

HISTORICAL MEMORANDA.

On the 10th March, 1875, 111 members of Zion Church with-drew from that fellowship, for the purpose of forming a new Congregational Church under the pastoral care of the Rev. J. F. Stevenson, LL.B., one of the joint-pastors of Zion Church. On Sunday, March 14th, 1875, after an appropriate service conducted by Mr. Stevenson, the Church was duly organized, and Mr. Stevenson was unanimously chosen Pastor. At the same time the Church, by formal Resolution of the united brotherhood, received the name of "Emmanuel Church." As the Church possessed no local habitation of its own, the public services on the Lord's Day were held in the Montreal Gymnasium Building; and on week-evenings, in the Lecture-Room of Erskine Church. In the month of June, 1875, ground was broken for the erection of a new churchedifice, on a site occupying the corner of Stanley street, and facing St. Catherine street.

On April 15th, 1876, the corner-stone was laid by the Pastor, assisted by Rev. Dr. Wilkes.

On January 14th and 15th, 1877, the building was opened for Divine Service with special Dedicatory Service.

In September, 1886, Dr. Stevenson resigned the Pastorate, on receiving a call to the Brixton Independent Church; and amid many tokens of respect, both from the Church and the general community, he left for England, at the beginning of November, 1886.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE ANNUAL MEETING.

The Annual Meeting of the Members of the Church was held on the evening of January 17th, 1887, in the Lecture-Room of the Church.

The Rev. Dr. Cornish occupied the chair.

1. Devotional service and chairman's address.

2. The Report of the Board of Trustees, together with the Treasurer's Statement, was read; and, on motion, received and adopted.

3. The Church re-elected by ballot the following brethren to serve on the Board of Trustees for the current year:—Messrs. Porteous, Scholes and Dr. Cornish.

4. The Report of the Church Secretary was read; and, on motion, was received and adopted.

5. The Rev. Dr. Cornish was re-elected Church Secretary, the Church at the same time again expressing its cordial thanks to him for his services continued during the past year.

6. On the question of the mode of appointing brethren to serve on the Church Board, it was *Resolved*:—That the following brethren be elected to serve on the Board for the current year:—Messrs Bizzey, F. F. Blackader, H. Sanders, G. B. Brown, J. B. Sutherland, S. P. Leet, C. Gurd, J. B. Learmont and Hy. Fry.

7. The Reports of the Ladies' Aid Society, and the Young Ladies' Mission Society, were read and received, the Church recording its high appreciation of the value of the work being done by these several societies, and tendering its thanks for the same.

8. The Report of the Sunday School Committee was read, and received and adopted, and the office-bearers and Committee were appointed. The cordial thanks of the Church were tendered to Mrs. Learmont for her zealous efforts and kindly thoughtfulness on behalf of the scholars and their friends during the year.

9. The Report of the Committee on Psalmody was read. It reported satisfactorily on the regular attendance of the members of the Choir, with special reference to the valuable services rendered by Mr. Bennett, in his capacity of Choir-Master, during the year.

- ro. On motion, the above report was received and adopted, with thanks to the members of the Choir, and also to Miss White and Miss Lighthall, for their services at the melodeon at the week-evening service during the year; and the following were appointed as the Committee on Psalmody:—Messrs. C. Gurd (*Convener*), Learmont, Henry Lyman, Andres, Porteous, T. Costen and Wm. B. Blackader. *Organist*—Mr. A. C. Lyman.
- 11. The report of the Young People's Association was read and received. This Association has for its objects:—The advancement of the cause of Christ and the interests of our Church; also the promotion of sociability and literary culture among the young people of the Congregation.
- 12. Dr. Cornish and Messrs. Alexander and Jamieson were appointed the Committee on the use of the Church Building.
- 13. In accordance with the following resolution of the last annual meeting:—"That in the opinion of this meeting the time has come for making a new effort for the purpose of paying off the existing debt on the Church-building, within the next ten years; and, further, that the Board of Trustees be requested to submit to the next monthly meeting of the Church a nomination of a Committee for carrying this resolution into effect," Mr. Wm. B. Blackader presented the Report of the E. C. Debt Fund, which showed that \$3,363.86 had been raised on debt-account.
- 14. On motion the above Report was received and adopted, with the cordial thanks of the Church to the Committee for their successful efforts in this important matter.
- 15. On motion, it was Resolved:—That the question of publishing the Reports now received, with statements of accounts, or an abstract of them, be referred to the Church Secretary and the Board of Trustees with power to act.
- 16. The above minutes were, on motion, taken as read, and confirmed.

After prayer the meeting adjourned.
