THE SCHOOL DEBT.

The school trustees of a Board which attends to its business carefully, promptly, some say in their outlays parsimoniously, without fee or reward, and had they not been so diligent in their duties, the school officials might not have been made.

The following table shows the amount the School Trustees asked of the Common Council for each year since 1872, and the amount actually received, and explains why it is that there has come to be so large a deficit in the accounts.

Here we have a difference of almost \$80,000 between the sum asked for on account of the schools and the sum received, a state of facts which really accounts for the present deficit.
