Miramichi Advance. CHATHAM, N. B., FEBRUARY 5, 1903. Dominion Parliament. The Dominion Parliament is to meet for the despatch of business on 12th March. It is expected that the session will be a long one—perhaps of six months' duration. One cause that will contribute to this is the business which was deferred last session on account of the King's coronation. Government measures will include a bill for the redistribution of constituencies, one providing for a railway commission, and a bill for the settlement of railway strikes by arbitration. The Alaska boundary affair will also be one of the important matters of discussion. New terms with the provinces will, no doubt, have to be considered also. A large number of other public measures and more than the usual number of private and local bills are promised. The members of Parliament will, therefore, have to spend nearly the whole summer at the capital.

The Subsidies Question. It is significant that all the papers in opposition to the Federal Government are opposed to the claims of the Provincial Governments for a readjustment of their subsidy allowances. All the provincial papers, from Nova Scotia to British Columbia, inclusive, assisted by other members of their respective governments, have urged the justice of these claims, which we have every reason to believe will be granted. Some of the premiers are opponents of the Federal Government—Mr. Prior of British Columbia is one of them—but because the majority are in sympathy with the Laurier administration and a certain amount of credit will be given by the people of the different provinces to their leaders who will secure the necessary revenue increases, we have the spectacle of the most virulent opposition there being expressed all along the line by the conservative press. The claims of the provinces are, however, founded on justice. The subsidy arrangements were made at the time of the union, thirty-eight years ago, without an adequate conception of the future development of the country and of the expenditure-requirements for administration of justice, education, railways, bridges and other public works. The subsidies were given in consideration of the relinquishment of the rights of the provinces to impose customs and excise duties. Those, in the first year of confederation, amounted to only \$11,580,968.25, while they are now about \$44,000,000. If the necessities of Dominion administration have been so great as to require such extraordinary increases of revenue as that, it is not absurd to claim that the provinces should remain contented with allowances which are but little larger than those which were when they parted with the sources of revenue which are now yielding such enormous increases to the Federal Treasury? Fortunately, the Dominion Government and Parliament are not controlled by the gentlemen who appear to be ready to perpetrate injustice, if by doing so can prevent the local premiers from securing what is the right of those whose interests are entrusted to them for the time being. In this province, we have Mr. Hazen and his followers opposing this measure of justice to New Brunswick, just as they were Ottawa, M. P. The payment of the Eastern Extension claims. They did not succeed, however, in the end. The Tweside government pressed the Eastern Extension claims until the money was paid over. The Hazen-Tory policy in the subsidies matter will similarly fail.

The Opposition Ticket. Moved by the news that three Hazen men have been nominated in Kings County, the Chatham World says the opposition in Northumberland should go to the polls with a ticket of three like those in Charlotte—waiting for some one to come along and "organize" them. Mr. Hazen's trips to the North Shore do not appear to have affected much. The "revolt" reported by the Sun will require considerable new life, it seems.—Telegraph. We beg to assure the Telegraph that the perennial Tory chairman from whom Geo. E. Foster fled; who was saved by being slain in Chatham Municipality Hall by a pitcher about to be wafted at him by the late Honorable Peter Mitchell, and under whose advice it is presumed the redoubtable Peter refrained from being the fifth speaker at the Hazen-McIntosh-McClellan Scott's nomination held in Chatham, will retire. He will organize the forces, and even form one of the opposition ticket, should the proper consideration be offered. It is understood that he has the Hazen ticket for Northumberland already written, and claims that it's up to Messrs. Hazen and Scott to provide the "inducement" for the man to come out.

Not an Unlabeled Blessing. The "New Freeman" of St. John, although it publishes some anonymous "Tummy" or political matters professedly emanating from Northumberland, is to be commended for saying "We would like, however, that our correspondents who sign their proper names to their writings as we are firmly convinced that, except in very rare cases, it is not only 'not manly to hide one's identity behind a pseudonym,' but the doing of it destroys 'the influence sought to be exerted.'" We do not of course condemn the fact of the authorship of the paper, but the principle sought to be expressed. While referring to our contemporary, it may be as well to say that it would commend itself the better to those who may be in sympathy with the protestant object of its existence if it would not display the wretched taste manifested in its little slur, or more, at the bottom of its first column on Saturday, upon two bodies of Christians, representatives of

which were composed to the three lying out. If any other paper in the Province were to make such an ill-natured reference to the church for which the Freeman claims to speak, we have no doubt that its denunciations and cries of persecution would be long and vehement. The same paper, too, hardly commends itself to the best of us in New Brunswick, so many of whom are amongst our most loyal citizens, by saying, in connection with the case of the traitor, C. J. Arthur Lynch, that "fear of the shame and derision of the civilized world was pledged that his blood would not create a gibbet." Most people will agree that while it would be hardly worth while to go to the trouble of hanging such a person, it is an abuse of privilege for any paper published under the flag of our country to suggest the consecration even of a gallows connected with the fate of Lynch, who was spared from the gallows by the clemency which Great Britain so often manifests towards her enemies at home and abroad.
