On a stretcher in the undertaking establishment of R. W. Hemphill, corner Yonge and Bay streets, the body of an industrial hero who lost his life at an early hour this morning was being prepared for burial.

About 1 o'clock the alarm was sounded for a fire in the patent rubber coverage of William Knowles, No. 5 Malind-street, northeast corner Yonge. When the brigade arrived the whole top flat was in flames.

At 10 minutes past one o'clock Policeman Dwyer was passing his beat on Yonge-street, when he noticed flames issuing from the windows of a store on the northeast corner of Yonge and Malind-street.

Mr. Dwyer's attention was attracted by the alarm and in a few moments the fire brigade was on the spot. The fire was in a room on the first floor, occupied by Mr. William Knowles, a painter and decorator.

To facilitate matters a hatchway was opened and the men started to sweep the water down through the floor and hurried down to his assistance, but it was at once seen that his injuries were fatal.

They picked him up and summoned medical assistance, but the unfortunate man only lived about half an hour and never spoke.
