FROM OUR LONDON CORRESPONDENT.

There is a general opinion here that the Earl of Carlisle has virtually retired from his position as Viceroy in Ireland. He has come home to recruit his health. The Irish never had a Lord Lieutenant who made himself more unpopular than the present one. He is a gentleman, a scholar, and a Christian. During the whole of his sojourn in Ireland he only received one insult by a church member, and the memorial presented to his Lordship, consequent upon that inhospitable transaction, satisfactorily showed how the exception proved the rule. It is rumored that Lord Woodhouse is to be his successor. Some other names have been mentioned, but he is the most likely man for the place. Speculations are also afloat as to the propriety of devoting the Irish peerage to a whole, would not raise any formidable objection to such a project, but in proceeding would be very unwise. The late Joseph Home, with his parsimonious views, wished to save the salary of £20,000 a year. Since he wished to abolish the office, the steamboat, the railway, and the electric telegraph have brought Dublin home to our doors, and if there were any agency in his arguments 28 years ago there would be more logical force in them. The Duke of Northumberland, the Lord-Lieutenant, has a salary of £20,000 a year which, he was rich and wealthy, he reduced to £20,000, and he spent in addition to that, upwards of £100,000 a year. This is the sort of thing the Dublin shippers require, and as English taxpayers have to contribute towards the expenditure of a "great court," it will be difficult to persuade the Irish that the Viceroyalty is not a beneficial institution. Moreover, the necessary expenses, clerks, and the whole of the staff at Dublin Castle, and that very pleasant lodge at Frogmore, cost considerably more than £100,000 a year. The best thing that could be done would be for Princes Alfred to take the situation.
