PREFACE.

In presenting this little work to the Church in the Diocese of Huron (with the sanction of the Bishop), the compilers do so with the hope that it may be the means of introducing a more uniform system of chanting in all the churches, instead of the many different methods as at present in use.

The best chants have been selected for this work from the many collections extant, besides others (particularly those short services arranged to the Te Deum) which have not been published before in any other collection. The compilers trust that the present edition will meet with the approval of those who may use it.

The following signs are employed in this work —

1st. The accent (—) on some syllable of the Recitation, to suggest where more or less stress may properly be laid.

2nd. The upright line (|) divides the words which follow the Recitation.

3rd. The point (·) divides each bar in half where more than two syllables occur.

4th. The hyphen (-) is used when the preceding syllable is to be carried on through so many half or whole bars as are indicated.
