

#### OUR ANNIVERSARY.

HE Twentieth Anniversary of the Association was held on Tuesday evening last. Everything so far as weather was concerned would have led us to look for a very small audience. The attendance, however, was large, and much interest was aroused by the addresses given by our worthy President, Hon. S. H. Blake, Mr. Caldecott, chairman of Finance Committee, and Rev Dr. Vincent. Our space will not admit of even a fair synopsis of these addresses. Mr. Blake spoke of the marvellous growth of these institutions in all parts of the world; of the vast amount of good being accomplished through their agency, and closed by reviewing the work of the Toronto Association during the past year, remarking that never before in its history had there been gathered round the building such an efficient staff of earnest workers. He read extracts from letters received during the past few weeks, shewing how from England, Ireland, Scotland, and cities in the United States, our Association had been appealed to for aid in looking up and caring for young men.

Mr. Caldecott spoke of the need for increased contributions to carry on the work efficiently. He thought we should have, 1st, a very large addition to the membership roll; and, 2nd, that at least 500 Sustaining Members at \$5 per year

should be secured.
