The Bankers.—The annual general meeting of the Stockholders of the Bank of New Brunswick took place in the Park Building on Monday when a statement of the affairs of the institution was laid before the meeting. During the past year nine per cent. dividend has been declared, and there is a rest on hand of about £200,000. It is decided that the increase of the capital stock should take place at present, and the consideration of this question has been deferred for three months. The former Directors and Presidents were elected. No change was made in the salary of the President.

The annual general meeting of the Stockholders of the Canadian Bank took place on Tuesday, when the usual statement was laid before the meeting. During the past year eight per cent. dividend has been declared, and there is a rest on hand of nearly £200,000, after reducing the rest costs of the Bank to a marketable value and allowing for bad debts.

The salary of the President was raised from £1000 to £1200 by the Stockholders, and a sum was voted in aid of the Directors of Presidents.

Both Banks appear to be in a highly prosperous state, and we believe that the stockholders generally are much pleased with their management.—*Courier.*

On Wednesday afternoon, about four o'clock, the body of a female child about a month old was discovered in the snow on the ice near the Captain's House, St. John. It had evidently lain there a long time, the face being altogether gone, and the body much decayed. It was taken to the Dead House.—*Freeman.*

JANUARY.—Our files of Kingston papers are to the 12th inst., but they contain little to interest the general reader. The bill for the better government of the island, and for raising a revenue in support thereof, has received the assent of the Governor, and has been forwarded to the Home Department for ratification. It passed the Council by a majority of one. The members of the Council, however, voted 10 to 9 against it. A bill of 1000 dollars from the present session spent money endorsement which has existed for the last twelve months, and which has entailed upon the community so much general and individual disrepute.—*N. NEW YORK.—April 29.—The brave Napoleonines from Madras arrived this morning. She brings 125 passengers, who are all religious exiles to the colony after a long and dangerous voyage from India. Their transportation of 1000 dollars was paid out incidentally.
