A Fredericton despatch to The Times says:—

The announcement was made in the house this morning that prorogation would take place at four o'clock this afternoon. At 1.30 o'clock this afternoon Premier Clarke laid on the table of the house the report sof the Royal Commission on the charges made by L. A. Dugal, M.P.P., last session in connection with the Valley Railway and the Crown Lands.

As soon as the premier had submitted the reports J. L. White, Victoria, arose in his place and moved a long resolution, which was virtually a whitewashing for ex-Premier Flemming. The resolution, in brief, picked out those portions of the reports which were favorable to Mr. Flemming. The substance of the resolution was that the legislature agrees with the finding of the commission that Mr. Flemming was not guilty, as charged, in the crown timber

In connection with the Valley Railway charges the resolution mentioned, and laid emphasis upon, the fact that Mr. Flemming, when he received the \$2,000 from John Kennedy, accepted the money in a sealed packet and turned it over to the treasurer of the campaign fund without opening it. The resolution went on to say that this money was given by Mr. Kennedy before he had received his second contract and at a time when he had no idea that he would be seek-

ing a second contract.

The resolution was seconded by George P. Jones, of Kings, and without a word from any of the twenty-five members present, was passed unanimously rithout a dissenting vote.

Similar fears have, however, been several times expressed since the war began, and the Russians have developed the cheerful habit after a temporary check of coming back stronger than ever, and there will be many to believe that the like will occur at the present stage, despite the fact that some German successes are admitted in Petrograd. Today's news from that quarter is more encouraging. The Allies in the west are regaining some lost ground, but if mpst be admitted that they are everywhere met by a most vigorous resistance. Sir John Prench says that the poisonous gases used by the Germans is a very dangerous weapon, because those who are only partially affected by it suffer acutely and many of them die a painful and lingering death. By the use of such a weapon, and by the deliberate destruction of trading vessels and fishing craft, without giving those on board an opportunity to escape, even firing upon some of them when they have taken to the boats, the Germans give fresh evidence every day of their utter diargard for all the rules of cirilized warfare.







Immense Cost of War to Britain

Lloyd George, However, Does Not Need Any New Taxation at Present--Recruiting Announcement

London, May 4, 4.45 p. m.—In presenting the budget to the House of Commons today the Chancellor of the Exchequer, David Lloyd George, estimated that if the war lasted during the whole of the fiscal year Great Britain's expenditure in that time would be £1,136,434,000 (\$5,682,170,000).

Mr. Lloyd George said if the war should last six months instead of a year, Great Britain's estimated expenditures would be £790,458,000 (\$3,952,290,000).

He estimated that the total revenue for the year 1915-16 would be £270,182,-000 (\$1,350,910,000.) This is an increase of £43,638,000 (\$218,190,000) over the total of last year.

On the basis of a six months' war, he chancellor continued, expenditures for war, apart from advances to Allies of Great Britain, would rise to £2,100,000 daily, and the net deficit would be £514,346,000. On the basis of a twelve months' war the net deficit would be £862,332,000.

"That is the sum the country will have to raise in addition to the government's revenue during the course of the present year," he said.
