PANELS ESTABLISHED UNDER CHAPTER 19
OF THE FREE TRADE AGREEMENT

International Trade Minister John C. Crosbie announced today the appointment of the Canadian panelists for three cases under the dispute settlement procedures of chapter 19 of the Canada-U.S. Free Trade Agreement.

Donald Brown and Michael Flavell will serve as Canadian panelists on a panel to review the margin of dumping on a U.S. Department of Commerce administrative review decision respecting replacement parts for self-propelled bituminous paving equipment. The United States panelists will be William Alberger, Thomas Graham and Theodore Kassinger. This panel will also review the scope of an anti-dumping administrative review decision on the same subject. The request for panel review was made by Allatt Paving Equipment Division of Ingersoll-Rand Canada Inc.

John Coyne, John Richard and Gilbert Winham will serve as Canadian panelists on a panel to review the margin of dumping on a U.S. Department of Commerce administrative review respecting dried heavy salted codfish. The United States panelists will be John Greenwald and Donald deKieffer. The request for panel review was made by the Canadian Saltfish Corporation.

Robert Pitt and Margaret Prentis will serve as the Canadian panelists on a panel to review a final determination of dumping and subsidizing made by the Deputy Minister of National Revenue on polyphase induction motors imported from the United States. The United States panelists will be William Davey, Joseph Pattison and Diane Wood. The request for panel review was made by Toshiba International Corporation of Houston, Texas.

Under chapter 19 of the Free Trade Agreement, judicial review of final determinations by domestic courts in countervailing and antidumping duty cases may be replaced, at the request of the interested party, by a review by five-member panels comprised of Canadians and Americans. Prior to the Free Trade Agreement, these cases could have been reviewed judicially by the domestic court in the appropriate country. Findings of the panels are binding. The panels are to make their decisions within 315 days of the request for panel review.
