

BRAUTIFUL BANDIT.

Her oper ations extended over a number of years, and were of the most daring description For a long time the authorities found it very difficult to trace or even to explain crimes which she committed, for no cted that a woman was the guilty person. No two of her robberies were committed in the same manner. Sometimes she was a passenger, and at other times she was with the bandits, and took

A perfect mistress of the art of dissimulation, and possessing a soft and insinuating manner, she had no difficulty in working herself into the good graces of travelers who did not look for a Mexican bandit under her attractive guise. In this way she easily discovered who had money and who had not. If she found a man who appeared to be of some consequence, but who did not have much money, she betrayed him into the hands of her confederates, who held him for a ransom. If her victim proved to be well supplied with cash, he usually met a violent death within twenty-four hours.



Ten feet of rubber belting is now in use for every foot of leather. Rubber is stronger, and transmits mor wer than leather, and has other points superiority. This cord is cut to project about a quarter of an inch from both sides of the belt; the heads are then imbedded in the rubber coating of the duck under pressure, the outer covering is applied, and the whole is vulcanized together. By this process the breaking of the stitches and consequent separation of the piles, so common in stitched or sewed belting, is overcome. Each rivet is independent and is kept in place by unyleiding head fastenings, so that they follow the stretch without changing position.
