Tait, Davies, and the other members of the House, were present during the interview.

The deputation was introduced to the members of the Government by Dr. Robertson. Mr. Buchanan placed the wishes of the Grand Council before the members of the Government. Now is the accepted time. The Government was informed that the order had been passed in 10 years in which its membership is 15,000, and that they were highly satisfied with the position taken by the Administration with regard to prohibition. But, as the members of the House, were present during the interview, they wished to have certain changes made during the present session in the license law. They formulated their demands as follows: 1. That every license should be regarded as a privilege, and that the number of licenses should be limited to the population of the municipality. 2. That consumption of liquor upon the licensed premises should be prohibited. 3. That licenses shall not be granted in greater proportion than two for the first thousand of population, and one license for each additional eight hundred of population.
