



## Published by Authority

For the information of persons belonging to Newfoundland who propose to go to the United States of America, notice is hereby given that the Immigration Laws of the United States, which came into effect on the first May last. provide:

1.-That all aliens entering the United States shall pay a tax of \$8, but children under sixteen years of age, accompanying their father or their mother, shall not be subject to such tax. In the case of persons not remaining sixty days in the United States, the said tax will be returned upon their leaving the country.

2.-All aliens over sixteen years of age, who cannot read the Eng lish language, or some other language, will not be permitted to enter.

3.-Amongst other classes of aliens not admitted into the United States are the following:-Idiots, insane, epileptic, paupers, works, nor thought out striking in-those physically defective and ventions, nor reared the solemn archichildren under sixteen who are tecture that awes the soul, nor breath unaccompanied.







DIRECTIONS-Sift flour, baking powder and salt together three times. Beat whole eggs. Add slowly sugar, then boiling water slowly; add next vanilla, melted chocolate and melted shortening, without beating. Sift in dry ingredients, and fold in as lightly as possible. Pour into large baking pan lined with oiled paper, and bake in slow oven twenty minutes. When done, turn out on a damp, hot cloth, spread with white icing and roll.




