THE CONVERSION OF THE ENGLISH DEBT.

To the Members of the Finance Committee,

GENTLEMEN,

The question now under your consideration is of such great importance that I deem it my duty to submit to you the following few remarks thereon.

This project of the conversion of the English debt is not new ; it dates from 1861. At the time I assumed the office of City Treasurer I studied attentively the financial condition of the city and I very soon became convinced that in the face of the obligations to be met every year, it was impossible with the existing revenue to carry on the municipal business with regularity and advantage.

It was absolutely necessary either to increase our revenue or diminish our expenses by every means in our power.

To increase the revenue was almost impossible. When it is a matter of expenditure, every one goes into it heartily ; but talk of increasing the revenue in proportion to these expenditures and it is quite another thing. Every one hesitates, holds back, and finally refuses. There is the source and the cause of all the misfortunes of the Corporation for a great many years.

It only remained then to find the means of reducing as much as possible not only the expenses of administration, of the Police, the Fire Brigade, the Markets, the Roads, but also and above all the heavy load of interest and sinking fund we have to pay every year. This was our only resource.

With this in view, I suggested in my report for 1880-81 different changes, and specially the project of the conversion of the English debt :—

Here is the project :—

The English debt is composed as follows :—

Due on the 1st January, 1892.....	£100,000	stg.
1st July, 1893.....	115,000	“
July, 1905.....	220,000	“
July, 1908.....	102,739.14.6	“
1st January, 1910.....	49,750	“
1st January, 1913.....	45,200	“

The total is therefore £632,689.14.6 stg. or \$3,079,090 and not \$3,402,167.63 as given by many who have written on the question and who have taken the present value of the debt for the debt itself.

The interest on these debentures is at 6 % with the exception of the last issue of £45,200, which is at 5 % interest.

The commission for the payment at London of the interest every six months, and of the principal when it becomes due, is $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

The amount paid every year for interest and commission is \$183,458.40.

Now if we consider as so many different debts all the amounts the Corporation has to pay every six months in interest, commission and capital, to the last which becomes due in 1913, and if we discount these several debts, or bring them to their present value, we find that the present value of all these sums is \$3,402,167.63. Therefore this is the amount we would have to pay if we could rid ourselves of it at once by borrowing at 5 %.

But if we cannot do it in this way, why should we not arrive at the same result with the aid of a powerful-monetary institution?

I proposed, therefore, to find in France or England an Institution which would charge itself with our obligations towards our English creditors and pay regularly for us the half-yearly interest, the commission and the capital when due (or before, if it finds a favorable opportunity, by mutual agreement and little by little of redeeming the debentures in England, but that has nothing to do with the project). In return, we would owe to this institution a new debt of \$3,402,167.63 which would be extinguished at the end of 60 years by means of annuities, and at the rate of 5 % sinking fund included.

It is plain that the obligations given by the Corporation could not be placed on the market. They would be good only for the institution which would charge itself with our debt, and they would lose their value from the moment this institution would cease to fulfil its engagements towards our English creditors.

The form of these obligations could be determined by mutual understanding.

They might, for instance, be 120, each of which would comprise the amount of half the annuity. Every half year, the institution would send us one of these 120 obligations or one of these 120 coupons, and we would send to Paris the amount of this half annuity.

The guarantee to be obtained, and of which so much is said, appears to me little needed. Every six months we send to London \$91,729.20 to pay the coupons coming due on the 1st January and 1st of July. Before remitting our letters of exchange to England do we exact of the *London and County Bank* and of the *Clydesdale Bank* guarantees that they will faithfully pay these coupons on presentation? That would be something new. Why then should we exact it of the *Comptoir d'Escompte*, since the amount we would remit it would be very nearly the same as that which we send to England every six months, and the *Comptoir d'Escompte* would only have to take this amount and send it to London for us?

Moreover, supposing we exact such a guarantee, it could only be for the sum of a half annuity and would be no longer necessary at the end of seven years, as at that time the Institution would have paid for us half a million of dollars, the first debt due in 1892.

In 1882, the Hon. Mr. Langelier drafted a bill and after great efforts, and a struggle which is still remembered, had it passed, by which the Corporation was authorized to make this transaction, the limited time being 65 years and the rate 6 1/2%. This was done with the view of allowing a large reduction in the rate by prolonging the annuities to 65 years, or of diminishing the time if we could pay as much as 6 1/2%.

I go into all these details in order that the transaction, which up to now appears to be little understood, may be fully comprehended, and that the press and all those who seriously busy themselves with municipal affairs may be enabled to study this important question.

The financial crisis which occurred in France at this date rendered this conversion altogether impossible.

Nevertheless, the idea was not abandoned. Mr. L. N. Carrier, of Levis, among others, who came many times to my office to be made conversant with the project in all its details, interested himself actively in it during his several voyages to Europe. A citizen of Quebec, who at the time crossed over to France, was requested too by the then Mayor, Mr. Brousseau, to occupy himself with this question and at the time of his returning to Canada, he delegated, I have been assured, to Mr. Wiallard his full powers and induced him to continue his work and his enquiries. This gentleman engaged in it with so much zeal that to-day he informs us that he has found one of the

strongest and most solid institutions of France, *Le Comptoir d'Escompte*, ready to take upon itself our English debt after this project.

But the rate demanded, $5\frac{1}{4}\%$ on the present value of our English debt \$3,402,167.63, seems to me really too high, and I must declare it at once unacceptable to the Corporation.

Indeed why does the Corporation seek this conversion of the English debt? Evidently with the double object of diminishing in a sensible manner the amount of interest and sinking fund to pay every year, and of avoiding a serious augmentation of taxes, having become obligatory, but which the difficult circumstances in which our population is placed, hardly permits us to exact. If the Corporation does not obtain these two advantages it is clear it would be wrong to bind itself thus for 60 years and give up every chance of seizing later on a really favourable opportunity.

I have said unacceptable and here is, why. According to the proposition made to us, £11,000 (instead of £11,070 13s. 9d., the exact amount at $5\frac{1}{4}\%$ on £694,075 10s. 10d.) we will have to pay in France every year \$199,533.33; we pay in England every year \$183,458.40. We must therefore pay \$16,074.93 more than we actually pay. Can we do this? Certainly no, since with our present revenue we pay with difficulty the \$183,458.40 interest.

To pay this additional \$16,000 we must of absolute necessity increase our revenue by so much. But if we increase the revenue \$16,000 to make the conversion at the rate proposed, why should we not take this amount for the sinking fund and charge ourselves with the work of extinguishing our debt in 60 years.

This amount of \$16,000 placed at 4 per cent either in the Savings Bank or in Federal, Local or Municipal bonds, would be more than sufficient to pay our debt in 60 years; \$13,000 even would suffice.

\$13,000 at 4 per cent in 60 years would give \$3,093,970.35
 \$16,000 at $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent in 60 years would give 3,144,270.9
 Would not that be better than the conversion on the proposed conditions?

A great many calculations have been made to prove that the offer made us is extremely advantageous, and that at the end of 60 years we would have gained a great deal by accepting to pay this annuity of \$199,533.33. To prove this they have unhappily started on a wrong basis; that is all. The following simple calculation clearly demonstrates it:—

We are asked to pay every year for 60 years	\$ 19,533.33
The interest we pay actually is	183,458.40

We have therefore to pay over and above every year	\$ 16,074.93

Now our debt is.....\$ 3,079,090.00
 Well, if we place \$16,000 every year, for 60 years, at 4 per cent, we will
 have at that date..... 3,807,852.87
 Say a sum of.....\$ 728,762.87

More than the amount of the actual debt.

If we can place it only at 3½ per cent we shall then have.....\$ 3,144,270.30
 or \$65,180.30 more than the same debt.

But as I am persuaded we could place it at 4 per cent, \$16,000 a year
 would be enough, and at the end of 60 years it would pay the whole
 debt and even more, or say.....\$ 3,018,880.32

We would gain therefore \$3,000 a year, or \$180,000 in 60 years plus the interest.

Another advantage which well merits consideration is that there is not a doubt
 but when our debentures become due it will be easy to renew them at 5 per cent for
 the balance of the 60 years, and we would thus save 1 per cent, which would diminish
 by so much the \$183,458.40 to be paid every year.

Moreover, and that certainly is something, and worthy our serious consideration,
 we would be free to take advantage of any good opportunity that may present itself
 later, and no doubt this occasion would arise between this and 1892, when the first of
 our debentures become due.

I know that it will be said:—

1. That the sinking fund is not regularly put aside as it should be.
2. That when this sinking fund is put aside it is badly invested.

To this I reply:—Why is the sinking fund not put aside? For the good reason
 that we have not a revenue which allows of making this reserve. Do people candidly
 believe that with a revenue varying from 400 to \$410,000.00 it is possible after
 having paid for interest.....\$255,000.00
 to set apart for sinking fund about..... 75,000.00
 330,000.00

which would leave only.....\$80,000.00
 for all the expenses of the administration of affairs, the payment of the Police, of the
 Fire Brigade, &c.

The present sinking fund is too high, for the English debt alone it is \$50,000.
 For, it must not be ignored, this sinking fund is not 1 per cent for all the debentures
 as some have written, there are debentures which bear 1½, 2, and even 2½ per cent.

However to conform to law this sinking fund was put aside for some years, but
 here is what happened. We put the sinking fund say \$73,000 to \$75,000 in reserve at
 3½ or 4 per cent.

But as there was nearly nothing left for general administration, viz., Police, Fire, Street and Market cleansing, we borrowed as large an amount, for which we paid from 7 to 8 per cent. The thing was so absurd that a law was passed by the present Mayor, the Honorable F. Langelier, which relieved the City Treasurer of the ridiculous obligation which was imposed upon him and by which we lost 4 per cent, at least.

Every intelligent man will understand that the accusation continually brought against the Corporation, for not reserving a sinking fund, falls of itself before the real impossibility of the Corporation to take that sinking fund from the revenue.

But if to accept the proposed offer we must absolutely increase our revenue, why should we not increase it equally so and provide ourselves for our sinking fund? This seems to me to be very simple. In that case the law which would allow this increase should specify that this increase should be altogether devoted to the sinking fund. We could even make a special tax for it, under the title of *Sinking Fund Tax* as is done for schools.

Now let us deal with the other accusation; the sinking fund is badly disposed of. Although I am completely opposed to the buying of bank stocks for the investment of our sinking fund, it seems to me that it is unjust to be too severe on what has been done in the past. We too easily forget that the time at which the bank stocks were bought by the Corporation with the sinking fund, general confidence was placed in these stocks, the dividends were magnificent and the stocks themselves were quoted at considerable premiums. Every body hastened to invest their savings, the result of their labor, in these stocks, which were at that time in great demand; and many of those who to-day criticise, very probably then applauded the investment, and in all sincerity. The Corporation followed their example and moreover was authorized to do so by law. Unfortunately a sad experience has shown to the Corporation the danger of such investments, and proved that these bank stocks, exposed as they are to rise and fall, and to the continuous fluctuations of the market, and sometimes to something worse, should never serve as an investment for our sinking fund. Besides, for a number of years there is no longer question of purchasing bank stock, the law is totally opposed to it and experience shows the danger of such investments.

I must add that the sinking fund, which was temporarily deposited in bank since I have been City Treasurer, has served to redeem the debentures which mature every six months; these debentures were nearly all at 7 per cent.

Here is the statement :—

As it is seen, the investment was good. The balance on hand will serve to pay a certain amount of debentures which mature on the 1st of January.

I will now call your serious attention to the following figures :

The annual amount asked by the *Comptoir d'Escompte* is..... \$199,533.33

This amount is to be divided as follows :

Is not this amount of \$20,000 a year for administration, commission, etc., really		

too high ? It is more than double what is necessary to extinguish our debt in 60 years, as \$1,266.11 at 5 0/10 would suffice.

I close those remarks by declaring that if I consider the conversion of the English debt at 5 0/10 or 5 1/10, and a small fraction as really advantageous to the Corporation, I firmly believe, on the other hand, that it is not advantageous on the conditions that are proposed to us, 5 3/4 0/10.

If then we cannot obtain a sensible reduction in the rate asked, I believe it would be better in the interest of the ratepayers and of the city to hold to the mode which I submit : Increase our revenue in such a way as to be able to reserve every year an amount varying from \$13,000 to \$16,000 ; deposit that amount in Federal, Local, or Municipal debentures ; renew our debentures at maturity for the number of years remaining on the 60 years ; in short keep our liberty and wait for a favorable occasion. If our future is now to be pledged without a great and important advantage we shall certainly have ground to regret it before long.

These are the remarks I have deemed it my duty to submit to you, convinced that they are in the interest of the city.

City Treasurer's Department.

To His Worship the Mayor, the Aldermen and Councillors of the City of Quebec,

GENTLEMEN,

My intention was to submit to you, without comment, my annual report for 1883-84.

To repeat the same thing year after year; to deplore certain irregularities without the hope of seeing them checked; to suggest, but always in vain, the only means of remedying a radical defect of our administration, becomes tiresome, both for him who makes those remarks and for them to whom they are addressed.

However, the question of the Conversion of the English debt having led me to speak of the financial condition of the Corporation, I deem it my duty once again by resuming what I have said in preceding reports, to direct your attention and that of the public to this difficult position.

The radical defect in our administration consists, in the considerable disproportion which exists for years between the revenue and the expenditure. This difference which naturally tends to increase on account of the additional interest that it requires every year, will very soon become a real danger which we shall then have to face, however formidable it may have become. We cannot always hesitate and postpone. A moment comes when hesitation can no longer be indulged in and, cost what it may, a remedy has to be applied to the evil, though this remedy be of the most violent nature. Why not see to it at once.

What are the causes of this difference between the receipts and disbursements?

Evidently the smallness of our revenues, but also the large amount taken every year out of this revenue for interest and sinking fund. After the interest and sinking

fund have been provided for there is really not enough left for the general requirements of the departments, and notwithstanding, those departments should not exceed the appropriations placed at their credit at the beginning of each fiscal year.

The custom with the majority of the committees of acting otherwise is not only illegal, but leads to grave embarrassment. This is what formerly placed the Corporation in such a deplorable plight, and what will inevitably recur very soon if not guarded against.

I most certainly do not mean to say that there is any extravagance; far from it. The ameliorations being carried out are all useful, necessary, and executed, I believe, with economy, but are means taken to pay the cost of them? There is the whole question.

The Corporation is just now laying down a new water pipe at the cost of half a million of dollars. This was necessary, indispensable, and had to be done at any cost, it is admitted. But the interest on the cost of this amelioration, sinking fund included, is thirty thousand dollars a year and the augmentation in the water revenue (12½ cts. in the \$ in place of 10 cents) will give but twenty thousand dollars. Whence shall we take the \$10,000 that are wanting? Does this cost us a thought?

At the beginning of the fiscal year the Road Committee receives some \$30,000 for its expenses during the year, the Committee spends from 50 to \$60,000, where are we to get the difference? I admit that the Committee does not get enough, but in fact the Council cannot vote more, obliged, as it is, to stick to the law, and base its credits or appropriations on the revenue of the preceding year, the Committee should rest satisfied with its appropriation or see that steps be taken to increase the revenue.

So with the other departments.

All these annual deficits in most of the departments create, it is evident, a floating debt and will very soon render our position, which is yet good, a very precarious one.

At my entry to the Corporation, in 1872, a floating debt of half a million of dollars, consisting of notes overdue for which we paid 7 to 8 (7) interest, paralyzed all progress and had destroyed the credit of the Corporation. The Legislature helped fortunately to regulate this position by authorizing debentures to be issued. Since, it is useless to conceal it, we have been able to avoid a new floating debt and meet the deficits, thanks only to extraordinary resources. The sale of the Palais gave us \$143,000, the Tasmanian debentures \$43,000, say \$186,000, this is what has saved the position and prevented the floating debt for a certain number of years. These resources are now exhausted and we must look elsewhere without delay.

What is to be done?

Increase the revenue on the one hand, and diminish the expenses on the other, particularly for interest and sinking fund.

Last year, the Mayor, backed by the Council, made a bold effort to change our old and superannuated system of taxation and replace it by a rational system, everywhere adopted, and which would enable the Corporation to augment its revenue and work energetically for the future of Quebec. But in face of a relentless opposition which not only resisted every amendment but was even on the point of carrying a curtailment of the powers already possessed by the Corporation, the bill had to be withdrawn.

Certainly this was a check to be regretted; but does it follow that we must be discouraged and abandon all hope of obtaining justice for the Corporation?

By no means.

What should be done first of all is to force every one to realize the position. To do that, let every amelioration be suspended; let us attend strictly to the indispensable requirements and holding to the law; under no pretext exceed the appropriations voted, however insufficient they be. Perhaps then those who are constantly asking for improvements, who at every moment worry the council with their exactions, who would disburse right and left while withholding from the Council the power of raising the necessary funds, would, at last, understand that works cannot be executed without funds, and they would come to the assistance of the Council; for whoever desires a work should provide the ways and means.

Certainly I am not and have never been an advocate of increasing the taxes, but, I maintain that the city should honor its obligations, pay for all works undertaken and not be continually at the mercy of money lenders.

But how will the Corporation succeed in restoring an equilibrium in our finances, in putting a stop to deficits at the close of each year? Here are some of the means.

AUGMENTATION OF THE REVENUE

1° TAX ON IMMOVABLE PROPERTY.—Change our system of valuation and levy our assessments on the real or market value, and not on the letting value, of the properties. This is what is done everywhere, except at Quebec which really seems condemned to be, in all respects, an exceptional city.

2° TAX ON MOVEABLE PROPERTY.—Abolish the 12½ cents or business tax and replace it by a tax on the value of moveable or personal property, as is done in the United States, in Ontario, &c., &c. I have already treated this question in my previous reports, particularly that of 1891-92. I know that I touch a delicate, not to say a burning question, but in fine if we want to increase our revenue we must apply in some slight way to those who have the means.

We should modify the law that forbids expending more than the revenue of the preceding year and raise, by means of a tax not exceeding 1½% on the total value of moveable and immovable property, the revenue deemed necessary at the commencement of the fiscal year.

3° WATER WORKS.—What is called the *water rate* is not a tax, it is the price of a merchantable article which the Corporation has taken upon itself to sell to the tax-payers. It is then but just that the Corporation should sell this merchandise at such a price as will pay the interest on the cost of construction and the running expenses. It is also just that all those who profit by it, in one form or another, either for personal use, or protection against fire, or diminished insurance rates, should pay in proportion to the benefit conferred. There is a good deal to be done in this respect.

4° PROPERTIES EXEMPT FROM TAXATION.—The corporation should obtain some aid from those properties, either in the way of payment for water or otherwise. Our city is in a position altogether exceptional, in that respect. A fourth of the property is exempt from taxes.

Besides the properties of religious communities \$2,386,500 there is the Federal government \$2,074,000 and the local government \$976,000. Furthermore the latter adds to the municipal burthen by making us pay for :—

The Jail & Jury Fund.

The Jail Guard.

The Vagrants.

The Insane.

The Erection of a Court house.

Besides the loss of the tavern licenses which formerly were a source of good revenue.

CURTAILING THE EXPENDITURE.

5. CONVERSION OF THE ENGLISH DEBT.—It is indispensably necessary to convert the English debt in order to lessen in a perceptible manner the amount of interest and sinking fund paid every year, but this conversion must be effected at a rate barely exceeding 5 0/10, which I think possible. But if, contrary to my opinion, this cannot be done just now, we should, while waiting for a favorable opportunity, set aside only 13 to \$16,000 for sinking fund, as I suggest in my report on the Conversion of the English debt

With respect to this conversion of the English debt I ought to say that I have not one word nor one figure to retract or to change in the report I submitted to the Finance Committee, and which I now publish appended to these remarks. When the question shall be seriously discussed before the Finance Committee, I shall then, if invited, answer any objections that may be raised ; and that will be an easy matter.

6. THE QUEBEC DEBT.—Sell our bank shares little by little and as necessity demands, and with the proceeds redeem the debentures becoming due at Quebec every six months. The amount of our bank shares being almost equal to those debentures, we would have no longer to provide for a sinking fund.

7. PERMANENT DEBENTURES.—Redeem our permanent debentures by paying a reasonable premium. If they could not be redeemed this way, get a law passed through the Legislature converting them into terminable debentures bearing the same rate of interest and redeemable in 20 or 30 years.

I shall again say that in general there is too much of a disposition to vote for issuing debentures without providing for the payment of the interest and the sinking fund. Each time an important amelioration or a large subscription to some great enterprise is demanded, the taxpayers should be consulted and informed, before any debentures are issued, that there will be an additional tax of so much in the dollar to pay.

In conclusion I should say that some of my remarks may be found inopportune, but I consider it my duty to point out clearly the dangers of the position, so that they be guarded against.

REPORT OF THE CITY AUDITOR.

To His Worship the Mayor, the Aldermen and Councillors of
the City of Quebec.

GENTLEMEN,

I have the honor to report that I have examined and checked the Books, Vouchers and Accounts of the Corporation, Water Works, Bailiff's Department and Recorder's Court, for the Civil Year ending 30th April 1884, and have found the same to be correct, with the exception of those errors in calculations, &c., discovered in some of the Assessment Books and the difference existing in the Ledgers of the Bailiff's Department, all of which were duly reported.

On the 30th April last, in the presence of the Chairman of the Finance Committee, I counted the Cash remaining in the custody of the City Treasurer, amounting to *Eleven thousand one hundred and forty six dollars and seventy three cents* (\$11,146.73) and have subsequently compared this sum with the Cash Book balance of that date and found it to be correct.

The Assessment and other auxiliary Books are kept regularly called over and checked with the Cash Book; I would here take the opportunity of recommending that the calculations, &c., as made by the Assessors should be checked carefully *before* their Books are received by the City Treasurer, as errors are found in some of the calculations, rates, &c., when calling over the payments during the year; in consequence claims have to be made when amounts have been short paid, and the money refunded in cases of over-payment, all this unpleasantness and labor might be avoided by having these Books properly checked over.

As required by the By-Law defining my duties as City Auditor, I have to report that none of the officers of the Corporation are at present under Bonds of Security or Guarantee of any kind.

There is a difference, as previously mentioned, of \$105.56 between the Ledgers of the Bailiff's Department and the amount at Credit in the City Treasurer's account; this error may have arisen from some amount which was received, but not applied to the account or accounts in the Bailiff's Ledgers; it was found on taking out a Balance Sheet last fall and duly reported at the time.
