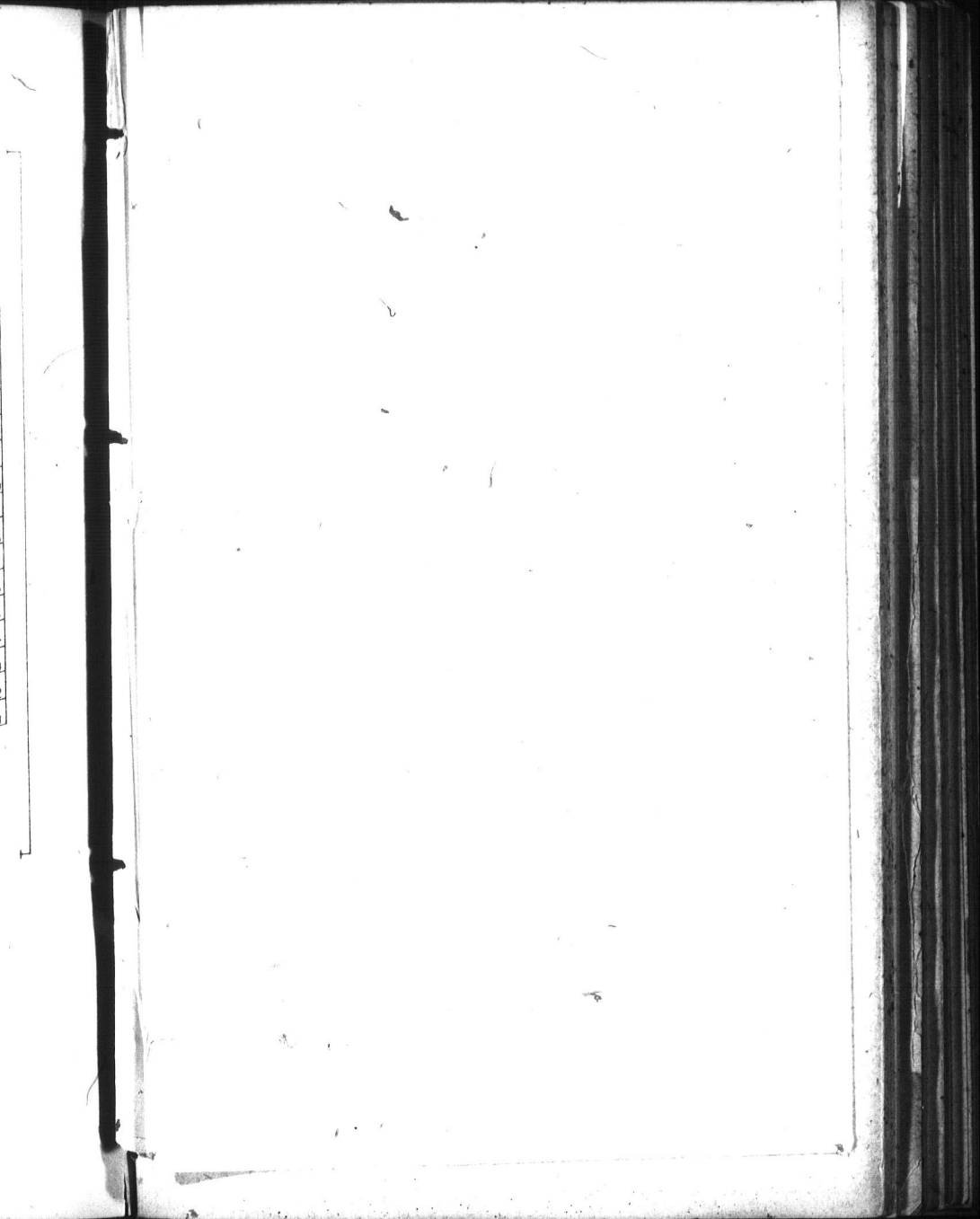

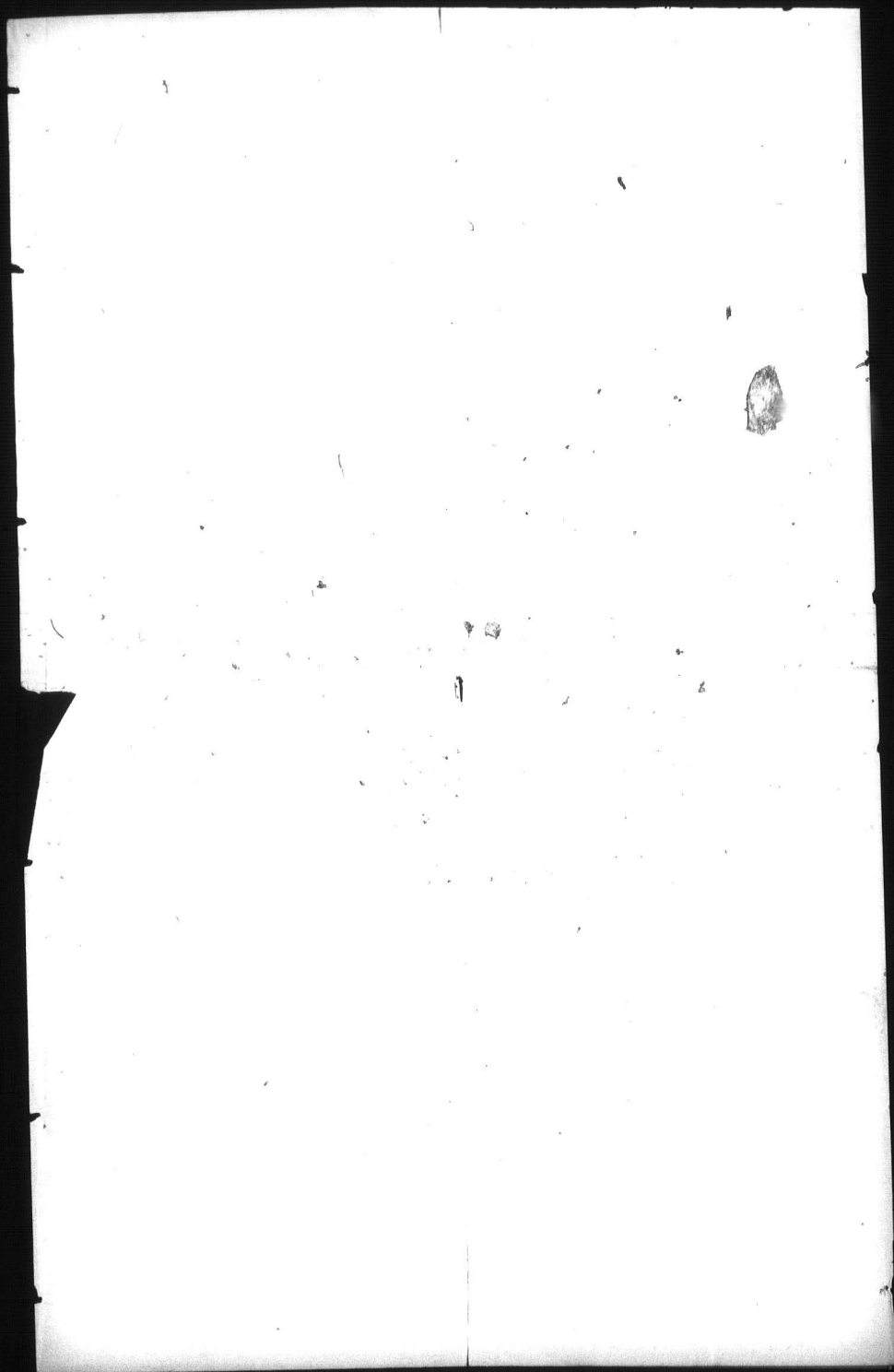

SESSION REPORT.

During the past year the Session have had much to encourage them in all departments of the work of the congregation. There have been one hundred and forty-five members added and ninety-five removed, eighteen being retired; leaving seven hundred and eighty now on the Roll. It is also pleasant to note that the financial increase has been even greater in proportion, so that those who have come more recently are not forgetful of the Mission schemes.

The session recognize with gratitude the progress in the Sabbath School. Truly we have cause to take courage and go forward. Perhaps never did more interest centre around this all important work than now. May He, who loves the children with His tenderest love, pour the Holy Spirit upon superintendent, teachers, office-bearers, and those earnest friends of the young, who are in every possible way seeking to provide more ample accommodation.

The Bible Class, under the faithful and able instructions of Mr. Parkinson, has made decided progress. The interest of the Class has not only increased in Missions, but has also manifested itself in benevolent work.

A further cause of thankfulness is a greater interest in Mission work. A new society, the Speedwell Band, was organized, and has made good progress.

Then the interest in the Y.P.S.C.E. has very considerably developed. May God bless abundantly this movement and hold it for His glory.

It is with special pleasure the Session have noticed a decided improvement in the service of praise, and it hoped that still greater efficiency and earnestness will mark this important part of the worship of God in our midst. "Let the people praise thee, Lord; let all the people thee praise."

BENEVOLENT WORK.—The Women's Association has rendered good service in a number of cases where affliction and trial had come; and at the same time were able to hand about \$50.00 to the Treasurer of the Building Fund.

We cannot close without a reference to J.S.C.E. Good fruit has already been gathered from this society's work. We

believe a number of our young people have been helped to decision for Christ by the services held in connection with this society.

In closing, there are two thoughts which we desire to mention.

The first is, in each branch of the work in College Street there has been decided increase.

The second thought is, we miss some earnest and gentle workers, who began the year with us. Loyal to all the calls to the Master's work, their hands were ever ready for deeds of goodness. No marble tablet marks within our church walls their departure, but within the inmost heart there are monuments more beautiful and enduring than Italy's whitest marble.

MANAGERS' REPORT.

In presenting their annual report, the Board of Managers gratefully acknowledge God's goodness in extending to them so large a share of His mercy and blessing during the past year.

The following amounts were received by the Treasurer:—
Open collections, \$1,054.12; offerings by envelope, \$4122.52; total \$5,176.64.

As compared with 1890, these figures show a total increase in the General Revenue of \$479.11.

An increase in offerings by envelope \$448.11, an increase in open collections, \$31.00.

The Treasurer of the Building Fund has received from all sources, over and above the amount required for interest \$287.06, which has been applied to the reduction of the debt.

The average amount by envelope and open collections per Sabbath was \$99.55, an increase over 1890 of \$9.21.

Including the Building Fund, the average contribution per member for the year was \$6.90

We have still to report great irregularity in the envelope system. Out of 780 members on the roll, the average number of envelopes per Sabbath was 198.

The Board beg to remind the Congregation of the step taken by them in the early part of the year 1890, namely, the amalgamation of the Building Fund with the General Revenue, and are glad to report that this has been more generally acted upon. It might again be stated that the plan is for each member contributing to the Building Fund to increase his or her weekly offering sufficient to make up the amount of the yearly contribution. For example, a member contributing \$10.00 per year would increase his weekly offering twenty cents.

The Managers have had under consideration for some time the advisability of re-arranging the debt on the church, in order to reduce the rate of interest, and, with this object in view, have been making careful inquiries through a committee, and find that a loan can be obtained at more advantageous terms, should the Congregation so desire.

In concluding their report, the Managers feel that we, as a Congregation, have every reason for thankfulness that the balance, though small, appears on the right side; and sincerely hope that the Congregation will continue to use the envelopes for the collection of their offerings to the Lord, and that those who have not yet done so, will adopt the envelope system, and that one and all will feel the need of more self-denial in obeying our Lord's commands when He said:—"Bring an offering and come into His courts." (Psalm 96 8). "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (1 Cor. 16 2).

REPORT OF BIBLE CLASS.

The *total collections* for the year from all sources was \$120.03. Of this \$26 was given to a needy family in the congregation—leaving a balance for the general collections for the year of \$94.03. Of this the collections of the last Sabbath of each month, amounting to \$20.07, go to the fund for the furnishing of a new class-room; the balance, —\$73.96, less expenses for printing during the year, \$6.40—\$67.56, goes to the different missionary schemes, at the class's request.

The *largest collection* was on December 6—\$4.90; the *smallest collection* was \$1.17, on the 27th September. The *average collection* for the forty-four Sundays that the class met was \$2.14 per Sabbath.

The LARGEST ATTENDANCE was on Sunday, April 12—96 present; this was repeated on April 19. The *smallest attendance* was on July 12—39 present. The *average attendance* for the forty-four Sabbaths was: male, 27; female, 38. The TOTAL ATTENDANCE for the year was 2800.

During the past year the work of this society has been greatly extended, principally by the efforts of the various committees. Through the instrumentality of the Look-Out Committee, 33 members have been added to the roll, making a membership of 79—2 honorary, 2 associate and 75 active, 5 of which have been transferred to other societies.

The society has not only added many others to its number, but has also shown a marked increase in zeal and earnestness in the Master's work, especially in the line of missions, due to a great extent to the work of the Missionary Committee.

The Devotional Committee, besides appointing leaders for the weekly prayer-meeting, have successfully conducted the Sabbath morning prayer-meeting, although there have been few in attendance. The members of the society have been much encouraged, by the presence of the older members of the congregation at our Sabbath evening services, and extend a hearty invitation to them to become honorary members. Not less important is the work of the Flower Committee, which has furnished bouquets for the pulpit, and after the services distributed them to the sick of the congregation, who received them with pleasure and thankfulness.

Another sphere of this society's work is undertaken by the Organ Committee, which is thankful for the hearty response to the collectors for the organ fund. (See report of committee in financial report.)

During the summer the society purchased for general use in the Church, 50 large and 50 small Moody & Sankey Gospel Hymn books.

After hearing the instructive and enthusiastic report of our delegate to the Canadian C. E. Convention, held at Peterborough in October, we were led to consecrate ourselves anew to the work, and endeavor to do more for our Heavenly Father, whom we have great reason to thank for His goodness in sparing and permitting us to do work in this part of His vineyard, and our prayer is that He would enable us more and more to act along the line of our motto, "For Christ and the Church."

REPORT OF THE JUNIOR SOCIETY OF CHRISTIAN ENDEAVOR.

As this society has only been in existence for eight months, we have not much to report. In the early part of the year some of the members of the Christian Endeavor Society thought it would be well to form a junior society, and after laying the matter before the Session it received their hearty approval; and after receiving the consent of the managers, a meeting was held of boys and girls from about eight to sixteen years old, when about forty were present. The pastor explained to them what the society was for; but it was thought well not to ask them to sign the pledge till they had come for a few meetings: after which, the pledge, which in substance is, Trusting in God, they promise to read the Bible every day, pray to Him, and lead a Christian life, when thirty-five stood up willing, to become members on these conditions — when prayer was offered commending them to His gracious Spirit's guidance, and that they on their part would abide in Him every day, so that they might continue in the good way they had started. Thus was commenced the boys' and girls' society, with our pastor as Honorary Superintendent; John Joss, Superintendent; John E. Rhind, President; Annie Durno, Secretary, and Annie McDonald, Treasurer; with Lookout and Missionary Committees. There are now forty-five pledged members, with an average attendance of about thirty. The meetings are conducted the same as the older society: a weekly topic and daily readings are given to each child, so that they may bring a verse bearing on the topic and read it at the meeting. Thus they almost carry on the meetings themselves, with a little guidance. An offering is taken up at the consecration meeting once a month, which has amounted to \$5.63; \$4 of this was voted to the missions of our church. Six of the girls have become members of the church during the year. We trust the coming year will see the larger boys and girls of the church, taking their true place as learners of the meek and lowly Jesus. What is to hinder two or three hundred boys and girls to come every Friday night from seven to eight o'clock? Simply nothing. If only we, as parents and teachers, recognize

SPEEDWELL MISSION BAND.

There had been a feeling for some time among a few girls in our Sabbath School classes, that they might have a mission band in connection with our church, as other girls were always telling us about mission bands in neighboring churches. To meet this want, two of our teachers asked their classes to meet with them, at 82 Lippincott Street, on Saturday, January 31, 1891, at three o'clock. The afternoon was wet, and only seven girls came. Though the meeting was small the spirit was large ; and it was decided to form a mission band and work for the Indians of the North-West and the children of India.

Officers elected were :—Honorary President, Mrs. Gilray ; President, Miss Jennie Rhind ; Vice-President, Miss Addie Grimason ; Secretary, Miss Jessie Melville ; Treasurer, Miss Katie McRae.

Meetings to be held every Saturday afternoon at 2:45. For the first few months our meetings were held at 57 Major street, after that in the schoolroom. Many suggestive names were thought of, but "Speedwell" was the name chosen for our mission band. Membership fee to be ten cents ; honorary members, twenty-five cents — that is, for any young girl or lady who cannot attend our meetings but are interested in our work.

In July, when the W.F.M.S. were sending away their box of clothing to the Indians of the North-West, we sent a quilt and a dozen nicely dressed dolls and a few more useful articles, to the Indian school at Kamsack; and we have received a very interesting letter from Mr. Laird, the missionary, telling us of his work and how pleased the children would be to receive them at Christmas.

Twenty-seven regular meetings have been held, with an average attendance of fifteen and an average collection of sixteen cents. We have forty members and twelve honorary members.

The main object of our mission band is to interest our members in the work in the foreign field, which we try to do by reading missionary letters and leaflets at our meetings; besides this, each member as they joined were given a talent (5c.) to increase and return. Forty talents were thus given away during the year; and when, at a special meeting, the members were called to give an account of their stewardship, over thirty talents were returned, increased to 27.29.

When we think of the many hours' work and the different ways this money was earned, we feel sure that the missionary spirit is present in our midst and that our Heavenly Father is blessing us. We know that it is but little that we can do at best; but when we think that even a cup of cold water given in the name of a disciple shall not lose its reward, we pray that we may be enabled to do far more this coming year to help in sending the Gospel to those in distant lands.

Before closing our report, we wish to thank the many kind friends who have helped and encouraged us in various ways, and we trust that many more may be led to lend us a helping hand.

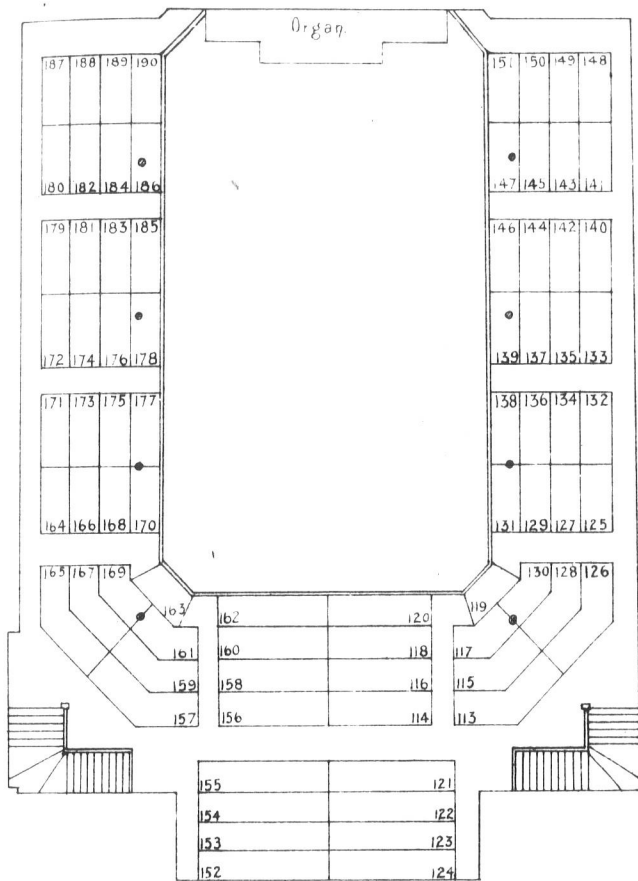
