THE TWENTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE MANAGERS OF

The Protestant Orphans' Home

AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY.

A quarter of a century has the Protestant Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society been in existence, and now, in laying before their friends and the public the Twenty-fifth Annual Report of the Institution, the Lady Managers have to acknowledge that although no event of unusual interest has occurred in the annals of the Home during the past year, yet in thankfulness and gratitude to God is the recognition made by them that prosperity and success have attended the means taken for the well-being of the children committed to their care. At present the number of Orphans in the "Home" is 89—the average number for the year has been 94—and there have been admitted since June, 1875, twenty-two boys and eighteen girls. Nineteen boys and twenty-six girls have been removed by friends, two deaths have taken place those of a boy and girl. Six boys and four girls have been apprenticed, and two boys have absconded in that time. It is satisfactory and encouraging to find that on the whole good reports of those children who were apprenticed have been received. In some cases where the term of apprenticeship had expired, proposals to retain the services of the orphans at good wages have been made and arranged, in others the children have been adopted, thus allowing us to see the fruit of our labours, and permitting us to realize the promise that "He setteth the solitary in families."

The only interruption to the general good health of the children during the year has been in the appearance of hooping-cough which broke out in March but is now subsiding, and it is to be hoped the illness will be further mitigated as the mild weather advances. The Managers feel deeply grateful to Dr. Ogden for his unremitting care of the children and other inmates of the "Home" during the past year, and more particularly during the trying time of illness experienced since March last. Every effort is being made to perfect the sanitary arrangements of the place ; the house at present is undergoing thorough repair, a new floor being placed in one dormitory, a staircase being enlarged, and a general renovation of the premises effected by painting, whitewashing, &c.

With undiminished interest in the cause of the orphan the Orangemen of Ontario have contributed liberally to the funds of the Institution, and the Managers return thanks for their systematic benevolence continued from year to year. The funds of the Society have been further increased by the liberality of the late Mr. Worthington, from whose trustees the sum of \$500 has been received. The Managers take this opportunity of thanking Mr. Huson Murray, their Solicitor, for his unremitting attention to the affairs of the Institution. Many other friends to the orphans have, with their accustomed consideration for the children, given them opportunities of enjoyment during the summer. Amongst many, may be mentioned a visit to Niagara kindly afforded by the owners of the "City of Toronto"; a pic-nic to the Humber by Mr. Hubbard; and many trips to the Island by the Captain of the steamer "Bouquet." Nor have the usual and thoughtful contributions to the comforts of the children been omitted—donations have been gratefully received from the victuallers, bakers, grocers, confectioners, &c., of the city, who remembering that "it is more blessed to give than to receive," have assisted us in supplying the necessities of the orphans. To the kind friends who have rendered their services to the children every Sabbath afternoon the Managers feel much indebted. Also to the editors of *The Mail* and *Leader* for gratuitous insertions in their papers

of matters relative to the business of the "Home;" and to all associated with them in those deeds of love and mercy they would repeat the words of the Lord Jesus Christ, "Inasmuch as ye have done it to one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me."

The Committee has much pleasure in testifying to the care and attention exercised by the Matron in her department, also to the judicious management of Miss Hubbard in the schoolroom where the order and discipline maintained is noticeable and the improvement in the pupils satisfactory—their advance particularly in needlework being creditable. Lately actuated by a laudable desire to refurnish their schoolroom, the children, encouraged and assisted by Miss Hubbard and several friends, gave a musical and literary entertainment by which they realized the necessary funds.

Much inconvenience having been experienced by the retirement from office of the Lady Managers, in consequence of removal from the city, &c., it is thought advisable the Committee should have the power of electing to a vacancy when it occurs without waiting for the annual meeting.

The Treasurer's annual financial statement will be found annexed.

In conclusion the Managers feel they can confidently rely on a continuance of the benevolent exertions of the public for kindly help in the coming year.

The Secretary takes the present opportunity of announcing her resignation, also her withdrawal as a manager, leaving for others who may have more time to devote to the interests of the Institution, an opening to give their services to such a good cause.
