



POSTAL RECULATIONS.

LETTER RATES.—Unregiscered Letters posted in Canada, addressed to any place within the Dominion, pass, if prepaid, for 3 cents per half-ounce, but if posted unpaid, are charged c cents per half-ounce On letters to Prince Edward's Island, the rate is 3 cents per half-ounce if prepaid : 5 cents if unpaid. The rates on letters to the United Kingdom will be :-By Canadian Packet, 6 cents per half-ounce. By Canadi Packet, 5 cents per half-ounce, advancing by one rate for each *half-*ounce. Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 3:1, sterling in addi-tion to the deficient postage on delivery in England. The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the first packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the letter bear a special direction, " By Canadian Packet" or " By British Packet," and in that case they are kept over for the packet designated. " By Canadian Mail" is not a distinctive superscription; for any mail for Canada is a " Canadian Mail," by whatever packet forwarded.

REGISTRATION CHARGES .- For registration of a letter addressed to any place in British North America, the charge is a cents.

charge is a cents. For the registration of a letter to the United Kingdom, S cents. For the registration of a letter to the United States, 5 cents. France, and other countries for which letters pass through Prance, special rates according to weight.

No letter can be forwarded as registered, unless postage and registration fee are both prepaid.

MISCHLANKOUS CHANGES.--The charge on parcels, by Parcel-post, to any place in Canada, is 12 cants per half-pound, (with 5 cents additional if registered.) No parcel must exceed *Jour* pounds in weight. • One cent per ounce, payable in advance by postage stamp, is the rate on printed eirculars, prices current, hand-bills, and other printed matter of a like character, and on boys, bound or unbound, when posted at a

Canadian Post Office, addressed to any place in Canada, British North America generally, or the United States,

The charges upon prices-current, when addressed to the United Kingdom, is a cents each, and must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Correspondence for Brish Columbia and Manitoba is sent in closed mails, via the United States, at the same rate of postage as to other parts of the Bominion-


