



Manhattan was affected by rumors of bond issues, and so forth. St. Paul January shows a loss of \$83,000 net, and furnishes a basis for the computation that in the seven months ending January 31 the company earned 41-3-per cent. on the common stock, against nearly 7 per cent. in the same period a year ago. Foreign exchange is dull at 4.87 to 4.87%. Treasury deficit in February was \$14,250,000. President Maxwell of Jersey and Lefigh & Wilkes-Barre, explains that the geport of the latter company covers a very unfavorable period in the coal trade, and asserts that at the present time it is earning its fixed charges.

CHICAGO GOSSIP.

Henry A. King & Co., 12 King-street east, received the following despatch to-day from Chicago:

Wheat opened at 74%c, and quickly declined to 74%c on selling by local speculators. The market later rallied to 75%c on stronger Liverpool cables. St. Louis again sent moderate buying orders. That point also sent a lot of crop damage reports, but the comment showed that the claim of crop injury is not seriously believed. So far as the present hard weather was advertised as a built card, it has been a failure. The reason is quite evident. It is too early. Wheat fields have not begun to green, and until then winter wheat is not to be scared at. Another thing, the big speculative interest at Chicago is now a little dormant. When the St. Louis clique attempts to lift prices before Chicago leaders are ready, they sit down and refuse to help. When Cudahy, Roach, Beam, Linn, Baker, Robson, Kent, Poole, Andrews, Wren and the other leaders get their crop reporters out a little later, and get ready for a "pulk all together," then crop news will count for something. San Francisco wires there were seven cargoes wheat loading for United Kingdom, one cargo for Cape Town, two cargoes flour for Australia. Many bad reports are coming from Northern Indiana, which indicate that the crop is almost a total failure. Minneapolis millers were again buying cash wheat at Ic over May. Market closed strong around top prices. We are friendly towards the long side of wheat, and advise its purchase. Primary receipts of wheat, 348,000, against 430,000. and shipments 164,000 bush, against 221,000. The English visible decreased 246,000 bush.
