THE DEPOSITORY AND THE OFFICE OF THE CHURCH SOCIETY OF THE DIOCESE OF TORONTO  
is at No. 8, Wellington Buildings, King Street, Toronto.

Benefactions from any persons, whether members or not, towards the Society's general objects, or to any particular branch of them, and all payments on the Society's account, will be received by remittances, or by payment at the Society's office, or by the Secretary or Treasurer of any of the District Branches.

It is requested that the Annual Accounts of District Branches, and a list of all members in their respective Districts, may be transmitted by or before the last day of March in each year.

Forms of Conveyance for securing the title of lands to the Bishop, the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, or the Incumbent or Rector of any particular living, may be obtained at the Society's house.

A general meeting of the Incorporated Members is held at three o'clock, p. m., on the second Wednesday in every month, August and September excepted.

The stated monthly meetings of the Standing Committee are held at three o'clock, p. m., on the first Wednesday in each month, August and September excepted. During Lent these meetings are held on the Thursday subsequent.

The Quarterly Collections to be made in the several churches, chapels, and stations are applicable to the following objects: General Purpose Fund, or any special object the Society may determine on, in the month of January; Students' Fund, in April; Mission Fund, in July; Widows and Orphans' Fund, in October.

# CONSTITUTION

OF THE .

## Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto;

INCORPORATED BY THE STATUTE OF CANADA, 7 VICTORIA, CAP. 68,  
FOR PROMOTING THE FOLLOWING OBJECTS:

**FIRST**—For the encouragement and support of Missionaries and Clergymen of the United Church of England and Ireland within the Diocese of Toronto, and for creating a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen, and towards making provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity, and for the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy of the said Church in the said Diocese.

**SECONDLY**—For the encouragement of Education, and for the Support of Day-schools and Sunday-schools in the said Diocese, in conformity with the principles of the said Church.

**THIRDLY**—For granting assistance, where it may be necessary, to those who may be preparing for the Ministry of the Gospel in the said Church, within the said Diocese.

**FOURTHLY**—For circulating in the said Diocese the Holy Scriptures, the Book of Common Prayer of the said Church, and such other Books and Tracts as shall be approved by the central Board or Managing Committee of the said Association.

**FIFTHLY**—For obtaining and granting aid towards the erection, endowment, and maintenance of Churches, according to the establishment of the said Church, in the said Diocese; the erection and maintenance of Parsonage houses; the setting apart of Burial-grounds and Church-yards; the endowment and support of Parsonages and Rectories, according to the same establishment, and the management of all matters relating to such endowment.

### I.

That before the Society shall enter upon any business at any of its meetings, the following Prayers shall be said:—

“Prevent us, O Lord, in all our doings, with Thy most gracious favour, and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy Holy Name, and finally by Thy mercy obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*”

"O God, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we beseech Thee to visit with Thy favour our Sovereign Queen VICTORIA, and so rule her heart, that she may in all things seek Thy honour and glory. Prosper with Thy blessing the designs of this Society. Comfort with Thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the Clergy; the endeavours of all who are engaged in spreading the knowledge of true religion in this Province, and the labours of those Missionaries who are promoting the same in foreign parts. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy glory, and the good of Thy Church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

"O MERCIFUL God, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that Thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner but rather that he should be converted and live, have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, infidels, and heretics, and also upon all those heathen nations upon which the light of Thy glorious Gospel hath not yet shone; especially the Indians of this continent. Bless the means used for their civilization and conversion, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word: and so fetch them home, blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. *Amen.*

"OUR FATHER, which art in heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil; for thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. *Amen.*"

#### AND WHEN BUSINESS IS ENDED.

"ALMIGHTY God, Father of all mercies, we thine unworthy servants do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all Thy goodness, and loving kindness, to us and to all men: more particularly for the providential support by which this Society hath been enabled to spread abroad the knowledge of Thy sacred truth. But above all for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy blessed Son; for the means of grace and for the hope of glory, which Thou hast given us, in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; to whom with Thee and the Holy Ghost be all honour and glory, world without end. *Amen.*

"The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Ghost, be with us all evermore. *Amen.*"

#### II.

That all those who are now, or who shall hereafter become Members of the Association, and who shall subscribe Ten Shillings annually to the Funds of the Society, or contribute as much as Five Pounds in one sum, shall be Associated Members of the Society, and shall be eligible to be Members of the Corporation.

#### III.

That every Incorporated Member subscribe not less than One Pound Five Shillings annually to the Funds of the Society, or contribute not less than Twelve Pounds Ten Shillings in one sum, or land to the value of twenty-five Pounds; and that the Standing Committee be empowered, with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation as Life Members, who shall have contributed through any of the Parochial Associations in connexion with the Society, in money, the sum of Twenty Pounds, or in land to the value of Thirty Pounds, for any of the following special purposes, viz.:—To be invested or held in trust for the Widows and Orphans' Fund; to

be invested or held in trust for the endowment of a Church or a Church-school; and that it shall be the duty of the Secretary at the Meeting in the month of October, in each and every year, to make a return of those who have not paid up the 25s. for the year ending the 30th day of April previous, and that such names shall be erased from the list of Incorporated Members.

## IV.

That the Corporation shall consist of the Bishop of Toronto for the time being, of the members appointed by the charter, and of so many of the other Associated Members of the Society as shall be elected by ballot Members of the Corporation, at the meetings to be from time to time holden on the days and at the place appointed by the By-laws of the Corporation, for its stated meetings. Provided always, that the whole number of members of the said Corporation, in addition to those who are made Members by the Statute, shall at no time exceed three hundred, and that the whole number of Members of the Corporation shall never be less than one hundred.

## V.

That the Standing Committee of the Society, to be appointed as provided in one of the following By-laws, be empowered, with the sanction of the President, to recommend persons, whether Associated Members or not, to be elected into the Corporation, without reference to the limitation of numbers.

## VI.

That the Lord Bishop of Toronto for the time being shall be President of the Society, and the Venerable the Archdeacons within the Diocese shall be Vice-Presidents.

## VII.

That the Society shall, at their Meeting on the second Wednesday in June in each year, choose one or more Vice-President or Vice-Presidents in addition to the Archdeacons; one or more Treasurer or Treasurers; two or more Auditors; one Secretary, and such other officers, ministers and servants as shall be thought convenient to serve in the said offices for the year ensuing. Provided always, that no person not a member of the Society shall be eligible to any office.

## VIII.

That the paid officers of the Society to be appointed by the foregoing rule, shall be a Secretary, and a subordinate officer to be selected by himself; that the former shall be in Holy Orders, uncharged with Parochial cure, and that he shall furnish security to the satisfaction of the Solicitor to the amount of £1000—himself in £500 and two sureties in £250 each. Also the Auditors.

## IX.

That the Standing Committee shall propose to the Board at the General Meeting in October, a list of seven Members of the Society, to form the Tract and Book Committee for the year ensuing; that at that meeting any member be at liberty to propose another list of seven members of the Society, instead of that proposed by the Standing Committee; and that the election of the Tract and Book Committee take place at the General Meeting in November.

## X.

That if it shall happen that any of the persons at any time chosen into any of the said offices shall die, or on any account be removed from such office at any time during the period for which he was elected or appointed to serve, in such case the President, or any one of the Vice-Presidents, shall convene a meeting, to be held at the usual place of meeting of the Society, at such time as shall be specified in the notice of such meeting; and that such members of the Corporation as shall be present at the meeting, or a majority of them, shall and may choose an officer or officers in

the room or place of such person or persons so dead or removed, as to them shall seem meet. Provided, that it shall not be necessary for any such meeting to be called for supplying a vacancy in the office of Vice-President: but the President may do so in his discretion.

## XI.

That the Society shall and may, on the second Wednesday in every month, excepting the months of August and September, for ever hereafter, and oftener if occasion require, meet at the place heretofore used for the transaction of the business of the said Society, or such other place as may be hereafter appointed for that purpose; and that the President or Standing Committee have power to call a Special Meeting of the said Society at any time. In Lent, the meetings to be holden on Thursday instead of Wednesday.

## XII.

That no act done in any meeting of the said Society shall be valid and effectual unless the President, or some one of the Vice-Presidents, shall be present at such Meeting.

## XIII.

And with regard to all meetings of the Society, and to the making, altering, or repealing any By-laws, Rules or Regulations at such Meetings, it is to be specially noticed, that by the Act of the Legislature incorporating the Society, (7 Vic., ch. 68,) it is enacted that no act done in such Assembly or meeting of the Corporation shall be valid or effectual, unless six persons of the Corporation, at the least, shall be present, and the major part of them consenting thereto.

And further, that no Constitution, By-law, Rule or Regulation of the Society, nor any abrogation, repeal, change or alteration of the same, shall be passed, except notice of such intention shall have been given at the previous monthly meeting, and then it shall not be of any force or effect until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, or administering, the Diocese for the time being, by writing under his hand.

## XIV.

That there shall be a Standing Committee (three of whom shall be a quorum,) to prepare business for the Monthly Meetings of the Society.

That the President, Vice-Presidents, Rural Deans and Secretary, be *ex officio* members of the Standing Committee.

That the other members of the Standing Committee, not exceeding twenty in number, shall be elected by the Society out of its Incorporated Members residing in the City of Toronto and its vicinity, also of a Clerical and Lay Member from each of the several District Branch Associations in connexion with the Parent Society, to be elected annually by such Branch Association.

That of the non-official Members of the Standing Committee residing in the City of Toronto and its vicinity, the four who, having been on the Standing Committee for one entire year, have attended the fewest meetings of the Standing Committee during the twelve months ending on the first Wednesday in March, shall go out at the Annual meeting in June; and if any doubt shall arise under this rule, which member of those who have attended the fewest meetings is to retire, then the one who has served the shortest time on the Committee shall be considered to have vacated his seat.

That the Standing Committee shall recommend to the Society at its Meeting in March in each year four Members to be elected in the place of the four retiring members, who shall not be eligible for the ensuing year.

That any member of the Society wishing to propose other candidates for election on the Standing Committee, be required to give in the names of such candidates to be proposed by him, at or before the Monthly Meeting in March.

## XV.

That Minutes of all the proceedings of the Society be taken, and that at each meeting of the Society the minutes of the preceding meeting be read by the Secretary, and signed by the Chairman.

## XVI.

That the accounts of the Society be closed on the thirtieth day of April in each year; and that the same be audited within one month from that date.

## XVII.

That the Secretary conduct the correspondence of the Society, take Minutes of the proceedings of the general Meetings and Committees, prepare the annual Report of the Society, attend meetings of the Branches throughout the Diocese under the direction of the President, and take the general superintendence of the affairs and accounts of the Society in all its departments.

## XVIII.

In connexion and correspondence with the Society, District Associations shall be established, comprising one or more Districts (as shall be approved by the President), the same to be composed of the Clergy resident within the bounds of the district, and all other Members who shall contribute in aid of the Society's Funds; the Archdeacon, or Senior Clergyman resident within its bounds, shall *ex officio* be Chairman of such District Branch Associations, with whom shall be associated, as composing a Committee of Management, all clergymen in the District, and one or more Laymen from each congregation which observes the constitution, rules and regulations of the Society, and from none others; the lay members to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the District Branch.

A General Meeting of each Branch District Association shall be held in each year, at any time and place which may be agreed upon at a previous Quarterly Meeting of the Committee of Management; and Quarterly Meetings of the Committee of Management—not less than five to form a quorum—shall be held for the transaction of the ordinary business of the Branch Association.

In order the more fully to carry out the objects of the Society, each parish, in the person of its Clergyman and Churchwardens, shall be a Sub-Association, in correspondence, through its Chairman (the Clergyman), with the District Branch Associations, and may be denominated, *The Parochial Committee of the Church Society*. The Committee shall meet so often, and at such periods, as they shall themselves decide to be most convenient, inviting the co-operation of all the Parishioners in their deliberations and designs. They shall collect subscriptions and donations from the members of the Church, in such manner as they shall deem most effective, and endeavour by every means in their power to augment the resources of the Society. All moneys raised to be transmitted to the treasurer of the District Association.

The Treasurer of each District Association shall transmit annually the full sum of £1 5s. for each duly recognised Clergyman, and also for each incorporated member within his district, and in case of life membership the full sum of £12 10s., together with one-fourth of all the moneys paid into his hands, to the Treasurer of the Society at Toronto, to be at the disposal of the Central Board, and the remaining three-fourths of such collections shall, when required, be expended within the Parish or District in which they have been made, for such objects only as are specified in the Constitution of the Society—the allotment to be made at the Quarterly Meetings of the District Branch Association. All moneys not required to be expended for local purposes, and remaining unappropriated at the General Annual Meeting of the District Associations, shall be forthwith transmitted to the Treasurer of the Society at Toronto.

The District Associations, through their respective Secretaries, shall communicate to the Secretary of the Parent Society at Toronto a minute Statement of all receipts and expenditures within the sphere of their operations, embodied in the form of a Report, one in each year, so soon as convenient after the General Annual meeting of such District Branch Associations.

## XIX.

That four Sermons be preached annually in the several Churches, Chapels, and Stations in this Diocese, in aid of the funds of the Society, at such times as the Lord Bishop shall appoint; that of these collections the proceeds of one shall be for the benefit of the Widows and Orphans of Clergymen deceased; of another, for the

maintenance of Travelling or Resident Missionaries in this Diocese; of another, to aid the Theological Students; and that the proceeds of the fourth shall be appropriated to any other objects embraced within its Constitution, as the Society may from time to time direct.

XX.

That no application for a grant, loan, or other assistance, be entertained from any Rectory, Incumbency or Mission, in which there shall not have been established a "Parochial Committee" of this Society under the provisions of the article of the Constitution thereof, reporting to and in communication with the Parent Society, and in which all the requirements of said Constitution shall not have been complied with, unless upon the omission of such requirement a special written dispensation shall have been obtained within three months of the date thereof; and further, that accompanying such application there be a distinct accurate description of the object towards which aid is sought, together with a detailed account of the sum of money collected in the locality or elsewhere towards the same object, and how applied: Provided nevertheless, that it shall be at all times competent for the President to recommend to the Standing Committee any case which in his Lordship's opinion may require special consideration; and should the Standing Committee report favourably thereon, that the Society may in such case grant the assistance so sought, or any portion thereof; and further, that no application be entertained from the Widow or Orphan or the guardian of the Orphan of any deceased Clergyman of this Diocese who shall not have conformed to the provisions and requirements of a certain By-law, entitled a "By-law for the due administration and improving the Widows and Orphans' Fund of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto," and also of any amendments to the said By-law, which may be enacted from time to time according to the provisions of the Constitution of the said Society, unless upon the omission of any of the said requirements a special written dispensation had been granted by his Lordship the President, and forwarded to the Secretary for registration within three months after the date thereof. Provided, nevertheless, that it shall be at all times competent for the President to recommend to the Standing Committee any case which in his Lordship's opinion may require special consideration, and should the Standing Committee report favourably thereon, that then the Society may grant such proportion of any annuity as to said Society may seem fit; and that it be the duty of the Secretary after each Annual Meeting of the Society, to notify to each Clergyman whether he have or have not complied with the requirements which would entitle his Widow and Orphans to a Pension.

XXI.

That the Charter and these By-laws do together form the Constitution of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, and that nothing which is contained in the Constitution of the Society established on the 23th day of April, 1842, or in any By-law, Rule, or Regulation, amending or altering the same, shall apply to, or be in force in respect to, the Incorporated Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, except such provisions thereof as are above continued in force.

In presenting their Seventeenth Annual Report, your Committee have again to deplore a deficiency in the income of the Society. In no previous year, perhaps, has the scarcity of money been felt by all classes of the community, as it has been during the past year; yet some branches have reported an increase in the amount collected, which they attribute to the fact that the objects of the Society had this year been urged upon the attention of the congregations at public meetings, and the services of earnest-minded collectors engaged. Your Committee have but little doubt that the same means would every where produce like results. In their opinion what the members of the Church can and are prepared to do for the Society has never yet been fairly tested. In many parishes the objects are not named at all, and instances have occurred of individuals sending their contributions direct to the Parent Society, with expressions of regret that they had no opportunity of giving in their parish churches. In many others, the notice that there will be a collection is only vaguely given, and with no exhortation or instruction, so that the people give without any definite knowledge as to the importance of sustaining or furthering this or that object, much less with any interest for its success.

The masses and the many, particularly in our cities, have rarely if ever opportunities afforded them of partaking in the

work which the body of which they are members has to perform. Our contributions are for the most part from a *few*, and they the more able and liberal of our congregations, who give freely to every good cause; but the large amounts which are raised annually by English Missionary Societies and other denominations are for the most part made up of small sums gathered from the *many*.

Were every member of the Church, rich or poor, old or young, throughout the Diocese solicited to contribute according to their means to the funds of the Church Society, (the only machinery which our branch of the Church has for the propagation of the Gospel within the bounds assigned her by her Lord and Master,) it would be enabled to meet the many claims which are multiplying continually. In order to do this there must be united and cordial action, for the purpose of securing which the Constitution of this Society is admirably adapted. The Society is only the Trustee of what the Church does give, and if it faithfully account for what is entrusted to it, the blame of not doing more cannot be justly imputed to it. With the same organisation hundreds of thousands instead of thousands might be managed, in proof of which your Committee need only mention the fact that the large amount received from the Clergy, (the proceeds of the commutation of their salaries,) was entrusted to the Society, and in consequence the cost of management has been a very small charge on the income of that fund, the sustentation and augmentation of which is a matter of the greatest importance to every mission in the Diocese. If our borders are extending and our population annually increasing, it is surely a reason for the Church to wake up, and to enlarge her heart, and to increase the measure of her missionary contributions. The body is made up of limbs and members; the Church is composed of individuals; let each individual then enquire what his duty as a member of the body is, and then diligently and prayerfully set himself to perform it. By heartily engaging in such work we give proof of the vitality of our faith, and the sincerity of our love for him who so loved us that He sent His only begotten Son into the world to redeem us from slavery and eternal misery: by His bloodshedding that blessed Son purchased us for himself to be a peculiar people zealous in good works. If we are not zealous in good works, are we the followers of Christ, *indeed*? Can we hope to hear those blessed words addressed to us by our master, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant, enter thou into the joy of thy Lord."

#### INCOME.

The income of the Parent Society, when the books were

closed and sent to be audited, exclusive of moneys received for various trusts and investments returned, deducting also £176 5s. 2d. belonging to last year's income and credited in the Appendix of the Report, though received after the books were closed—

Last year the income of the Parent Society was £3,048 13s. 1d., consequently there appears to be a deficiency when compared with last year of £216 10s. 11d. Last year certain parishes and Clergymen in the Diocese of Huron contributed £177 to the funds of this Society, chiefly for the Widow and Orphans' Fund, this year only £1 5s. has been received. There is also due to the Society for reports £73 12s. 1d.

On the other hand it must be stated that an additional collection, styled in the Society's books "Special Mission Fund," was taken up by order of the Bishop, on the suggestion of the Synod, which amounted to £442 1s. 7d., and which is included under the head of Income.

### SERMONS.

The proceeds of the Quarterly Collections, at the several churches and stations, during the past year, are somewhat less than those of the preceding one; but when it is considered that last year £177 was received from the Western Diocese, your Committee conceive that they have cause to congratulate the Society, because they think that its objects must have been more forcibly urged on the attention of the Laity. The following table will shew the comparison between the receipts of the last two years :

On referring to page 47 of last year's report it will be found

that £50 16s. 2d. was received for the Students' Fund after the books were closed, and as the collection for this object is taken up in the last month of the Society's financial year, many collections for this object may yet be expected. Your Committee have no doubt that if each subject was intelligibly brought before the several congregations, an equal, if not larger amount, would be contributed by the Laity of every congregation as was contributed to the Special Mission Fund.

#### MISSION FUND.

The total receipts on this account have been £384 2s., £15 4s. 3d. having been received since the books were closed; whereas last year the 47th page of the Report shows £432 12s. 1d. received on this account. The deficiency therefore is £48 10s. from ordinary sources; but to this fund may be fairly added the sum collected for Special Missions, £442 1s. 7d., for though it was created at the suggestion of the Synod, it was received by the Society, and dispensed by a Committee of the Society nominated by the Bishop. The relief of special cases was doubtless intended, (as when the Fund which was raised and styled in the third Annual Report, "Septuagesima Fund,") and therefore it might rightly be dispensed by a Committee of the Society, nominated by the Bishop, who being the President of the Church Society, would not countenance the establishment of another Missionary Society for his Diocese, particularly when the object for which the fund was specially raised, was one contemplated by the Constitution of this Society. Your Committee have no doubt upon this subject, but merely advert to it, as more than one influential member of the Society has questioned whether the sum collected could legitimately be included in its annual income.

The last Report stated that the Parent Society had undertaken to expend £590 for the support of Missionaries and Missionary objects, such as payment to Catechists and Interpreters, and insurance on one Indian church. The following statement shows an expenditure of £609 19s. 6d. :

The Rev. P. Jacobs has for the last two years sent from his Indian flock contributions to the funds of the Society. This year the amount was \$18.64. The Indians not having money, Mr. Jacobs accepted their maple sugar and sold it. They have likewise contributed for the Colonial Church and School Society \$26.44.

£170 12s. 6d. was expended by the Parent Society for Missionary objects in the Diocese of Huron, this Society being unwilling to withdraw its aid from the Indian Missions, until the Church Society of that Diocese was well organised.

The sum of £417 14s. 4d. has been added to the investments, making the amount now invested for this object £3,546 15s. 9d.

The by-law for the administration of this fund provides that twenty-five shillings for every Clergyman duly recognised shall, on the 1st of January in each year, be transferred from the General Purpose Fund to this fund, provided it bear such a charge upon it; and that after the current and customary expenses of the Society are paid this charge shall be the first defrayed. This sum of twenty-five shillings represents the subscription of a clergyman who is an Incorporate Member.

For the last few years it has been customary to place the clergyman's subscription at once to the credit of the Widows and Orphans' Fund, as the Collection for the General Purpose Fund is only appointed to be taken up in the month of January, and the Parochial Branches seldom report before the end of March, and many of them not till just before the Society's books have to be closed. Your Committee recommend that the by-law of the Society be henceforth strictly adhered to, as for the last two years

such transfer ought not to have been made, for by reference to the appendix of the last year's Report, it will be seen that the General Purpose Fund at the close of the year had a balance to debit, and also this year, had the transfers not been made as above stated, there would have been £375 less to the credit of this Fund.

#### GENERAL PURPOSE FUND.

The proceeds of the Quarterly Collections for this Fund only amounted to £198 18s. 5d., less by £23 16s. 7d. than last year, only 120 Stations having contributed this year, whereas the previous year 146 Stations reported; add to this the subscriptions from Incorporated Members, and the quota from Parochial Branches, and it will be seen that this Fund which has to bear all the expenses of management, &c., received from the whole Diocese about £860. By reference to the accounts it will be seen that the fund was deficient when the last Report was printed, £239 8s. 7d. There is now a balance against it of something over £450.

Several Parishes owe for Reports furnished for the last two years, £73 12s. 1d. Rents due amount to £169 2s. 6d. And if to these were added 150 Incorporated Members' subscriptions, which were this and the past year transferred to the W. and O. F., amounting to £375, there would, instead of a deficiency, be a balance to the credit of this fund of about £200. Your Committee are at a loss to account for the fact that less is contributed for this object after the annual Sermon than for any other; as most of the parishes must have experienced how beneficial was a timely grant of even a small sum towards the completion of a church or parsonage, and the grant of Sunday school books and tracts, which latter have never been refused. During the past year grants of books, &c., were made, amounting to £90 13s. 6d., and to churches £20, while promises were made to ten parishes of assistance so soon as this fund would admit of it, which promises the Society hoped to be able to redeem in January, but in vain.

#### STUDENTS' FUND.

The collections in behalf of this fund were to be taken up in the month of April, and returns have been received as yet from only 120 stations, the amount being £123 1s. 11d.

The names of eleven students have been submitted to your committee as having been partially assisted out of this fund; £200 has been paid over as usual to the Bursar of Trinity College. This sum provides for only four Scholarships, tenable for two years, one being of the annual value of £30 currency, two of £25, and one of £20. Pecuniary assistance, in no instance amounting to one-half of the necessary expenses of college resi-

dence, is thus given to *four* students annually or to *eight* students of the two years over which the Theological course extends. It is hoped that some effectual means may be adopted of offering to young men of moral and intellectual promise, greater inducement to prepare themselves for the sacred ministry of the Church, as the difficulty of meeting the expense of their education is a most serious addition to the very grave discouragement, which is presented by the inadequate and precarious nature of the provision which is made for their maintenance when they have actually entered on the service.

Your Committee have to report that several new Parochial Branches were formed during the past year; public meetings were held and the cause of the Society ably advocated by gentlemen, who, at personal inconvenience and cost, kindly attended at a deputation in different parts of the Diocese, not only at the District Branch Meetings, but also at the Parochial ones. The Hon. J. H. Cameron devoted a whole week to the Niagara District, and also assisted at many other meetings. The great benefit which has accrued to the Society from the visits of these deputations, will doubtless be more apparent in subsequent years, as they have awakened an interest in the several localities where the meetings were held, which your Committee trust will not be allowed to subside; the Parochial Reports, which will be printed shortly, will give abundant evidence of this. The only clerical member who has been taken from us during the past year was the Rev. V. P. Mayerhoffer, who had attained the full age usually allotted to man; he was carried off by no disease, but for a long time it was apparent to himself and friends that his life was drawing to a close; he gradually sank in the possession of all his mental faculties, expressing gratitude that he did not suffer pain, and that he placed his sole reliance on what the Saviour had done for him, and not upon any works of his own. He has left an aged widow destitute of this world's goods, and your Committee trust that the Society will be enabled to afford her a small allowance for the few years which may yet be allotted to her. The Society has to deplore the death of H. C. Baker, Esq., of Hamilton, who was for twelve years the Treasurer of the Gore and Wellington District Branch. He was taken from us in the prime of life; the estimation in which he was held by the Branch of the Society, which he so long fostered, will be seen in the last paragraph of their annual report. But his loss will be felt by the Society at large, he took a lively interest in all its operations, and never, except when absent from the Province, omitted attending a meeting of the Commutation Trust Fund Committee, of which he was a most valuable member.

Your Committee congratulate the Society upon the success



which the reports received from the Commutation Trust Fund Committee and the Eastern Episcopal Endowment Fund Committee shew. The hardness of the times, to use a common expression, seems to have been the only obstacle which has prevented the consummation of the hopes of again subdividing this vast Diocese, and so lessening the labours of our beloved Diocesan. The amount subscribed, all things considered, is large, but the difficulty of realizing the amount of the required securities, all business persons can well understand. With regard to the Commutation Fund, your Committee have good cause for congratulating the Church, owing to the able management of the Fund at the disposal of the Committee, an income equal at least to the amount of salaries commuted by the clergy, has been secured in perpetuity to the Church, and too much praise cannot be awarded to the constant attendance which the gentlemen composing the sub-committee have at great inconvenience to themselves given to its management. Persons will be found who will contribute many pounds to the promotion of such an object, but for years to devote gratuitously valuable time, nearly every week, for the benefit of the body at large, your Committee believe that few individuals could be found to do so for such a length of time, as have the members of the sub-committee.

Reports have been received from the Church Societies of the several Dioceses in North America, all of which prove that the Church is steadily, if not rapidly gaining ground. Your Committee regret that the basis of the division of the Society's property, rendered necessary in consequence of the division of the Diocese, has not yet been settled; (the delay has not been caused by any want of generosity or kindly feeling on the part of this Society, but as Trustees they felt bound to act cautiously,) but they have every reason to expect that this will soon be effected to the satisfaction of all parties, and that nothing, they trust, will ever arise to interrupt that harmony and unity of purpose which should ever prevail between members of the same Church, who have but the one object, the extension of the Redeemer's kingdom, and who merely divide the field in order that it may be more effectually worked.

## EXTRACTS FROM DISTRICT AND PAROCHIAL REPORTS.

### HOME DISTRICT.

#### REPORT OF THE MANAGING COMMITTEE.

The Managing Committee are happy to be able to report that both in the total amount collected through this branch, and in the number of Parochial Associations co-operating with it, the returns of this year compare favourably with those of the last.

The total amount of collections for this year is £378 12s., being £91 15s. 6d. over the amount of the previous year. While from two parishes which appeared in last year's report, viz., Sydenham and Brock, no returns have been received, yet this year's list contains the names of eight additional Parochial Branches co-operating with the District Committee.

Although the Committee are deeply impressed with the paramount importance of increasing the number of Missionaries in this District, yet as no candidates for the honorable though laborious and self-denying office have offered themselves, they have deemed it advisable, as a matter of almost equal moment, to afford some assistance for the present year to Clergymen of the Home District who, deriving no aid from Glebes or the Commutation Fund, are dependent solely upon the "voluntary principle," a mode not always insuring that punctuality of payment so needful to persons of limited incomes.

The Committee would advert with much satisfaction to the labours of their Missionary, the Rev. G. P. Viner, in the townships of Pickering and Uxbridge. While sedulously toiling to promote the direct spiritual welfare of those committed to his charge, he has not been inattentive to those more temporal matters which bear upon the same great object. This is seen in the completion through his exertions of the Church at Duffin's Creek, at an outlay of £470, and in the formation of Parochial Branches of the Church Society at his stations of Uxbridge, Greenwood, and Duffin's Creek. His report appears in full in the Ecclesiastical Gazette of the 15th of August.

It has been the sole desire of the managing Committee to carry out thoroughly the Constitution of the Church Society, and to apply its system to the accomplishing the several sacred objects therein contemplated, under the conviction that if that system be strictly observed, the Society will be found a most valuable auxiliary to the Church in her great and standing office of winning souls to Christ.

The secretary, acting upon a suggestion thrown out in the

report of this Branch for 1857, has been enabled, by the kind assistance of his brother Clergy, to prepare a tabular statement of all moneys paid for Church purposes in the parishes of the Home District, with the exception of St. James's, Trinity, St. George's, Toronto; Brampton and Georgina. The amounts have been distributed under the most important heads; the column of "Church Society" collections, including the proceeds of the annual sermons, which do not appear in the District Report.

The Home District fund amounts to £168 16s.; the Committee, therefore, presuming that the Parent Society's grant to the District of £100 would be continued, has made the following grants for the present year, viz. :—

## HOLY TRINITY.

The Committee regret, that as a Branch of the Church Society so little has been done in this parish to advance the cause of the Church beyond our own limits; although there is no doubt that individuals in the congregation have contributed liberally to the support of Missionary objects in other localities; still they feel that the Constitution of the Parent Society, which requires four sermons to be preached annually in each parish or mission, and collections taken up on behalf of the several objects embraced within her rules, ought to be strictly adhered to; for it cannot be denied, that to assist in the support of Missionaries, the relief of the Widows and Orphans of the Clergy and the building of Churches, are duties upon every member of the Church—and they earnestly hope, that in future years they will have a more favourable report to offer. There is no doubt that there are ample means within our own parish, not only to carry on the work within its limits in full efficiency, but also to assist those who are less happily situated than ourselves; our duty is plain, that we have no right to confine our efforts for good within our immediate circle, but to look upon members of the Church, wherever placed, as one with us in the great Christian family of mankind, and entitled to our sympathy and assistance—in a word, to do unto others as we would they should do unto us.

## ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST'S.

This congregation has not yet been a year in existence, and has had to raise money for the payment of the Church, and the furniture thereof, including a Harmonium which cost \$400. The collections have been, however, regularly made for the Church Society, and amounted in the aggregate to £19 18s. 3d. The Parochial Branch subscriptions amounted to £33 9s. The whole of which sum, with the exception of £6 5s., which was required to liquidate a debt due for Sunday School Books, was paid over to the Society.

No report has been received from St. James's, but the subscription of the Incorporate Members amounting to £23 15s. has been paid in.

No reports or subscription lists received from St. George's or from Trinity Church.

St. Stephen's Parochial Branch reports: That this Parochial Branch has been organized, and that the quarterly collections will be regularly taken up; the sum of £13 13s. 9d. was collected by the Parochial Branch, £4 13s. 5d. of which was sent to the Parent Society, and the balance to the Home District Mission Fund.

## SIMCOE DISTRICT.

This Branch of the Church Society only entered upon the second year of its existence in January last, and the Committee in making this, their second report, feel that the members of the Church within its limits have very great cause for thankfulness and encouragement, for notwithstanding the general depression which is here felt equally with other parts of the province, the number of places uniting in its operations have increased from five to nine, and the amount collected is nearly double that of the year previous. The formation of the County Branch has evidently infused vigor and vitality into the Society's work, During the month of February last, Parochial Meetings were held at Church Hill, Barrie, Orillia, Oro, Craighurst, Penetanguishene, Bradford, Cookstown, and Tecumseth.

In most of these places the attendance was very good, and in all, a marked interest in the Society's objects was evident. The Clergy who attended the meetings were every where met with the eager enquiry, "When a missionary was likely to be appointed, to labour in the destitute parts of the County," and the Committee do most earnestly express the hope that the Lord Bishop may at an early period have it in his power to supply the want so pressingly felt. The salary is now secured, and the interests of the Church are suffering very greatly for lack of increased Ministerial labour. Subscriptions have now been taken up for two years in hopes of securing that result, and the bad effects of delay must be felt in the future operations of this branch. Whereas there is every reason to believe that when a Missionary is labouring in the County, the funds of the Society will rapidly increase, and that a very short time will elapse before a second will be provided for.

Returns have been secured from Barrie, Orillia, Bradford, Penetanguishene, Craighurst, Collingwood, Cookstown, and Tecumseth.

The Parochial lists and reports sent to the County Secretary are annexed. Some of the above places are supposed to have sent their lists to the Secretary of the Parent Society.

A memorandum from the Treasurer's account is also appended. Some returns have come in too late to appear in this year's account.

The Churchwardens of St. John's Church, Craighurst, Penetanguishene Road, beg to report,

CRAIGHURST.

That the annual Parochial Meeting of the Church Society was

held at St. John's Church, Craighurst, on the 2nd day of February, A.D. 1859, present the Revs. S. B. Ardagh, T. A. Read, John Fletcher and Edward Morgan, who severally addressed the meeting, setting forth the spiritual destitution of many parts of the Country, and the necessity as well as duty of all to afford a portion of that with which God has been pleased to bless them, by contributing their quota towards the means of sending out Missionaries to preach the Gospel to all who do not now enjoy that blessing. Several resolutions were adopted, and a collection in aid thereof taken up; also a Committee appointed to solicit donations towards the funds of the Church Society. The amount of the collection being \$2,28, the aggregate of donations as per annexed list, \$17,50.

COLLINGWOOD.

The congregation had been so taxed during the past year in supplying the funds to erect and furnish their Church, and in making up their Clergyman's salary, that it was not thought advisable to hold any Parochial Meeting. A sum, however, somewhat exceeding the amount contributed last year, has been enclosed to the Treasurer of the district branch, being twenty-five dollars.

ORILLIA.

The Committee have the satisfaction of reporting the sum of £18 collected in this mission during the past year, and remitted to the county treasurer, being an increase of £3 over the previous year. It is also a cause of congratulation that this increase is to be attributed to the object for which it was hoped the fund would be appropriated, viz., the support of a Missionary in the county. And further, the amount bears a larger proportion to former years, when it is remembered, that hitherto three-fourths of the amount collected have been retained for the Parochial objects, but the funds now reported have all been sent in for the Missionary purposes of the Parent and County Societies.

It was encouraging to learn that the County Committee had set apart the whole of their funds to the support of a Missionary as soon as one could be obtained, and that the Parent Society had liberally contributed the sum of £75 per annum for this object. It is, however, deeply to be lamented, that in consequence of the great scarcity of Clergymen in the country, every effort to obtain a Missionary has hitherto failed.

This important object, however, is still kept in view, and the Committee on this account feel justified in commending the operations of the Society in an especial manner, to the cordial and hearty support of every member of the Church in this Mis-



sion, and leave all to the guidance and blessing of Almighty God, as the only sure source of success and usefulness in every righteous cause.

The collection, including one in response to the Bishop's letter, has been made and sent to the secretary of the Parent Society, amounting to £9 5s. Making in all from the Mission £27 5s.

During the past year several of the Society's most liberal supporters have been removed from this Parish. Among the number one has been called to labour in the sacred Ministry in a distant part of the Province, and one to secure her heavenly crown. While these removals are swelling the glory of God in heaven and on earth, we may indulge the faithful trust that new friends will be raised up among us, also to aid in carrying on the Society's efforts for the salvation of immortal souls.

The Committee, in concluding this report, congratulate the congregation on the advance which has been made towards the completion of St. James's Church. The gradual removal of the debt and other important objects that have been carried on, in all which, as in former years, the diligent exertions of the Ladies' Society have afforded substantial assistance.

The annual meeting of the Parochial Branch was held in St. James' Church on 1st February, 1859, on which occasion the Church was crowded, and all seemed interested in the proceedings. The above report was read and adopted, and a collection has since been made for the Society, for the present year, and forwarded to the county treasurer.

## TECUMSETH.

The annual meeting of the Church Society was held in Trinity Church, on the evening of the 22nd February, 1859.

As no collection had been made for the year 1858, in consequence of the vacancy of the parish in 1857, and the retirement of many of the former collectors, from sickness and removal, this Parochial Branch was then reformed.

The collectors having handed in their several lists, your Committee have to report the collections made for the year ending 30th of April, 1859, to be in the gross—

This sum is given to the District Association of the County of Simcoe, with the understanding that it is to be devoted to the stipend of a travelling Missionary, who shall visit Cookstown and Nottawasaga.

In the event of its not being thus appropriated within one year, and the aforesaid stations not having a due proportion of Missionary services, the Parochial Branch of this Mission requires it to be retained in the hands of the District Treasurer, it being their intention to establish, in connection with Cookstown and Nottawasaga, a separate District of the Church Society, for the purpose of supplying these long vacant settlements with the services of a Clergyman, and of applying this fund to that object, which in such case will be increased by £10 per annum, from Mrs. William's donation.

The principal money for supplying this amount for seven years is now in the Upper Canada Bank, in the names of trustees, who are directed by the donor to apply it solely for such purpose. The Parochial Committee, whilst regretting that the sum raised by this Branch does not come up to former years, are, notwithstanding, encouraged to hope that with a return of agricultural prosperity, there will be a corresponding increase to the funds collected hereafter.

#### NIAGARA DISTRICT.

In presenting this, their seventeenth annual report, your Committee would acknowledge with unfeigned gratitude the goodness of God in carrying the Society through a season of unwonted commercial depression, and enabling it, even though it be in a very limited degree, to disseminate the knowledge of our Redeemer in the destitute portions of this Diocese. While they cannot but regret that there should have been, as is seen by the last report of the Parent Society, a falling off of its funds in the aggregate, yet this District reported an increase, though small, which was on the whole very gratifying. In saying this, the Committee would not have it supposed that the Society received that support it ought to receive, or that the sacredness of its objects would warrant them in looking for; and they earnestly trust that it may please our Heavenly Father to put it into the hearts of His people to contribute of their worldly substance that amount which is scripturally due to so holy a cause.

In looking over the various objects of the Society, as they appear on the first pages of the report, there is not one that does not commend itself very strongly to the support of all who "love our

Lord Jesus Christ in sincerity." If we look at the Society as being a Missionary Society alone, this would be argument sufficient for demanding the support it now receives as a combination of many societies. Your Committee cannot omit to remark that the presence for the first of two Western Canadian Bishops at the annual meeting of the Parent Society in June last, was a subject for devout thankfulness. May the Great Shepherd and Bishop of our souls stir up the wills of His people in the Eastern portion of this yet immense Diocese, in order that it also may ere long be erected into a separate See!

The Hon. J. H. Cameron having at a meeting of the Parent Society offered his valuable time and services to any branch in the country which would avail themselves of them, our Rural Dean immediately secured them on our behalf. Accordingly meetings of several of the Parochial Branches having been called for the last week in the year, Mr. Cameron kindly came over and joined us on the 27th December last, at St. Paul's, Port Robinson, where there was a large attendance of the congregation taking a deep interest in the affairs of the Society. The Rector was there joined by the Rev. J. Stannage, J. D. Phillips and the Secretary. On the 28th, at St. John's, Thorold, where we were joined by the Rev. the Chairman and the Rev. A. Dixon; here as at Port Robinson there was a large congregation. On the 29th a meeting was held in "All Saints," Drummondville, but owing to the inclemency of the weather there was but a small attendance; but notwithstanding the smallness of the numbers, the objects of the Society were ably advocated by Mr. Cameron and others, and those present expressed themselves highly gratified. On the 30th there was a meeting of the Parochial Branch at Welland, attended by the Hon. J. H. Cameron, the Rev. the Rural Dean, the Revs. T. J. Robarts and J. D. Phillips and the Secretary. Here we had some interesting remarks made by several of the Laity of the place; and as this is the chief place in our travelling mission, it was gratifying to find such interest taken in the cause of the Society as was then exhibited. On the 31st a large and influential meeting was held in St. George's Church, St. Catharines, where the cause of the Society was ably advocated. Your Committee cannot omit reverting briefly in strong terms of approbation and gratitude to the pointed able and eloquent speeches of the Hon. J. H. Cameron; and they thank God that the Church Society has such a powerful advocate among the Laity, even one who is not only able but willing to use the talents entrusted to him in His Heavenly Master's cause. May the example thus set have many followers! Your Committee rejoice to notice that the efforts of your Travelling Missionary, the Rev. J. Stannage, are not without some pleasing evidence of fruit. In his report for

the past year he says, "It has pleased God to enable me to keep my regular appointments in Welland, where the congregation has, on an average, at least doubled since the first day of my ministration, notwithstanding many disadvantages. Among these may be mentioned the want of a building of our own, and having to pay pew rents to another body which many of the people are both too poor and sometimes unwilling to do, and also the extreme difficulty of raising money, which keeps many from procuring such clothing as they think fit to attend public worship. Add to this the very scattered state of those who attend Church, often having to come three and even five miles through roads the nature of which it is not easy to describe. We have been trying to raise funds for the erection of a place of worship, but the bad times, and our small numbers have been insurmountable impediments. A few friends commenced a subscription, and five put down their names for \$900, but it was on condition that \$2000 should be raised, which is very unlikely. I am therefore husbanding what I can raise from any service, for the erection of a Church School-room, or what may serve as a temporary Chapel; which may not cost over \$500 or \$600. \$100 were obtained at a bazaar, and about \$400 were sent me from a few personal friends at home, out of which I have to pay for an acre of land for the site of a Church and grave yard, a Harmonion, a Communion Service, books for Sunday School rewards, library, &c., leaving a small balance in hand. We have a nice little Sunday School, numbering 26 pupils, whom we delighted on Christmas day by giving each a reward. Many of them are not yet baptized, but we must labour and pray in patience, that those who are baptized may grow in grace, and that those who are not may not remain behind in the heavenly course. The proper training of the young is the chief hope of the Church. During the summer months, hoping that I might be the means of gathering a few careless ones, I undertook to give an evening week day Lecture in several School-houses in this neighbourhood. They were well attended. But as the winter approached, and the roads would not allow me to travel at night, I had to discontinue my alternate visits every fortnight to Port Colborne and Marshville, but have been as regular as the roads would allow me; at Port Colborne there is a small congregation of 40 or 50 persons, and a strong desire expressed for more frequent and regular services. At Marshville the congregation is most interesting, the poor School-house (which happily has not yet fallen on our heads,) is well filled with a most attentive and serious congregation of 50 or 60, and I have been pleased and encouraged by the care which the parents have shewn in causing their children to learn the catechism, which they repeated in public during the summer. Since

I have taken charge of this mission, I have baptized 50 children. The difficulty about sponsors has prevented more coming forward; thirty persons have partaken of the Lord's Supper. There is a great work to be done in this Mission; the great majority of the people seem indifferent to all religion, or so full of prejudice, doubtfulness and worldly-mindedness, that it will not be easy with the means we have to make much impression upon them. I can scarcely do more than keep together and edify the members of the Church that are scattered over four townships, (and many of them have nothing but the name,) "doing good of course unto all men, but especially unto them that are of the household of faith." One cannot but often wish that the Church Society were able to place a Clergyman in every locality where 40 or 50 persons could be gathered into a congregation. This may appear too much to expect, but when I think of the many parishes at home where the congregation is not large, and where they have the advantages of the Clergyman's undivided attention, and when I think of the prospect there would be in this country of a large and continual increase, as the country improves and the people are brought under church influences, I do not believe it is too much to desire to strive for; nay I believe it is absolutely necessary to occupy the ground in proper time and preserve the whole population from a general shipwreck of the faith. At this moment I can see plenty of room and work for five missionaries instead of one in this mission, and that would only give one to each township. I may mention that all that was subscribed in this mission for the Church Society has not been collected, the same may be said of that which was promised the Rural Dean towards my own support. Only \$20.35 was received for the Society, and \$312 for my salary. But when I consider that this infant parish is called upon almost at its birth to pay a large portion of its minister's salary, which other and older parishes never had to do, and this too in the midst of the most unprecedented depression in trade, I hope that my people will not be thought quite destitute of zeal in support of the Church of God, and that we have already an earnest of the growth of that Spirit of Christ which will not only sanctify individuals for their eternal rest, but which will also unite in one body those unto whom the oracles of God have been committed, and are bound to hand down to the latest generation the treasure of the Gospel, that pearl of great price, that precious kernel which can be preserved upon earth by a shell of equally divine texture and workmanship, the want of which is causing such confusion and havoc to the faith among the sects."

From this your Committee are not without hope that some good is being effected, and thank God for making them humble instruments in His hands for the furtherance of His kingdom.

Much, very much, remains to be done ; the suggestion offered in the last report, that now our Travelling Mission being divided, and one portion enjoining the constant visits of a zealous Missionary, the Society turn their attention to the remaining destitute portion, has not yet been considered. This is owing to the want of funds, as your Committee dare not enter upon a new field until they provide for that already being nurtured. *Will not many among us whom God has blessed with worldly means, consecrate them to His service by assisting more strenuously in this great work?* The field is ready, the harvest is ripe, but the labourers are few. "Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest to send forth labourers into His harvest."

In answer to the memorial, this branch submitted to his Lordship the Bishop at our last annual meeting, praying for an opportunity of tendering at that particular juncture an humble tribute of thankfulness to the Society Propagation Gospel Foreign Parts, in the shape of a collection in behalf of their East Indian Missions. His Lordship deemed it inexpedient at that time, but hoped that ere long means would be devised by the Church in Synod to further the views of the memorialists.

Your Committee do not desire any praise on their exertions, far from it, they deserve none ; they are conscious of much indifference, within their bounds, towards the Society ; yet the following returns will shew that something is attempted.

The parish of Niagara. The Committee of the Niagara Parochial Branch of the Church Society beg leave to report, that the sum raised this year amounts to \$190.17, which they regret to say is a very considerable falling off from the returns of the last year. This however is attributable to three principle causes, first, to the removal from the parish during the past year of several of their best contributors. Secondly, to the large sum which has been raised for the erection of the parsonage in the parish, which is now rapidly approaching completion, and when finished will be second to none in the Diocese. Thirdly, to the great depression in business, and the absence of employment of every kind, which have prevented many from contributing their customary donations. The Committee however entertain the hope, that they will be able to report a larger amount should they be spared another year.

The parish of St. Catharines. The Parochial Committee beg to report as follows :—

amount contributed within this parish during the past year to Church Society and Missionary objects. This increase is to be attributed, under God, to two causes; firstly, to the effect produced by an admirable address by the Hon. J. H. Cameron, at a Church Society meeting held here on the 31st December last; and secondly, to the zeal of the collectors (two young ladies and three gentlemen,) by whose exertions several new subscribers have been added. It should also be stated that some of the old subscribers doubled, and a few others more than doubled their former subscriptions. When the unusual pressure of the times and extreme scarcity of money are considered, this parochial Committee feel that they have great cause of thankfulness in being enabled to make so favorable a report.

The parish of Louth. The Rev. A. Dixon reports from the parish of Louth the sum of \$40, including his own subscription of \$5. This Parochial Branch is much indebted to the zeal and energy of two young ladies, Miss Wood and Miss Tenbroeck, in making up this amount.

The parish of Dunnville reports the sum of \$45, including clergyman's subscription.

The parish of Thorold. The chairman of this Parochial Association reports, with great satisfaction, the sum of \$233, as collected in his parish this year. The sum exceeds that reported last year by \$97.50; of this sum \$40 was the contribution on his death bed of the late excellent George Keefer, Esq., who has been an incorporated member of the Society, and one of its most steady and liberal supporters, from its establishment in 1842. But the increase reported this year is to be attributed in a great measure, under God, to the valuable assistance afforded the Church Society by the kind visit of the Hon. J. H. Cameron, who devoted the whole of a week to advocate the claims of the Society on the people of the neighbourhood in his most efficient manner, and to the plan of taking up subscriptions on the spot, whilst the hearts of the people are warm in the cause.

The parish of Chippawa reports that there is a falling off in the amount of the annual subscriptions, and in the number of the subscribers, owing to the pressure of the times, which has been severely felt in this parish; for general purposes \$100, donation to Widows and Orphans' Fund \$27, to Mission Fund \$25, making in all \$150. The united charges of Drummondville and Stamford, within the parish of Chippawa, report the sum of \$61.26, being a slight increase on last year. They also report the sum of \$489.35 as the whole amount collected for church objects for the year ending Easter, 1859.

The parish of Fort Erie reports through the Churchwardens, that considering they have to make a voluntary subscription for

their coming Clergyman, the Rev. E. Grasset having resigned, and been removed to a parish in the Diocese of Huron, they deem it inexpedient to make any collection for the Church Society this year.

In conclusion, your Committee have cause to be thankful that they are enabled to present so favourable a report on the whole, yet while several parishes have materially increased their subscriptions, others have fallen short of former years, but look forward hopefully to the future. However, they would ask every churchman, whether when the times are called hard, they should not rather endeavour to do the more for Christ and His Church, than withhold any portion of that which they should contribute to so holy a cause, and they would set forth with all their energy, the claims which the Missionary enterprise has on our liberality; believing that they, who withhold in times like the present, "more than is meet," may be said to have hardened their hearts against the voice of God, and to forget that "it is more blessed to give than to receive." And on the other hand, that they who do deny themselves at such seasons of depression, in order that they may have to give to God, may undoubtedly look for a blessing. Further, they would urge upon every congregation enjoying the undivided attention of a Clergyman, the necessity of still greater exertion; feeling convinced that if this were the case, not one missionary alone would now be scattering the seed to the destitute lambs of Christ's fold, but many would be sent forth, so that "the wilderness and the solitary place shall be glad for them; and the desert shall rejoice and blossom as the rose." Is. xxxv. i.

### GORE AND WELLINGTON DISTRICT.

Seventeen years have now elapsed since the members of the Church of England, resident in Hamilton, at a public meeting presided over by their aged and venerable Bishop, resolved to form themselves into an association, to be called "The Gore and Wellington District Branch of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto."

From that time to the present day, the work has been carried on in the various parishes throughout the United Districts, with very little intermission, with some instances of temporary decline, but, on the whole, with steady and energetic success.

At the first anniversary only *four* parishes had formed Parochial Associations—Hamilton, Guelph, Galt, Dundas and Ancaster. The total number of members was about 500, and the total amount of annual subscriptions about £200. One Travelling Missionary was employed, and £75 per annum was contributed to his stipend. At the present time there are no less than 27 Parochial Associations, comprising about 2000 members, and involving the receipt and expenditure, annually, of between £500 and £600; while the sum of about £500 is invested as a reserve fund, appropriated to missionary purposes. Three Travelling Missionaries are paid entirely from funds raised in the united districts; and until recently, when the Diocese of Huron was set apart, no less than five Missionaries were supported, in whole or in part, from the funds of this Society. Taking this brief and summary review of the progress of the Gore and Wellington Branch of the Church Society, may we not feel assured that the blessing of God has rested upon us—may we not under any temporary difficulties or discouragements, nevertheless, thank God and take courage.

The severance from our District Branch of six parochial associations now in the Diocese of Huron, does not materially affect our finances, as the receipts and expenditure connected with that Diocese nearly balanced each other, amounting to the round sum of \$600.



The Missionaries at present maintained by this Society are three; one at Arthur, one at Allansville, and one in Beverley. The mission at Arthur is at present vacant, the Rev. Mr. Preston having left it in the end of December, and removed to Stirling, in the county of Hastings. A Report which has been recently received from him will shortly be submitted, giving a detail of his labors during the three years in which he occupied the Mission. From this the Society will perceive that in Mr. Preston they have lost an active, zealous, and hard-working man, and one who has laboured faithfully for three years in the arduous duties of a Travelling Missionary.

From the Rev. Mr. Drinkwater the last Report is dated in October, 1858. He states that he is beginning to feel the effects of his labours in impaired health, and is desirous of being relieved from duties for which his physical energies were quite inadequate. The following is a summary of his labours for the quarter ending October 1st:—Services, 37; sermons, 36; miles travelled, 869; baptisms, 39; Holy Communion administered 5 times; average weekly travelling 67 miles, and three services every Sunday.

The Rev. Mr. Higginson was appointed by the Lord Bishop in October last, to the township of Beverley and parts adjacent. These comprise the back parts of the townships of East and West Flamborough, and a portion of Nassagaweya. No written Report has yet been received from him, but the Committee have reason to believe that he is labouring very diligently in his mission, has services at five or six different stations, and that the congregations are steadily on the increase. A striking proof of the interest awakened by his labours, is furnished in the fact that, although he has not been there six months, a Parochial Association of the Church Society has been formed, and the sum of \$53 transmitted to the Treasurer.

Parochial Reports were received within the prescribed time, from Guelph, Barton, Glanford, Saltfleet and Rockwood—all of an interesting nature. In the first mentioned place, more especially, the vigorous, lively manner in which the interests of the Church Society are maintained, is deserving of all praise. No hardness of times seems to damp the zeal of the Churchmen of Guelph, or to stint their contributions; this year is not only as the last, but much more abundant; and what is worthy of remark in their case is this, that while they have given liberally to other objects not immediately connected with the Church Society, such as Foreign Missions, their collections for Home Missions, so far from diminishing, have actually been increased. The infant association, too, at Rockwood, an off-shoot as it may be called from Guelph, has more than doubled its contributions in the

second year of its existence. A new association has been formed at St. George's Church, Saltfleet, and upwards of \$18 has been sent in as the first fruits of their labours.

#### CHURCH OF THE ASCENSION.

The Parochial Committee of the Church of the Ascension, avail themselves of the opportunity afforded by the Annual Meeting of the Gore and Wellington District Branch of the Church Society, to acquaint the members of their church with the result of their exertions on behalf of the objects contemplated by the Society.

They have received a sum of \$126.50, subscribed generally, and a further amount for special local purposes, which latter amount comes not properly into the accounts of the Church Society, though subscribed for the objects embraced by it.

The Committee regret that their subscription list is not as large as they could wish it to be; but they cannot view the circumstances as at all indicative of any want of liberality on the part of an unendowed city church, the due support of which has, within the last few weeks, called for a voluntary paid-up subscription of upwards of \$1,000.

The Committee would further state that the amount subscribed for general purposes, if less this than on the previous year, has been in great part owing to the removal of their lamented late Treasurer, Hugh C. Baker, Esq., who was not only a liberal subscriber to their Parochial Association, but also largely contributed to its success, by enlisting in its favour the sympathies of others.

A loss, which falls so heavily upon the Church at large, cannot but be most acutely felt by the congregation, of which he was a most exemplary member, a loss which, to the congregation, cannot easily be repaired. They would add the prayer that their late lamented fellow-labourer's example may be blessed to those among whom he was a regular worshipper, inciting them to a similar zeal in the cause of Christ and of His Church, and giving ground for an assured hope that when they shall be summoned from earth, they may be welcomed to the Saviour's presence, as those who have laboured faithfully in His vineyard.

#### ST. THOMAS'S CHURCH.

A Branch of the Church Society has been formed in connexion with this Church. The collections have not yet been completed, and when they are, they will, most probably, owing to pressing local wants, be made special. Another year, it is hoped something will be done in aid of the general objects of the Society.

#### CHRIST CHURCH, HAMILTON.

The Committee of this Parochial Association, in reporting the

result of their collections on behalf of the Church Society for the year which has just expired, deem it necessary to explain, that since their last Report, another District has been set off from the Parish Church, in consequence of the erection of St. Thomas's into a separate charge. This has necessarily given rise to a new Parochial Association of the Church Society, and the subscriptions of many whose names were formerly enrolled under the head of Christ Church, have naturally been withdrawn, with a view to contribute through the medium of their own association.

The Committee trusts, however, that the Society will, on the whole, be a gainer by thus extending its operations, although it may have the effect for a time of diminishing the receipts of the Mother Church.

The amount paid to the Treasurer from Christ Church, is \$280.50; the proceeds of the collections in the church, for Church Society purposes, were \$187.35, making a total of \$467.35; while a large sum was collected over and above the ordinary demands upon the congregation, for the purpose of liquidating existing debts. This, together with multiplied calls for the relief of the poor, and the general depression of trade, which is no where more keenly felt than in a commercial city, must account for the comparatively small amount contributed to the funds of the Church Society.

It is only fair to add, that the ladies of the congregation have earned by their own exertions during the year, the handsome sum of \$600 towards the erection of a Parsonage-house, while the young men have collected the very creditable sum of \$322.34 among themselves, to form a fund for purchasing a new organ.

The other Parishes that have reported within the last few hours, can scarcely expect a longer notice than the simple acknowledgment of the amount remitted. These will be most conveniently enumerated by reading the statement of the acting Treasurer, Frederick W. Gates, Esq.

From this it will be seen that the amount of collections for the past year is about the same as the previous year, deducting the amount formerly derived from a part of the Diocese of Huron.

Your Committee cannot allow this opportunity to pass, without adverting to the melancholy event which, in the inscrutable providence of God, has recently deprived this Society of the valued services of its late talented and indefatigable Treasurer. For twelve years he had been intimately associated with this committee: he was seldom if ever absent from any of its meetings; he always took the liveliest interest in the business brought before it; and he cheerfully devoted his time, his talents, and his means to advance the objects of the Church Society. To his admirable management of its funds, is in a great measure to be attributed the healthy state of its financial affairs; and to his judgment and foresight in laying up in prosperous times, against future possible contingencies, this branch of the Society has always been able to meet its engagements promptly, and to support an annual outlay of nearly £500 without any inconvenience or embarrassment. Your Committee regard his lamented death as a great calamity to this branch of the Church Society, and they feel that in him they have lost a valuable friend and coadjutor; the Church, an active, zealous, and intelligent member; and the Church Society, a generous and open-hearted contributor to its funds. A resolution expressive of these sentiments will be submitted for the adoption of this meeting, and conveying to the surviving members of his family the assurance of its sincere condolence and regret.

The following is the Missionary Report alluded to, from the Rev. J. A. Preston:—

ARTHUR.

I beg to submit a Report of the Mission of Arthur up to the time of my leaving it in January last. On my first entrance upon the Mission, I had charge of eleven townships, some lying in the county of Grey, and some in the county of Wellington. This extended field of labour I went over once a month, for about a year, at which time the county of Grey was included within the limits of the Diocese of Huron, and my labours were then confined to that portion of the Mission that was comprised within the limits of the county of Wellington, in the Diocese of Toronto. This field I traversed for about two years. It comprised the townships of Arthur, Luther, parts of Peel, Garafraxa, and Erin, and extended from Mount Forest, at the head of the township of Arthur, to Erin, in the centre of the township of the same name, a distance of nearly 60 miles.

The Sunday stations were as follows:—Grace Church, Arthur, service three Sundays out of four. Trinity Church, North Ar-

thur, service three Sundays out of four. Mount Forest, monthly. The above stations lie in the township of Arthur, and are comprised within a distance of 15 miles, the first two stations being 10 miles apart, and the first and third 15 miles.

Reading, in the township of Garafraxa, distant 25 miles from Arthur, the head-quarters of the Mission; and Erin, in the township of Erin, distant 36 miles from Arthur. Service at both the last-named stations monthly.

Thus it may be seen that there are two churches in the Mission, one at the village of Arthur, the other at North Arthur, 10 miles distant from the first. The first named is of brick, and cost about £130, only some £50 of which have as yet been paid. It is finished with the exception of the pulpit and reading-desk. The church at North Arthur is so far proceeded with, that of late I have been enabled to hold service in it, both in summer and winter; but as yet it is not pewed, nor has it a reading-desk or pulpit.

There are good congregations at all the above-named stations, more especially so when the roads are good.

Indeed this section of the country contains great numbers of Church people, who receive with great eagerness the services of the Church; but I think the day has now come when they should be taught that it is their bounden duty to learn the salutary lesson, that as in temporal, so equally, I might say, (viewing the vastly greater importance of them,) pre-eminently in spiritual matters, "The labourer is worthy of his hire." True, the country is newly settled, and the people are, as yet, in but poor circumstances, but I venture to state, without fear of contradiction, that if every head of a family would but give what he spends foolishly in the year, to the support of the cause of missions, it would pay at least two-thirds of the stipend of a missionary, whose salary might be reckoned at £150.

These people, Rev. Sir, are under deep obligations to the Gore and Wellington District Branch of the Church Society; and while it is our duty earnestly to hope that these missions will not be left unoccupied, still the day has come when the Church of England's children, both in thickly-settled parts of the country, and also in those parts more remote, should be taught that the doctrine of the Gospel is, "Let him that is taught in the word communicate to him that teacheth," and that "They who preach the Gospel should live of the Gospel," and that, "If the pastors of Christ's flock have sown unto the sheep of the flock spiritual things, it is not a great matter if they should expect to reap of their worldly things," at least sufficient for the maintenance of the position which such pastors are expected to assume.

In the three years I served the mission of Arthur, I discharged

the following duties: baptisms, 242; marriages, 18; burials, 27; miles travelled, 12,075; and I would in conclusion say, that I hope my labour has not been in vain in the Lord; that my weak efforts to proclaim "the unsearchable riches of Christ," in the remote parts of the Diocese, may receive a blessing from the Great Head of the Church, whose employment on earth was going about doing good.

### NEWCASTLE DISTRICT.

The limits usually assigned to the report of a District Branch of the Church Society afford little scope for general remarks. It has therefore been thought advisable, on the present occasion, to state simply what has been effected for the Society, by the different Parochial Associations within the District, for the past year, leaving it to the different speakers to explain and enforce the claims of the Society, as they may deem advisable.

The following are the reports of the various Parochial Committees, so far as they have been received:—

Cobourg, Port Hope, Peterboro', Clarke, or Newcastle, Bowmanville, Cavan, St. John's, and St. Paul's, Grafton, Colborne, Perrytown, Elizabethville, Cartwright, Manvers, Rice Lake (vacant,) Seymour and Percy.

### GRAFTON.

A very interesting meeting of this Parochial Association was held on the 22nd of February last, several clergymen being present, several animated addresses were delivered; and a committee of ladies appointed to take up the subscriptions. The result of their labours, which are not yet quite completed, has been that the sum of £21 3s. 9d. has been subscribed, the greater part of which has already been paid; and it is hoped, that this amount will yet be increased before the closing of the books of the Parent Society. It is pleasing to remark, in connection with these subscriptions, that notwithstanding the continued depression, and scarcity of money, they were cheerfully and willingly paid, the collectors being refused in only one or two instances.

In addition to this annual subscription there has been collected in this parish, for the various objects of the Society, during the past year, the sum of £16, making in all the sum of £37 3s. 9d., from a comparatively small congregation of zealous and faithful Church members—seldom averaging one hundred individuals.



## COLBORNE.

The annual meeting in this parish was also held on the 22nd of February, and was well attended. The Committee, consisting chiefly of ladies, appointed to take up the annual subscriptions, entered upon their labours with great spirit, and conducted them with steady perseverance to the close. The subscription, it is believed, will amount to the sum of £26 1s. 7d.

Besides this amount, there has been collected from the members of the congregation, for objects contemplated by the Church Society, during the past year, the sum of £8 4s. 10d., making a total of £34 6s. 7d. From this statement it will be seen, that there has been collected for the Church Society, in the Mission of Grafton and Colborne, during the past year, the sum of £71 10s. 4d.

This example of a rural mission may serve to shew what might be accomplished for the Society by a general and united effort throughout the Diocese.

## CAVAN.

I beg leave to submit the following report of the Cavan Parochial Associations for the current year.

This is an increase of over £2 above the amount subscribed last year; which I think is creditable, considering the present scarcity of money. I might mention that St. Thomas' Church, Millbrook, was opened for Divine Service last autumn, and since that time there has been a regular service every Sunday evening, making three services every Sunday in this parish.

Perhaps I might also add that during the past year a shed and house for the Sexton have been built contiguous to St. John's Church, at a cost of £75 to the congregation, and all this sum has been paid save a very small balance. We intend sending one-half of the whole amount subscribed to the Parent Society.

Trusting that you will receive satisfactory reports from the other branches of this district.

The branches of the Church Society established at Perrytown and Elizabethville, have this year met together at Perrytown, one meeting only being held, partly on account of the ill health of the Incumbent, and partly on account of the difficulty which other clergymen find in reaching Elizabethville, which lies rather out



of the regular route taken on such occasions. I am sorry to have to report that the collection was much smaller than at the previous meeting, *not* on account of the Society being *less approved* of, but, on account of the *general depression* so prevalent during the present year; there was, however, between ten and eleven pounds subscribed at the meeting, *the whole* of which is to be sent to the General Fund at Toronto.

CARTWRIGHT.

I have to report that the Annual Parochial Meeting of the Church Society was held on the appointed day, and was attended by the Ven. the Archdeacon of York, the Rev. Messrs. Allen, J. Stanton and Mr. Dinsdale, a very influential layman from the township of Cavan. The objects of the Society were clearly explained, and the duty of advancing them ably enforced by the several speakers. The sum of \$15 was collected at the meeting, and the sum has been made up since to \$40. NEWCASTLE.

The Committee are happy in being able to announce the opening of the new Church in this village. It is a building purely ecclesiastical in its character, the designs of the architect, Mr. Hay, having been strictly carried out. Since its opening, the congregation has increased four-fold, and it is hoped in future years a corresponding increase will be made to the supporters of the Society in the parish. For the present, however, your Committee can only report the sum of £15 14s. 9d. as having been collected, the usual proportion of which has been reserved for transmission to the Parent Society.

PORT HOPE.

The Port Hope Parochial Committee of the Church Society report, that their anniversary meeting this year was attended by

a large number of persons. The sum transmitted to the Parent Society in Toronto, amounted to \$54 25 cts., including the Incumbent's subscription. At the January collection \$4 was contributed. It is the intention of the Committee to continue the regular quarterly collections; and to comply with the other regulations of the Society.

## COBOURG.

This, like other towns in Canada West, has felt severely the pressure of the times; and the distress produced amongst the labouring classes, has taxed very heavily the means of those who are better provided. In many quarters, therefore, there has not been the usual ability to contribute to the funds of the Church Society; yet the untiring labours of the ladies, who kindly acted as collectors, have been attended with no inconsiderable success, as the following statement will shew:—

## MIDLAND DISTRICT.

Another year has passed away since we last assembled here to hold the Annual Meeting of the Midland District Branch of the Church Society, and, instead of their being cause for congratulation on the improved condition of our Branch, we are compelled to acknowledge that its prospects are worse than they were a year ago. The contributions available for necessary expenses,

and for missionary purposes, are less than they were last year; and we perceive no symptoms among us of a reviving interest in the Society's operations. What is the reason of this? Have the managers of the Society proved unfaithful to the trusts reposed in them? or are the objects to which its funds are devoted less important now than they were in past years? Is it of less moment *now* to contribute to the support of missionartes in the destitute parts of the Diocese than it once was? And does the cry of the widows of the clergy, and of their fatherless children, find no response now in their bosoms which once commiserated their privations and suffering? This is one of the objects for which subscriptions are solicited, and unless substantial aid is rendered by the members of the Church, it cannot be carried out. The Society embraces other objects also, which have a claim upon us for support—such as giving assistance to those preparing for the Ministry; circulating the Holy Scriptures and the Book of Common Prayer in the Diocese; encouraging education, and granting aid towards the erection, endowment, and maintenance of churches. To promote these as they ought to be promoted, money is wanted, and the Church looks to her children for the necessary supplies.

In Kingston the number of the Society's benefactors has been much lessened of late. Some, whose liberal donations were wont to swell the receipts of this Branch, have removed to distant lands, while others have been called to their rest. But does not this urge upon those who remain to take a double interest in the welfare of the Society, and, although feeling in common with others the present depressed state of business, to increase their subscriptions to its funds? How is the Church of our fathers, and of *our* baptism, to maintain her ground if her sons desert her, or forbear to lend a helping hand, when she stands in need of assistance? Especially, how are the spiritual wants of a constantly increasing Church population, spread over the length and breadth of this vast Diocese, to be provided for, if those who are themselves enjoying the ministrations of our beloved Church, do not give freely to supply the lack? Let those who contribute sparingly, as well as those who withhold their hand, consider this point well. If the Church is to fulfil her mission in this Diocese, she must have the means at her command; and where is she to look for support, but to those whom she has nourished and brought up in her bosom? If the organization of the Church Society is defective, let us apply ourselves unitedly, and with a good will, to remedy the defects. Or if there are objections to the manner in which its affairs are managed, let us calmly and dispassionately discuss the objections and endeavour to correct them. But, instead of merely commiserating the spiritual desti-

tution every where around us, as we do from year to year, let us apply ourselves, with heart and hand, to remove, or at least to lessen it. We cannot all go forth as missionaries, but we can all contribute to support those who are qualified to preach the Gospel to those of our fellow Churchmen in the Diocese, who do not enjoy the means of grace which we have. It is our duty to do this, and if we fail, or come short in it, the Lord, the righteous Judge, will not hold us guiltless.

NAPANEE.

The report of the Parochial Committee says:—"The quarterly collections have been taken up, but no subscriptions, as at the time when they should have been taken up, the parish was visited by the Rev. Dr. Patton on behalf of the Episcopal fund, and the resources of the people were so drawn on to help that object that the Committee felt they could not press, at the same time, the claims of the Church Society; but they consoled themselves that while helping on the endowment of the Bishopric and the procuring of a Bishop for this important portion of the Diocese of Toronto, the parish was doing a work which would greatly tend to the prosperity of our Zion. The Committee are glad to be able to say that over £130 was given for this purpose. However, this year we hope to make up for the last, and help on a Society which has the strongest claims upon the liberality of Churchmen, a Society on which devolves now the support and extension of the Church in the newly-settled parts of the country.

ADOLPHUSTOWN AND FREDERICKSBURGH.

The people of these united parishes have been actively engaged during the past year in the erection of a parsonage, which will be ready for occupation next autumn. Notwithstanding the heavy outlay upon this object, the parishoners have no desire to overlook the claims which the Church Society has to their hearty support. The annual meetings have been held in these parishes, when the claims of the Society were urged upon the parishoners. Within the year \$500 have been collected for the Parsonage, and \$120 for the rent of the Clergyman's house. The Quarterly collections have also been regularly forwarded to the parent Society. The report says: "Although the amount of our Christian exertion for the present year falls short of what God requires from his people, still we are privileged to congratulate our parish on the amount of progress made within that short period."

CAMDEN.

The Missionary says: "In sending you a report of my mission for the present year, I am sorry that I am not able to redeem the promise which I then thought I was justified in giving, that this

year our parish would do its part in aiding the Church Society. This we have not been able to accomplish, other than taking up collections for the Students' Fund, the Mission Fund, the Special Mission Fund, and the General Purposes Fund. Owing to the many calls upon the people, during the past year, it was not deemed advisable to make the annual collection."

PORTLAND AND LOUGHBOROUGH.

The Rev. C. Ruttan, the Missionary in these parishes, writes: "I enclose £2 4s. 2½d., being the fourth part of the amount subscribed in Portland and Loughborough in behalf of the Church Society. This amount may appear small, but when it is considered that the Mission has been vacant for the last four or five years, that the people have to pay a considerable portion of the Clergyman's salary, and that, owing to the want of a Clergyman, the Churches have been allowed to get very much out of repair, for repairing which the congregation will be obliged to make a liberal contribution, the above sum is perhaps as much as could reasonably be expected for the present year. Next year, no doubt, we shall be able to do more."

BARRIEFIELD.

The Parochial Committee report to the following effect: "It is with much pleasure and satisfaction we state that the roof of St. Mark's Church, which was in a very dangerous state, has been thoroughly repaired during the past autumn. For being able to accomplish so expensive an undertaking, your Committee have to return their sincere thanks to the District Branch for their liberal grant of £12 10s., which, with a like sum raised by voluntary subscription in this Mission, enabled the work to be done in a very satisfactory manner. The services at Birmingham and McLean's school-house have been regularly kept up during the year, and in both places the attendance is very satisfactory."

PORTSMOUTH.

The Committee report that the quarterly collections have been regularly made and forwarded to the Parent Society, amounting to £3 10s., and also the Clergyman's subscription of £1 5s. Besides the Sunday School, the attendance at which has increased during the year, there is an infant day school in the parish, in which for nine months there has been an attendance of from thirty-six to fifty-three, and the progress of the little ones is highly commendable. This is an organization which other parishes might adopt with great advantage to the rising generation. When trained up from such a tender age in Church principles, and Scriptural truth, there can be little fear of the lambs wandering from the fold. The report says: "We cannot but express

our conviction of the importance of Anniversary Meetings, calling together as they do a number of our brethren of the Clergy and laity, affording an opportunity of strengthening each other's hands, stirring up our hearts and affections to be more earnestly engaged in our Master's service, and commending to our people the prayerful study of the standards and formularies of our beloved Church."

#### SAINT JAMES' CHURCH.

The Committee report as follows: "With the Association in connexion with St. James's Church, as with all other efforts, private or public, the past year has been one of great trial, and our financial difficulties have prevented our doing little more than making the four quarterly collections, and a small offering to the General Purpose Fund. It is our intention, during the coming year, to re-organize, and to canvas thoroughly the members of this congregation, so as to get, if possible, a subscription from every man, woman, and child. Although this Church is struggling to pay off a debt incurred some years ago, the special collections taken up during the year have amounted to £16 13s. 5½d., besides the sum of £100 paid towards the Clergyman's salary.

#### SAINT GEORGE'S CHURCH.

The quarterly collections have been made and remitted to the Parent Society, together with the special collection in December last, for the support of Missions in the Diocese. The subscriptions are less this year than on any former occasion. This has arisen from the fact that some of the most liberal contributors to the Society have removed from Kingston, while others have been called away by death. A mysterious providence has cut short the active usefulness of one who for many years ministered to the congregation of St. George's with great acceptance, and whose benefactions to the Society were always most liberal. Let us hope that many of those to whom he ministered will follow his example in this respect, and that an increased interest in the Church Society will be manifested among us. The contributions amount to £36 16s. 3d. From the scarcity of money, many who have always given liberally have been obliged to reduce their subscriptions this year.

#### THE DEPOSITORY.

The sales during the year have amounted to £353s. 3d. In consequence of an order passed by the Committee of Management, an inventory was taken of the books in the Depository, on the 1st of May last, which were found to amount to £76 8s. 4d., currency. In August, Prayer Books, and other Books and Tracts,

were imported from the Christian Knowledge Society to the amount of £50 currency. As a Bill of Exchange for £50 sterling was remitted, there is a considerable balance to our credit on the books of that Society. It is intended in the spring, to import from the Prayer Book and Homily Society, to the amount of the balance just mentioned, Prayer Books with marginal references, which, it is hoped, will find a ready sale. As there is always on hand in the Depository a large supply of Prayer Books in superior bindings, and at low prices, besides other Books and Tracts, it seems surprising that the sum realised from the sales does not amount to more. Mrs. Ferns, in whose charge the books are, continues to give full satisfaction.

#### THE BISHOP'S FUND.

It is gratifying to be able to announce that the endowment of the Bishopric has been nearly made up to the minimum sum required, and that most of the parishes in the proposed Diocese have come up to what was expected of them. But as more than one-half of the endowment has been secured upon notes, and not in cash, much remains to be done before a Bishop can be elected. In the meantime it is the privilege, as well as the imperative duty, both of Clergy and laity to continue instant in prayer that the Shepherd and Bishop of Souls would send us a man "full of the Holy Ghost and of faith" to rule over his heritage.

There are no reports from Bath, Amherst Island, Wolfe Island, and St. Paul's, Kingston.

Having given the statistics of the different Parochial Associations in connection with the Midland District Branch of the Church Society, as far as they can be ascertained, we can only hope for better things in the ensuing year. Our truly Scriptural and Apostolic Church has a great work before her in this vast continent, and we, her children, must bear our part in that work. Besides the many townships in Canada, where there are none to care for the souls of the settlers, there is a vast extent of country to the west and to the north of us, destined soon to be occupied by a busy population from all parts of the world, and the members of the Church of England in Canada will have to do their part in providing the means of grace for these, or they will prove recreant to the Church of their baptism. The ground must be pre-occupied by our Missionaries, or we shall come short of what is required of us. Let us hope, then, that when the time comes, it will be found that "we have done that which was our duty to do in this matter."

## PRINCE EDWARD DISTRICT.

Report:—The Committee of Management of the Prince Edward District Branch of the Church Society of the Diocese of Toronto, for the year commencing February, 1858, and ending February, 1859, beg to report as follows:—

By the great blessing of the Lord Almighty, we, of this Prince Edward District Branch of the Diocesan Church Society, more fortunate than our brethren in the East Indies, have been preserved in peace and happiness for the past year, and we now assemble, under a sense of undeserved mercies, with grateful hearts, and we trust, with a due spirit of faithfulness and alacrity, to speed with united effort the good work of forwarding the christian faith, more especially according to the principles of the United Church of England and Ireland, onward.

The collections in the Parish of Picton and Hallowell, for the year 1858, have been as follows, viz., January, 1858, already reported, in

Amount of sums collected by the young ladies, on account of the Church Society, before the last Annual General Meeting in 1858, was \$97.45, of this the one-fourth, say \$25, was duly remitted to the Secretary of the Central Society, at Toronto. Donations to Sunday schools for library and children's papers, &c., \$46.30, leaving a balance of about \$26 on hand, besides an amount due to the Parochial Society of Picton, for books sold, about \$56, in the hands of the Booksellers; amount collected for 1859 in Picton, by subscriptions, is about \$120.

Total collected in Picton for Missionary and other purposes in 1858 to February 1859, is \$185.50.

The Ladies' Sewing Society Report that they have bought with the proceeds of sale of articles since the Society was renewed in 1857, two shares of the Bank of Upper Canada stock, bringing at 8 per cent. an annual dividend of eight dollars, and have further on hand the sum of \$42.30, which will be invested in like manner. The whole amount in their hands since their renewing the Society is \$142.30.

No Reports have been received from Carrying Place, Consecon, Hillier or Marysburgh, the two latter parishes being at present vacant.



The North Port Parochial Association Reports that the Annual Meeting was held on Monday, the 14th of February, 1859, and that the whole amount of collections and subscriptions for the past year was \$9.50.

### BATHURST DISTRICT.

#### FITZROY AND PAKENHAM.

The same cause which operated the year before last, viz., in 1857, has also operated in the last, to effect a diminution in the offertory collections, that is, the absence of the incumbent on a tour, made with a view of collecting additional means throughout the province, for the completion of the church at Fitzroy Harbour, a building which from its foundation to its completion, will necessitate an expenditure of nearly, if not quite, £1000; a sum entirely disproportioned to the means and circumstances of that end of the mission. It was undertaken with the understanding derived from the architect that £400 would build it. This sum has already been expended,—a very small proportion, about one-fourth, has been raised in the mission.

The total Church Society Collections for the year ending December 31st, 1857, amount to £22 2s. 0½d., less by £2 8s. 7d. than those of the preceding year.

We would here urge, in concluding this report, the consideration of the important truth that it is in every man's power to provide against the day of necessity—the judgment-day; when he will feel the need of the works of faith to sustain him, and to avert the destruction which is decreed against the barren branch in Christ. By our fruits here, which are our works, we will be known hereafter. No more acceptable or profitable work can be recorded in the book of God's remembrance than an honest endeavour to hasten His Kingdom, by arming it with the power of extending its influence over the hearts and souls of men. Let a man put the claims of covetousness in one scale, and those of Christ and His Church in the other, and as he decides between the two, so let Him calculate his reward; the reward of the former this world bestows—that of the latter is laid up in heaven; for it is as a man sows that he will reap—his fruit will be as to the quality of the seed sown—if corruptible the fruit will be corruption,—if spiritual, immortality.

#### OTTAWA.

This Parochial Branch feels grateful to the giver of all good for the measure of success which has attended its operations

during the past year. Although the parish has been heavily taxed with its own local wants, and also the providing support for an additional Clergyman this year; yet we are glad to state that the Church Society has not been forgotten by us, but that through the zeal and activity of the ladies who acted as collectors, our annual subscriptions have amounted to £65 5s.

#### PERTH.

This parish has incurred a very heavy charge in the erection of a new Church, which, from its ritual comeliness and size, as well as the durable material of which it is being constructed, may be suited to the holy purpose for which it is designed, and also afford ample accommodation to every member of the Church residing in or adjacent to the Town of Perth.

Various causes, which it would be out of place to refer to here, have delayed the completion of the work, upon which, so far as it has gone, nearly £2000 has been expended. From arrangements now being made, it is expected that by the spring of 1860, the building may be occupied for the worship of God.

While their own urgent necessities are thus pressing on them, many members of the Church in this parish would still further manifest their sense of the duty binding on them to aid in supporting the Church Society—an organization for Missionary purposes, which in the present position of the Church in this Diocese is of immense importance, thrown as she is on the voluntary support of the people. The result of the annual canvass this year exhibits, including the Rector's subscription, a sum total of £16 7s. 11½d.; one fourth, according to the constitution of the Church Society, has been remitted to the Parent Society in Toronto, and three-fourths appropriated to local purposes.

For a parish like Perth this appears but a small sum to contribute in one year to aid in supporting this, the Church Missionary and Charitable Society, but when it is taken into consideration that the members of the Church here have enjoyed her ministrations for over thirty years, without contributing any thing towards her maintenance among them, it is plain that it will be a work of time before they come fully to realize the importance of sustaining her institutions, as also their own duties, as baptized members of the fold, to do all that in them lies to set forward her operations, and to aid her in fulfilling her Divine Mission.

Amidst the many discouragements incident to a parish such as this, it is pleasing to perceive that there is a growing disposition among several of the members of the Church to give not only of their means, but of their time, and of their convenience, heartily as to the Lord; to aid in carrying out her work.

We cannot speak of the efforts of the Ladies of the Sewing

Society but in terms of eulogy. During the past winter, by the sale of their work, they realised, after payment of all expenses, a sum of £130, which they placed at the disposal of the Rector to be applied towards the erection of the New Church. During the preceding year the building committee received through Miss. F. Matheson, the Treasurer of this Society, £115, besides providing at a cost of £5 "a fair linen cloth," having the sacred name on the front and top, and a napkin bordered with an appropriate ecclesiastical device, for the decent celebration of the Holy Communion. Through their exertions the amount contributed to the fund of the Church Society for the past two years exceeds the contributions of the two preceding years by the sum of £21 4s. 9d.

From the appropriation for local purposes, we have been enabled to add to our Sunday School Library over 250 volumes. The books are such as are acceptable to the youthful mind, and give clear and intelligible views of the doctrines of the Church. We have also been enabled to commence a Parochial Library.

It may be reasonably hoped that when the New Church can be occupied for the worship of God, and the liabilities occasioned by its erection defrayed, the members of the Church in this parish will use increased efforts in the cause of Christ, and give with liberality for the time to come, for the extension of the Church, of that which God has given them.
