly review of studies by the scholars has given place to a regular quarterly service for the school in the church, conducted by the Pastor. It is hoped that appreciation of these excellent quarterly services will be shown by a still larger attendance on the part of parents and friends for the future.

This includes a balance of 6 cents of 1898's money.

The offering received at the quarterly service held on September 24th amounting to \$14.30 was given to the Century Fund, while that of December 31st, amounting to \$7.04 was handed to the Managers.

The Library has had a few volumes added to it during the year, but should have a large addition made to it, as the books now on hand have ceased, very largely, to meet the desires and needs of the scholars. There are now about 457 books in stock.

In conclusion, we pray that God's blessing may be upon our work and that the year 1900 may mark an increase of devotion among us as laborers in His vineyard, and an outpouring of His Holy Spirit upon those over whom we have charge.

THIS has been a year of quiet, steady work in our Auxiliary. We have not had, as in some former years, the stimulus of personal visits from our missionaries, but the interest has been well sustained by the individual members of our Society.

Our membership roll at present bears thirty-four names thirteen general society and twenty-one auxiliary members.

We have held ten regular meetings during the year, with an average attendance of eighteen. Our Annual Thank-offering meeting was held on 1st November, when we were favor-

ed with a visit and a short address upon the work in which we are engaged from Mrs. McClelland of Chalmers Church.

The thank-offering collection amounted to \$26.55. Clothing valued at \$67.65 and \$6.00 in cash were sent to the Presbyterial Society for the work amongst the Indians in the North-west. We thank our Father in Heaven that while sorrow and bereavement have come to some of us, His power to sustain has been again proven, and His promise to be with His people always abundantly fulfilled. It would greatly encourage the officers and members of our Auxiliary if a larger number of the women of our congregation, would make an effort to attend the monthly meetings, which are held on the fourth Wednesday of each month.

T is with much pleasure that we present our second annual report.

There have been 14 meetings held during the year. We have a membership of 50 and have had an average attendance of 26. The Band meets every other Monday afternoon, except during the holidays, the meetings being opened and closed with devotional exercises.

Owing to altered circumstances in March last, the secretary, E. Qua, found it necessary to resign. His place was filled by the election of J. Mitchell.

Our meetings have been made especially interesting by addresses from Rev. Mr. Barron, Miss King, Mrs. Wm Duncan, Dr. Briggs, Mrs. Clark, Miss Wanless, Miss Johnston and others, on such subjects as Jno. Paton, Religions of the World, Japan, Siam, Character Building, Chinese in America, India Work, etc., from which we have received much information in regard to these places and peoples.

The members of the Band busied themselves with wood carving, under the direction of Mr. Anderson, making quilts,

dressing dolls, making scrap books, and such like for distribution in the different mission fields.

On the occasion of the closing of the meetings for the summer months a "Birthday Party ' was held, when, after the regular exercises, refreshments were served and a sociable time spent together.

Clothing to to the value of \$9.00 was sent to the North West and it was decided, also, to give \$15.00 in cash to Foreign Missions.

We trust that a greater interest may be manifested by the church in our work and that our humble efforts may be the means of stirring up a deeper interest among our own members in the mission work of our church and the world.

AT a meeting of the young people of the congregation on December 12th, a Christian Endeavor Society was organized. It was decided to hold weekly meetings on Monday evenings at eight o'clock. THE Music Committee beg to present their report for 1899 At an adjourned meeting of the Congregation held February 15th the following resolution was adopted,

"That two hundred dollars be placed at the disposal of the Music Committee to carry on the service of praise."

From the first of the year till the first of April the service was rendered without expense to the Congregation, Mr. Hendry having conducted the choir with Miss Norwich as organist and Miss McCutcheon as leading soprano The thanks of the Congregation are due to Mr. Hendry and those who so ably assisted him during this time. Acting under the authority of the above resolution, the Committee took steps to secure the services of a permanent conductor, organist and leading soprano. These positions were filled as per memo. attached, each engagement commencing April 1st. That of the conductor of the choir being for the term of six months. At the expiration of three months of this time Mr. Jackson requested leave of absence for two months, without expense to the Congregation, which the committee granted. The second half of his engagement thus started September 1st and expired November 30th, but in order that the congregation might further secure his services, if desired, the committee re-engaged him for a term of four months from December 1st, subject to the approval of the congregation at the annual meeting. In the

event of the congregation deciding to continue the present arrangement for conducting the service of praise, it will be necessary for them to furnish our successors with a sum of not less than \$300.00, in order that they may have a small amount over the amount to be paid for salaries, for music and incidental expenses.

In thanking (in the name of the congregation) the members of the choir for their services during the past year, we would also request those members of the congregation, who are capable of taking part in the service of praise, to assist the choir by volunteering as early in the year as possible.
