MEMBERS OF THE UNIVERSITY COMMISSION REPORT OF UNIVERSITY COMMISSION CREATES A NEW BOARD OF THIRTEEN APPOINTED MEMBERS TO GIVE GOVERNORS FULL CONTROL

Bill, Prepared For Sanction of the Legislature, Provides For Passing Over of Powers of Control Now Exercised by Crown to Board of Governors—Senate to Remain Practically As It Is—Council of Faculty of Arts to Arrange Courses of Study—Enforcement of Discipline Placed With a Special Committee.

THE SENATE. The composition of the senate has been altered to some extent, and its powers and duties revised and extended, but it remains substantially as it now exists.

ENFORCING DISCIPLINE. Enforcement of discipline is placed in the hands of the Caput, a committee composed of the president of the university, the principal of University College, the heads of the federated universities and colleges, and the deans of the faculties of the university.

REVENUE. It is understood that the government have in contemplation the setting apart of certain areas of crown land as part of the endowment of the university, and as a further provision to pay to the board a percentage of the receipts coming from the provincial succession duties.

President To Be Chief Executive Officer Finest of Powers Conferred upon Him

WHY COMMISSION WAS APPOINTED. The commission, which has been at work since the beginning of last October, was composed of J. W. Flavelle, managing director of the Wm. Davies Co., chairman of the board of trustees of the General Hospital; Professor Goldwin Smith, Sir Wm. R. Meredith, chancellor of the university; Byron E. Walker, a member of the board of trustees of the university, and general manager of the Canadian Bank of Commerce; Rev. Canon C. J. Coady, principal of St. Andrew's College, and A. H. U. Colquhoun, the new deputy minister of education, and secretary of the commission.

Control of Staff. The board will also have power to provide for the retirement and superannuation of any of the officers or teaching staff. It can hold and maintain all real property necessary for the use of any college established in the province, and can erect and maintain such buildings and structures as are necessary for the government and control of the students.

1100 DIE IN MINE HORROR Rescuers Also Succumb

Steamer Ramm'd by Ice Crew Take to the Boats

Marine Disaster Off Cape Breton—One Life Lost—Others Narrowly Escape.

Halifax, March 11.—(Special)—The steamer Baines Hawkins, bound for about 3 o'clock Saturday morning about two miles off south head of Morien Bay, C. B. The officers and crew, numbering twelve, all reached shore but one, Cockswain Bowditch. Nothing has been heard of him since, and there is still some slight chance that he may reach shore.

It was then deemed risky to remain longer on the steamer and two boats were put out on Saturday morning. Bowditch came on behind in a smaller boat with some of the men's effects. The men battled for life in the raging seas. Finally, just before two o'clock this afternoon, they arrived off Long Beach, two miles below Port Morien. The Baines Hawkins sank within ten minutes after the crew left her. She was a steel steamer of 485 tons, registered tonnage 485 tons, built in England by the Harland & Wolff Steamship Company, and was built in 1881. She was insured for \$20,000.

CHANCELLOR MEREDITH. COAL OPERATORS REFUSE AS RENEWAL AGREEMENT Mine Owners Get Answer

Information Pouring in Public Fully Interested

Rearrangement of Wages Impossible Without Putting Up Coal Prices and This the Bosses Decline to Do—Will Maintain "Open Shop."

New York, March 11.—The propositions of the United Mine Workers of America for a readjustment of wages and conditions in the anthracite coal fields as a whole, have been denied by the committee representing the anthracite operators.

Insurance Commission Will Hold Sessions in Both Toronto and Montreal.

Ottawa, March 11.—Public interest in the forthcoming investigation respecting life insurance is indicated by the volume of correspondence being received by Henry T. Ross, secretary to the commission.

Announcement of the anthracite operators' decision and the miners' formal statement. In every instance the contention is made by the miners that conditions in the coal fields do not warrant the changes proposed by the miners, and that conditions there already have been passed upon by the strike commission.

The demand of the miners, that the operators enter into an agreement with the union is declined by the ground that anthracite operators stand unalterably for the open shop, and again decline to make an agreement with the United Mine Workers of America, an organization controlled by a rival industry.

The demand for an eight-hour day, the statement says the operators know of no change in conditions that can be used to justify the renewed demand for a reduction in hours, and adds: "We might justly say that with the experience of the past three years, the ten-hour day should be restored."

"We cannot increase wages without raising the price of coal, and we are not willing to advance the price of coal," is the reply to the demand for a general increase in wages. The request that the operators shall collect from each employee certain stated sums for treatment as a matter of law is not permitted to be made.

Board is Good Enough. The operators decline to agree to any change in the board of conciliation as established by the anthracite strike commission, taking the ground that the system proposed by the miners would simply involve the creation of a series of minor boards whose decisions might be conflicting, and from which appeals would have to be taken.

President John Mitchell of the United Mine Workers of America, left today for Indianapolis, where he goes to prepare for the convention of the mine workers March 15. Mr. Mitchell declined to say anything regarding the reply of the operators refusing the demands of the miners. None of the other members of the miners' committee would talk.

Principal of University College Given Similar Control of His Institution—Students to Appoint a Permanent Committee.

By the University Act of 1901 the constitution of the university as now operative was established. It recast and harmonized the provisions of all previous statutes and established under the supreme authority of the crown in the person of the lieutenant-governor, three governing bodies with distinct powers and duties: (1) The trustees, consisting of the chancellor, the vice-chancellor and president of the university, the principal of University College, and five persons appointed by the lieutenant-governor in council.

The latter officers included the chancellor, elected by convocation; the vice-chancellor, by the senate, and the president and professors, by the lieutenant-governor. Convocation, composed of all graduates of the university or federated universities, through the faculties and colleges, elected 25 members of the senate, and as a whole discussed questions relating to the well-being of the university and its constituent colleges.

The board of trustees had the general supervision of the entire instructional work of the university and appointments were to be made on his recommendation. His control of the teaching staff was, however, defective, and the weakness of the present constitution on this side has been very apparent.

First Election of Chancellor and New Elective Members of the Senate To Be Held This Year—The Old and New Acts Compared.

To the new board is to be transferred the government control and management of the university and of University College, and it will be vested with all the powers which now are or may be exercised by the lieutenant-governor. Among these are: To make rules and regulations for the meetings of the board, and its committee; to appoint the president of the university, the principal of University College, the deans of all the faculties, the librarians, the bursar, the registrars of the university and of University College, the professors, teachers, instructors and all other officers and employees; to fix their salaries and assign them their duties—except in the case of the librarian. Unless otherwise provided officers are to be held during the pleasure of the board.

The board will also have power to provide for the retirement and superannuation of any of the officers or teaching staff. It can hold and maintain all real property necessary for the use of any college established in the province, and can erect and maintain such buildings and structures as are necessary for the government and control of the students.
