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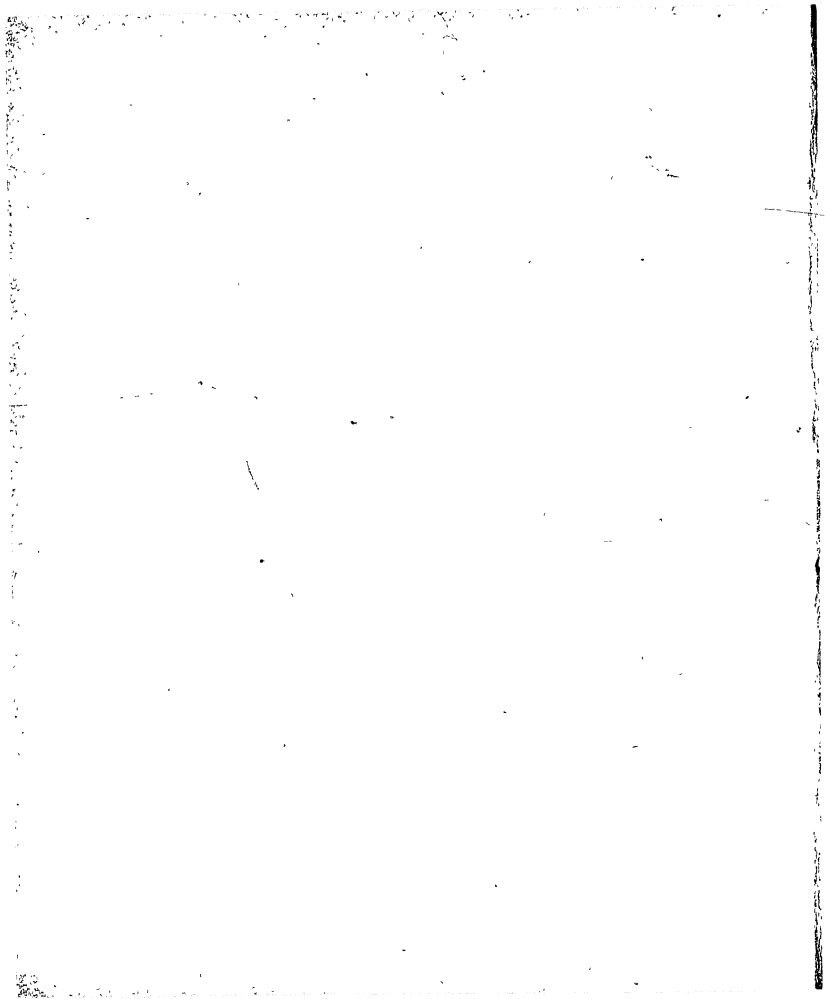

The preparatory and Intermediate courses lead to the Entrance Examinations

The "Harding Hall Course" proper is three years in length, on the completion of which a diploma is given.

Pupils are prepared for matriculation if required.

Particular emphasis is laid on English Composition throughout the school.

Classes in French Conversation.

During each term of the session students will have an opportunity to attend musical recitals, vocal and instrumental, and lectures by eminent literary or scientific teachers.

The "Athenaia," a literary and musical society conducted by the students, meets fortnightly.

The number of boarders is limited, and on this account they receive very careful supervision.

Strict attention is paid to health and deportment.

Each resident pupil should be supplied with waterproof, rubbers, umbrella, and strong walking shoes; also with bed-linen, blankets, white counterpane, and towels. If preferred the school will furnish the latter articles at a moderate charge.

All clothing should be *distinctly marked in full with the owner's name.*

The laundry service is limited to fifteen pieces. All starched pieces extra.

No deduction is made for absence from school, or withdrawal before the end of the term, except in the case of illness.

A reduction is made for pupils wishing to take only a limited number of subjects.

A discount of ten per cent. is made for Clergymen's daughters, and for sisters.

Plain sewing taught to boarders and junior pupils.
