VANCOUVER



Vancouver B. C., the natural doorway of the Dominion to the West, is a city of many charms, and great possibilities. It is situated on a peninsula and almost entirely surrounded by salt water. Its land locked harbor, one of the finest in the world its glorious scenery and equable climate, are nature's gifts, and are second to none. The city fronts on Burrard Inlet, and extends across a strip of land to English Bay, along the shore of which it is now reaching out. The situation is most perfect as regards picturesqueness, natural drainage, harbor facilities and commercial advantages. It has already extensive wharves and warehouses, many hotels, churches, schools, etc. It has many buildings of brick and granite, and some of its private residences would do credit to cities of a century's growth. It has many miles of asphalt streets, and is lighted both by gas and by electricity. An ample supply of pure water is provided by means of pipes laid under the inlet from a mountain stream opposite. is a regular steamship service to Victoria, Nanaimo and San Francisco, to China and Japan, to Sydney, N.S.W., via Honolulu, H.I., Suva, Fiji, and Brisbane, Qd., and to Puget Sound and Alaskan ports.

The country south, towards the Fraser, has fine farms, and is especially adapted to fruit growing. The coal supply comes from Nanaimo, directly across the Straits of Georgia, and almost within sight. The scenery all about is magnificent—the Cascade Mountains near at hand at the north; the mountains of Vancouver Island across the water at the west, the Olympics at the south-west; and Mount Baker looming up at the south-east. Stanley Park is a magnificent public pleasure resort, and a visit to Capilano Canon, a remarkable mountain cleft, across the inlet, is a delightful outing. Opportunities for sport are unlimited at no great distance—mountain goats, bear and deer in the hills along the inlet; trout-fishing in the mountain streams; and sea-fishing in endless variety. A stay of a week here will be well rewarded.

A FEW FACTS.

Great Mills.—Where the gigantic trees are sawn into timbers and lumber. Most modern up-to-date plants; not excelled anywhere,

Water Works.—Very unique and admirable system. Water piped an immense distance from up the Capilano down under the salt water inlet into the reservoir in Stanley Park.

Docks and Wharves.—where are seen the Empress and Australian liners, Alaskan steamers, sailing ships that come around the Horn from Europe, and lumber freighters to and from South America and Trans-Pacific ports.

Assay Office.—The Dominion Government recognizing the importance of Vancouver as a great mining centre, has here the only assay office in Canada. Visitors are not debarred from observing the process of treating the precious metals.

Marine Railways.—Vancouver in the near future will have a monster dry dock, but at present the marine railways are of

Salmon Canneries.—Eight miles distant on the Fraser, running at full swing during July and August.

Ship Yards.—The industry of ship building is making good headway in Vancouver. It is expected that some very large keels will be in the stocks this year.

The building permits for eight months ending Aug. 31st, 1905, have averaged monthly \$200,000.

The salmon pack for 1905 will reach 750,000 cases.

Vancouver is the largest city in British Columbia. Population in 1886 was 1,009, in 1905—45,000.

Vancouver has the best paved streets, water and sewerage system in the west.

Vancouver has fully 20 miles of street railway within the city limits.

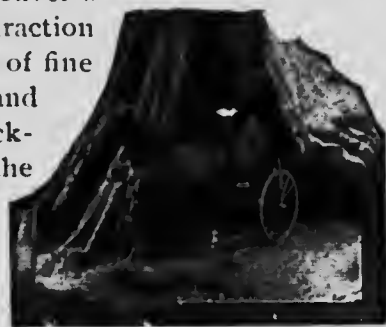

furnished at a moderate fee, a tobaggan slide has been built, and a float placed some distance from the shore. For the safety of children and the benefit of those learning to swim, the city engages a competent instructor, who attends during the entire season. Owing to the enclosure of the Bay, the water is warmer for a longer period during the summer than at any other place north of San Francisco. The weather is all that can be desired, and each successive week of the midsummer months sees no variation in the salubrious climate. Boating is one of the pleasures sought at English Bay. From there can be made many trips of interest,—to the cannery, to the campers' ground at Greer's Beech, to logging camps along the shore, and to the lighthouse at Point Atkinson.

Pavilions have been erected in which hops, concerts and other social functions are held nightly during the summer months. The whole scene along the shore of the Bay is one of beauty. Apart from the material advantages to be obtained, it is a delightful place to visit, with its delicious coolness, invigorating breezes and pleasant environment.

Take Robson or Davie Street car going west.

Anglers can leave Vancouver for a day's fishing by C. P. R. train from depot for Coquitlam (Westminster Junction), Lillooet River (Haney) and Stave River, (Ruskin), on trains leaving Van-



couver at 7.10 a. m. and 8.00 a.m., returning arrive at Vancouver at 7.25 p. m. and 8.43 p. m. Any of the above points can be reached inside of two hours from Vancouver.

ball are not uncommon visitors to these waters, while Mallard, Teal and Black Ducks, usually regarded as very good eating, are found virtually everywhere.

Snipe and plover shooting on Lulu Island is often very good, and wood-cock are occasionally bagged.

For the sportsman who prefers to walk dryshod through the woods or on the skid roads, grouse and pheasant shooting is capital sport.

It must be admitted that immediately close to the city the birds are not very plentiful, but after one gets out a bit, they can be "put up" almost anywhere.

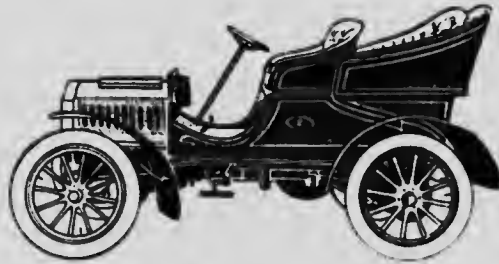

A picture of North Vancouver of today and one of a couple of years hence would be hard to imagine, but there is no doubt that it will suit the most enthusiastic commuter in every respect.

Besides its many commercial advantages, North Vancouver has many beautiful places to attract the tourist or party who wishes to spend a few hours, days or weeks away from the hurry and bustle of city life. During the summer season Band Concerts, Moonlight Excursions, Picnics, Dances, Tally-Ho Rides up the Canyon, and numerous other attractions tend to make it the summer garden of this district.

Take North Vancouver Ferry at the foot of Carrall Street. The North Vancouver Hotel is complete in all its details, and affords the visitor every convenience. Carriages can be secured at Hotel for large or small parties.

CAPILANO CANYON.

A beautiful trip with magnificent scenery. Swing Bridge, 190 feet over Canyon. In a few minutes we are on to the Keith Road, which leads up to the beautiful Capilano River, and then there is a walk and climb of such interest and indescribable grandeur that it is well worth crossing the continent to take.

The Keith Road, running more or less parallel with the Inlet all the way from the Lighthouse to the North Arm, a distance of about fifteen miles, is a highway of rare interest to one unaccustomed to sweet solitude away from the haunts of men. If the visitor fancies camping with a small outfit or merely a day's picnicing in the wilds, no better ground could be found, many parts of which are to be reached either by water or the road.

INDIAN VILLAGE.

About one-half mile from North Vancouver, is an interesting settlement of aborigines. Here you can see the red man of the forest in his real native haunts, and talk with him in his cabin, wigwam or council chamber.

TRIP UP GROUSE MOUNTAIN.

The Tourist Association's pony trail affords a magnificent panoramic view of the City and surrounding country. Horses can be secured at hotel.
